The Bible Has Changed Us! – Showing Us Truth 2 Timothy 3:14-17

Stick with what you learned and believed, sure of the integrity of your teachers—why, you took in the sacred Scriptures with your mother's milk! There's nothing like the written Word of God for showing you the way to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. Every part of Scripture is God-breathed and useful one way or another—showing us truth, exposing our rebellion, correcting our mistakes, training us to live God's way. Through the Word we are put together and shaped up for the tasks God has for us. — The Message (emphasis mine)

Reading, hearing, meditating, memorizing, quoting, praying, studying, teaching, learning, using, trusting, sharing, Scripture changes a person. If you've ever done one of these with the Bible you know what I'm talking about. This is the way it's meant to be. As the Apostle Paul writes to his young protégé pastor, Timothy, he reminds him to stick to what he's learned and believed from Scripture. Why? Because there is no greater means of coming to know Christ Jesus than through God's Word.

In *The Message* version of The Bible, Eugene Peterson translates Paul's four-fold purpose of Scripture as useful for: 1) showing us truth, 2) exposing our rebellion, 3) correcting our mistakes, and 4) training us to live God's way. If the Bible truly does these things, of course it will change us. Perhaps this is why our congregation looks much different today than it did just a few short years ago. You have noticed the change, haven't you?

In the next four months I'll be writing my preview articles to handle these purposes Paul gives to Timothy regarding Scripture. This month we begin by looking at how the Bible shows us truth. In a world devoid of absolute truth and devalued by relative truth, Scripture stands alone today as we've never seen it. When, "What's your truth," trumps "What's the truth," things have gone terribly wrong. Amongst the cacophony of messaging, media and mutterings we find ourselves desperate for truth. Jesus told those who had believed in him, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." When you ingest the Bible truth prevails. And you find freedom.

Similarly, as Jesus prays for the Twelve during his last supper with them, he petitions God to "Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth." Clearly here, Jesus holds Scripture in high esteem encouraging The Father to sanctify the Disciples by the truth of his word. When we endeavor to submerge ourselves in Scripture, this is what we can expect God to do for us, make us sanctified; set apart by God and made holy because of the purification of sins through the person and work of Jesus Christ. Don't you think this would change us? Of course it would. Of course it has.

As we conclude our "Read the Bible Together in One Year" program, don't despair. I am already in the process of putting together daily thematic Bible readings for 2019. They won't be nearly as long and they will be organized by topic. I hope you will join me and many other of your brothers and sisters in Christ here at RLC as we continue to immerse ourselves in the sacred Scriptures.

Do you really want to just be on the same level as a demon? Jesus calls us to an obedience of the heart. We need to have head knowledge for certain...but if it never reaches the heart, we are severely lacking. Our love for God must carry over into our love for others. Doesn't really get much more important than that.

So, friends, let me encourage you to not only complete this journey of reading through God's Word this year, but also look for ways to serve, encourage, and love those around you. And don't stop reading just because you're through the whole Bible! (Or, if along the way this last year you ran out of steam.) Pastor Steve has developed a new reading plan for 2019 that is taking a much smaller portion of God's Word to work through.

Therefore, if you really want to love God and love others, making disciples together for the Kingdom, do everything you can to grow closer to Jesus. For, according to R.J. (I think that was his name), that's the best thing you can do for anyone else.

President's Perspectives - Council Updates

Retiring Council Members — I want to express my appreciation for the dedication and service of the Council members who will be rotating off Council at the end of 2018. They are Todd Maier, Tom Pitkin, Andy Ribbing, and Ted Stuenkel. If you get the chance, please express your appreciation to them also. At the same time we welcome our new members; Diane Bonin, Kiane Lesser, Val Silva, and Ed Simonen.

Benevolences — One of the commitments Council has made is to let you know about where your money designated for Benevolences has been used. In November, Council approved Benevolence giving totaling \$35,147 bringing the total for the year to the \$100,421 you approved at the Annual Meeting in 2017. These gifts help us in our goal to be an outwardly focused congregation rather than focused on ourselves.

