Communion Service

Maundy Thursday is considered the anniversary of the institution of the Eucharist by Jesus at the Last Supper. In some churches, Jesus' washing of the disciples' feet is symbolically reenacted.

Good Friday Worship

April 2 — Noon and 7:00 PM

Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus at Calvary. It is a holy and somber day with special services with readings from the Gospel giving accounts of the events leading up to the crucifixion. Worshipers leave a dark sanctuary, grief-stricken, and silent.

Easter Vigil

April 3 — 7:00 PM

Communion Service

Easter Eve is the day before Easter and is the seventh and last day of Holy Week. The **Easter Vigil** is celebrated after dusk on Saturday, marking the official start of the Easter season. The ceremonial lighting the Paschal candle is one of the most solemn moments of the Easter Vigil. This is a representation of the risen Christ, whose light dispelled the darkness (death).

Press On to the Goal

Dear Members of Richland Lutheran Church,



With our church's decision to associate with Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC), one chapter of our history has come to an end and another is about to begin. The past few months have tested our church. We have had to deal with far more than the decision whether to leave the ELCA. Nevertheless, God has proven Himself utterly faithful. His all-sufficient grace has sustained us each step of the way. Now we look ahead to the future He has in mind for us, confident that "the God of all grace, who has called us to his eternal glory in Christ, will Himself restore, support, strengthen, and establish us."

In this new chapter, many things will remain the same. We will still maintain positive relationships with local ELCA congregations and share in local ministries like Lutheran Community Services, Shalom Ecumenical Center, Habitat for Humanity, and the Chaplaincy. In fact, we're discussing the possibility of doing more things with other Lutheran congregations. We will also maintain our basic centrist theological position – by which I mean our long-held understanding that unity does not require unanimity on all issues, including the decision to leave the ELCA. Most of all, our church's basic character will remain the same -- especially our care for each other, our deep-rooted faith, our commitment to outreach, and our can-do spirit. In short, what is best about us, what we have valued the most, will remain the same.

Of course, a new chapter also brings new experiences. We will be getting acquainted with other LCMC congregations and looking at additional mission opportunities. We will be learning the ropes of a younger, less hierarchical denomination and taking more responsibility for our own ministry. Truth be told, I think we'll feel quite comfortable with this. We've always been ones to take the initiative and chart our own course. In fact, I believe we will find the LCMC is a good "fit" for us, and it will feel like "home" very soon!

For now, the most important thing is beginning the new chapter well. That means taking our cue from St. Paul: "Forgetting what lies behind, and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on to the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus." All around us, there are great opportunities for ministry. Let's pour our energy into them! Beyond our walls, there are great possibilities for service and outreach. Let's focus fully on them! This new chapter could be the best so far. And why shouldn't it be? If we depend on God, pull together, and keep looking forward, there's no telling what God will do in us and through us! After all, He is a God who is "able to do abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine!"

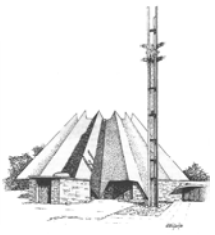

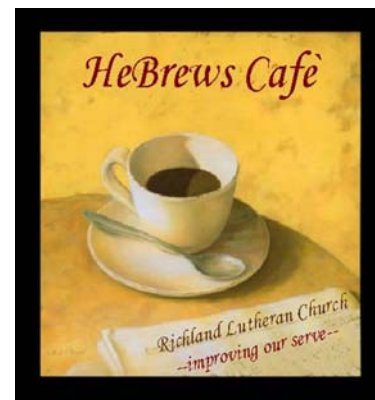
