

"No!" - When Prayers Aren't Answered the Way We Want

There is a well known country song that came out in the 90's, in which the chorus discusses thanking God for "unanswered prayers," which it then continues to describe as those things we want in the moment that we find out later are actually blessings because they did not work out. Now, there are trivial prayers such as winning the lottery, having a successful fishing or hunting trip or asking God to help your favorite team win the Super Bowl (to be clear: as a Broncos fan, at this point I simply ask God to help them be competitive or possibly win a single game. It is also important to accept the reality of where our team is at the moment our prayers are said.) But, there are certainly more serious prayers that we share every day including prayers for health, well-being, faith of a loved one, and for God's presence to be known in the world.

We know that God hears all prayers and answers all prayers, as we are assured of this many times in scripture (look at James 5:16, Matthew 7:7, Luke 18:1, and 1 John 5:14-15 just to name a few, though there are many more passages discussing prayers.) One common pattern and teaching through churches is that if we ask God for what we want, it will work out with the prayer getting answered in the way we want. This is a belief that is only affirmed with passages that tell us "God works for the good of those who love him" (Romans 8:28) and to "ask whatever you wish and it will be done for you" (John 15:7). However, it is important to know that *sometimes the answer God gives to our prayer is No! And...that is still an answered prayer*. I want to say that again, because too often it is taboo to hear a preacher talk on this idea: Sometimes God will not answer prayers in the way we want, but those prayers are still answered.

For instance, when I was 15, I remember praying every night that God would heal my mom from her brain aneurysm...and three days later, she went to join him. I was so confused and left wondering how God could not heal her when I had prayed for it? While I don't know why and may not ever know why, it was answered no...the truth is, that God answered it no in my mind. But, what if his healing meant that it was her time to go to her heavenly home? In another example, I remember after I found out I had an anxiety disorder losing a relationship that was very important to me and would pray that God would "make it better." Then came a pandemic that shut the world down and isolated everyone. This is especially challenging when my anxiety tries to tell me that people will not be there in moments of need. I was left wondering how God could "make it better" when everything around me seemed to be making it worse. However, it is through the pandemic that God has really assured me and helped me live out that he is enough and that he is the one who will stay, regardless of circumstances.

God hears all our prayers, but sometimes his answer is, "No."

Now, it is in these trials of faith and through God answering prayers that he has made himself most present and most known, and I believe that is a key to mature faith. When a loved one is not healed, or passes away unexpectedly it is easy to say God does not answer prayers. When there is a war in the Holy Land and a world that seems to be getting darker and darker by the day, it is easy to say God does not answer prayers. When what we most want is for a renewal of our faith and we are met with even more trials, it is easy to say God does not answer prayers.

But I challenge us to grow in faith, and to say that maybe God has answered our prayer – and he has answered that prayer in a way that seems to tell us "no." Not because God does not love us, but because he loves us enough as his children to give us what we need, even if it does not make sense to us in the moment. Because, as a parent does not give their child everything the child ever wants, we know we are children of God (1 John 3:2) and we know that he is our perfect Father. Let us cling to the truth that there is no such thing as an "unanswered prayer" – simply God loving us as a perfect father.

Winter Weather




It is that time of the year again when we start to be aware of adverse weather conditions. RLC takes its lead for closures and cancellations from the Richland School District (RSD). When RSD announces a two-hour delay, all morning activities at RLC are canceled. When RSD announces a closure, all activities for that day at RLC are canceled. When the Hanford Site or RSD initiates an early release due to weather-related conditions, RLC also closes and cancels remaining activities for the day. When conditions deteriorate after school hours or on weekends, the decision to cancel events resides with the ministry leader responsible for the event. These policies were put in place to simplify the decision-making process and to give facility staff ample time to prepare for the safe arrival of people to church activities. We will send out Grapevine messages through the email and the RLC App if we are canceling activities or closing the building due to weather conditions.