The most recent approvals included Second Harvest (\$2,500); Grace Clinic (\$500); Union Gospel Mission (\$2,500); Habitat for Humanity (\$2,000); Heart for the Fatherless (\$500); Tri-City Pregnancy Network (\$1,000); Tri-Cities Chaplaincy – Cork's Place (\$1,500); Samaritan's Purse - Mike and Julie Penley account (\$3,384.20); SIGN Fracture Care (\$1,000); Gather4Him (\$1,200)

in monthly installments); Fields of Grace (\$1,000); Liberty Christian School (\$1,000); My Friends Place (\$1,000); Safe Harbor Support Center (\$1,000); Disaster Relief LCMC (\$5,313.15); Flourish Mid-Columbia (\$2,000); Tartu Academy of Theology (\$2,500); Impact Compassion Center (\$2,000); GNMM (\$2,500); and Hope Medical (\$750).

Scholarship Committee — Council approved Donna Brown, Todd Maier, and Sarah Hagensen as members of the Scholarship Committee. The committee will be working to consolidate the funds from the current multiple scholarships into a single account and to be begin planning for the 2019 scholarship awards.

Shalom **Ecumenical** Center **Board** – SEC was begun in 2002 by representatives of All Saints Episcopal Church, Good Shepherd Lutheran Church and Richland Lutheran Church to develop housing for lowincome seniors and persons with developmental disabilities. At their November meeting, Council appointed Rich Barchet and Warner Blyckert to serve additional three-year terms on the SEC board.

LCMC 18th Gathering 2018

Pam and I recently attended the LCMC Annual Gathering. Approximately 800 people attended the 18th Annual Gathering in Des Moines. It is truly an amazing thing to worship the Lord with 800 joyous Christians. The Keynote Speakers were from Church Doctor Ministries (Dr. Kent Hunter and Tracee Swank). Church Doctor Ministries has worked with over 1700 churches of many different denominations over the last 40 years. They provided the sobering statistic that over 80% of churches in the US are plateaued or declining. Additionally church members are aging, 80% of church members are over 40 years old and 40% are over 60 years old. They see a cycle that has repeated throughout history for the followers of God: drifting from God, ignoring prophets, deterioration of civilization, feeling of hopelessness, receptivity, repentance, then back to faithfulness.

The staff at Church Doctor Ministries have started to see signs that the United States may be on the cusp of another revival or awakening. In order for this new awakening to occur, Christians must utilize their spiritual gifts and we must operate as the priesthood of all believers.

Their main message (Finding Them, Training Them, and Sending Them) was that we must get back to the basics of the Great Commission in Matthew 28:19 – to go and make disciples! We are all commissioned to make disciples. How do we make disciples? First, we have to find someone to disciple. The easiest way is to start with someone that we know from our social network who is not an active Christian disciple. We work with them, teaching and training them to be a disciple. This does not happen quickly, it takes time and dedication. Jesus spent three years teaching and training the Apostles. Think of this an apprenticeship program. Then after they are trained, we send them out to make their own disciples and we start over with someone new.

Also, you can't worry about numbers. Don't let the lack of quick results discourage you. At times great crowds followed Jesus numbering in the thousands, but Acts 1:15 has only 120 followers remaining after the resurrection and ascension. These few followers went on make Christianity the dominant religion in the Roman Empire in less than 200 years.

Union Gospel Mission Giving Tree

This year's Giving Tree project started in November and will run through December 16. We will again donate items to the local Union Gospel Mission. Although we emphasize hygiene (i.e. t-shirts, underwear, socks) and warmth (i.e. insulated underwear, gloves, hates), you cannot go wrong in giving. Coats, sweaters, boots, hand warmers, deodorant, etc. are all welcome. The emphasis is also on men just because of the larger number of men than women/children staying at the Mission.

As before, there are tags on the tree as a reminder of possible gifts, but *having a tag is not necessary*. Please do NOT wrap the gift.

This year I would like to try something new. Sandy Steele takes most of the donated gifts to the Mission when she volunteers on Mondays, which is efficient but can give the impression that there is less participation by the congregation than is real. So, I tried to think of how to remedy that.

