Easter Season Sermon Series - Kingdom Parables

Jesus told stories, or parables, during his ministry as he taught about the Kingdom of God. Matthew’s Gospel contains many of these parables that Jesus told to help the people understand what it meant to live in the Kingdom of God in the here and now, and with a focus on the future fulfillment when he returns. These parables contained elements which were easily understandable by the people listening, such as farming, or banquets, but they also showed the Kingdom in a way that was different from what they expected. We will follow several of Jesus’ Kingdom parables in the Gospel of Matthew, beginning with the Parable of the Sower in which we learn what it means to be open to receiving God’s message of the Kingdom. We will then continue through other parables that teach us what it means to live in the Kingdom as it is already here, as we anticipate and prepare for the fullness of his Kingdom yet to come.

GNMM TV, Council Task Force

From Pastor Steve



In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I give you this charge: Preach the word; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage—with great patience and careful instruction.

2 Timothy 4:1-2

As a called and ordained pastor, I take the above verses very seriously! Though the Apostle Paul was writing this exhortation to his younger apprentice pastor, Timothy, I hear these words as if spoken to me. Namely, through this text, I hear God saying, “Steve, preach my word, which itself corrects, rebukes and encourages, and do this with patience and carefully.” In fact, in my ordination vows I promised I would, “Preach and teach in accordance with the holy Scriptures.” You see then, I take preaching, and the distribution thereof, very seriously. This is why I’ve asked the Congregation Council to put together a *Good News Today Media Task Force*.

Good News Today is the name for our televised service which airs weekly at 9:00am on KVEW. For many years now, since the 70’s in fact, Richland Lutheran Church has been distributing the preached word of God faithfully through this media. Not just my preaching, but that of many other faithful pastors and preachers of God’s word we’ve been blessed to have over the years. Though this has increased our ability to preach God’s word to people, there are ever-increasing costs, especially with older technology, which can be a drain on a church budget. The current cost for broadcasting is \$2,817 per month (\$33,800 annually).

One of the outcomes of the COVID-19 quarantine is our ability to stream and record live services via the internet, which affords us myriad other ways, beyond television, to distribute the preached word of God. Furthermore, these technologies come at a significantly lower cost.

With these things in mind, the Congregation Council has taken my encouragement to put together a task force to evaluate the feasibility/viability and stewardship implications of the medium of television in the 21st century and recommend to the Congregation Council the best resource(s) for the near term and long-term distribution of the preached word of God. The four primary responsibilities of the task force are to:

1. Pray purposely before the Task Force begins its work and throughout the process, seeking guidance from the Holy Spirit.
2. Evaluate the feasibility and stewardship of the currently utilized medium of television in the 21st century.
3. Recommend to Council the best medium resource(s) for Christian witness to those who are home bound or located in outlying areas and unable to attend a church.
4. Recommend to Council funding resource(s), if necessary.

As you can clearly see, the purpose of the task force is to provide necessary and valuable information to the Congregation Council regarding our *Good News Today* TV program. We hope the task force can give the Council some real numbers like, how many watch the weekly program, how many households is the program delivered to, are there other TV and/or internet TV options, and the like, for informed decision

From the Council: Confirmation Ministry

In addition to serving on the RLC Council, I am also involved in the “resurrection” of our confirmation ministry. This article is an update about the interesting year we have had so far developing and implementing a new confirmation program here at RLC.

As you likely know, churches that practice infant Baptism typically offer a period of faith instruction to older children to prepare them to affirm their Baptism. This instruction, (commonly called “confirmation”) covers the fundamentals of our Christian faith including what we believe, why we believe it, how to nurture and grow our beliefs, and how to live our beliefs in the world around us. The intent of this instruction is to equip the students to: 1) make an informed choice about choosing to follow Jesus; 2) take ownership of their own faith journey of worship, growth, service, and stewardship; and 3) become life-long participants in God’s kingdom work, loving God and loving others.