For this year, instead of my putting decorations on the tree, I would like to invite those of you who give gifts to also bring a decoration for the tree. This way the congregation can have a better sense of how much is actually donated. I am not asking you to bring your favorite decoration, because I cannot guarantee it won't be broken or accidently taken home by someone who has a similar decoration and forgot which one they brought. Nor am I asking you to permanently leave the decoration. The tree will be left up through the full holiday season. If you will be in town for Christmas, consider leaving your decoration on the tree the whole time. I will take down the tree in the beginning of January. Any decorations still there will be collected and made available for you to pick up the next time you come to church.

The Health Ministry Team invites anyone who is grieving for a loved one, be it a recent loss or one that was a while ago, to consider attending our 13-week GriefShare support class.

Join us on **December 16 during HeBrews Café** for a short orientation and Q&A discussion. We will discuss this Christian-based program that addresses the loss of a loved one and the grief process.

To register for the class, you can sign up on the yellow worship slip, call the church office, or go to GriefShare.org. There is a \$20 one-time fee to cover materials.

When you come to GriefShare, you will receive a workbook for taking notes and daily devotions, watch a video, and engage in small group discussion time. You can share as much or as little as you want about your grief journey, and you will see that many of the things you experience in your grief are quite common and you are not alone!

If you need some help for getting through the holiday season, we are offering a one-time session of **Surviving the Holidays** on Saturday, December 8, from 10 AM - noon. There is a \$10 fee for this class/materials. Please register by December 6 at GriefShare.org or through the church office.

EEMN - Short-term Mission Trip to Estonia



Five people from RLC (Kelly Westlund, John Huebner, Adam Pilger, Pam and Mot Hedges) spent most of August in Estonia on a short-term mission trip. We went through East European Missions Network (EEMN). Thank you, Kelly, for the wonderful job making daily posts of our mission trip.

Estonia is part of the former Soviet Union and regained its independence in 1992, following the collapse of the Soviet Union. The Estonian Christian community suffered greatly under communism. EEMN's goal is to help rebuild the body of Christ. Our short-term mission trip partners with local churches to hold week-long English camps using Bible stories.

In Estonia, our students have been primarily adult women who are members of a local congregation. In the city of Tartu these camps have been held every year since 2006. Attendance has declined for the last two years. We were concerned about the effectiveness of our program. At the end of the camp, we discussed our concerns with some of the Estonian pastors. The pastors told us that the members who have continued to attend show spiritual growth, increased involvement in the church and an improved ability to witness and disciple other members of their congregation. While the numbers of students may have declined, through the many years of short-term mission trips we have been effective in making better disciples of the remaining students.

Now is the time to start praying for the 2019 short-term mission trips. We understand that next year the camps in Estonia will be focused on youth. Pastor David Breidenbach, Director of EEMN, will be at RLC January 13, 2019, to give a presentation at HeBrews Café about the 2019 short-term mission trips. Come and hear more about what happens in these countries and the opportunities that are available.

2018 Contributions

Just a friendly reminder.....In order for contributions made in 2018 to be eligible for a deduction in the same year, the following conditions must be met, per *IRS Publication 526* (adapted):

Credit card – contributions charged on the donor's bank credit card are deductible in the year the donor makes the charge.

Check – a check placed in the church offering in 2019 cannot be deducted in 2018, even if it is backdated. Checks that are mailed & postmarked in 2018 are deductible, even if not received until 2019.

Cash – cash is only deductible for 2018 if received in 2018.

The church office will be open on Monday, December 31, for normal business hours. However, if you choose to bring in a year end contribution on that day, please have it to the office no later than 4:00 PM.

A Special Announcement About Special Announcements

The Worship Ministry Team discussed how information given to the congregation on Sunday's at corporate worship should best be handled. They agreed that instead of having "Temple Talks," which happen during the service, we would invite folks to give a special announcement at the conclusion of regular announcements. Also, we will encourage them to pray at the end of their announcement for God's leading and blessing of the ministry they are informing us about. The reason for this change is simple. Having the announcement at the beginning or end of the service minimizes its interruption of the service itself. Thanks for your understanding.