Right now, we are envisioning a three-year program of once-a-week classes that will be offered primarily to middle school aged students. Each year will have a main instruction theme relating to the Trinity – Year A (God the Father), Year B (God the Son), Year C (God the Holy Spirit). Specific topics are assigned to the year where they best “fit;” for example, lessons about the church will likely be during Year C. Students who complete the program and can demonstrate a basic understanding of our faith may choose to affirm their baptism at the end of their 8th grade year.

Every year we are planning to start instruction with a series of lessons we consider to be “basics.” Since each year will see new 6th graders coming in, that means each year the composition/dynamics of our confirmation class faith community will change a little. Here is a peek at our current list of basic lessons:

1. Baptism/Confirmation Connection: (The purpose of confirmation; encourage students to take responsibility for their own faith journey)
2. Faith in Community (class covenant)
3. Prayer Basics
4. Introduction to the Bible (give students a Bible)
5. Sacraments
6. Does What We Believe Matter?
7. Introduction to the Trinity

Once we’ve worked through the Basics Unit, we will begin the particular content for that year’s focus. The primary resources used to develop the curriculum itself are the Bible and Luther’s Small Catechism.

Another big part of the vision for RLC’s confirmation program is to equip and empower parents to teach faith truths to their children. At an infant baptism, it is the parents who promise to teach their child the faith, not the church. Luther’s Small Catechism (the complete book, not the little pamphlet) was written for parents to use to teach their children the faith – and it is still a wonderful resource to have at home. Teaching faith truths is best done all through a child’s growing up years at home, not just at Sunday School. RLC’s program is intended as support for parents/students and as a complement to the faith de-

velopment done at home. We are sending information about each lesson home with students, hoping the conversation begun at confirmation class will extend into the home and family.

We are also considering ways to invite congregation members to come alongside our students during their confirmation years. We haven't quite landed on a model for that yet, so stay tuned! It might be prayer partners, or mentors, or something else entirely. But we all need to invest ourselves in encouraging the faith growth of the children in our orbits, whether they be in our family at home, or our family at church. That is how faith is passed to the next generation.

Please continue to pray for our confirmation ministry. We are leaning heavily on God's guidance and His inspiration as we write and implement the new curriculum, so pray for our team. 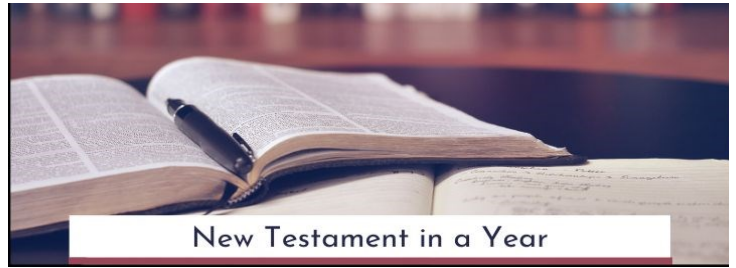

RLC Changes Office Hours

Last week, at the Congregation Executive Committee Meeting, March 6, Pastor Steve recommended the Congregation Council consider changing our office hours on Fridays from our current “half day” to “by appointment only.” Last night at the regular Council meeting, March 14, the Congregation Council unanimously voted to make this change. Below is some information to note and remember.

Rationale for Change

Richland Lutheran Church appreciates and cares for our staff. In our Soul Care Policy (yes, we have a Soul Care Policy), we recognize, “Christian ministry can be demanding for all in church leadership roles – pastors, church staff, and volunteers. In their daily ministering to others, they sometimes become tired, stressed, and burned out and often neglect themselves and their families.” This is all too true!

Because our staff work on Sundays, the only way we can offer them the benefit of two “weekend” days off together, is to give them Friday along with Saturday. Without Fridays off, our staff work at least six and sometimes seven days a week. We all recognize, this is simply not healthy. This change will give our staff a chance to have a somewhat “normal” work and life rhythm most of us are accustomed to.

How You Can Best Use These Hours
