

# RLC Foundation

Dear Members,

You may not know that the RLC Foundation was founded in 1987. You may not know that as a member of RLC you are automatically a member of this Foundation. After learning more about the Foundation you will realize that the RLC Foundation is very unique. Most foundations founded and incorporated usually have a large sum of money from which to work. Not true for the RLC Foundation.

Twenty-three years ago, a group came together with the vision to start a foundation to provide seed money for new ministries at Richland Lutheran Church. While most foundations start with a donation or a commitment of funds, our RLC Foundation started with faith. Unique also is that one of the founding members served for almost 20 years, D. Wayne Campbell. He served with a commitment of such faith. The Lead Pastor during this time was Palmer L. Gedde.

Being a faith forward board, the RLC Foundation would be set up with by-laws that would establish the guidelines for providing seed money for new ministries. The money provided through donations as principal would not be used until the principal reaches a total of \$500,000. However, the interest from the principal money could be used to provide seed money for new ministries under the by-laws. Only after the principal reaches a total of \$500,000 could the RLC Foundation use any of the principal. We are still using only interest for seed money at this time since the Foundation principal has not reached the required \$500,000. Faith *is* building this principal. Interest *is* being generated and seed money *is* being provided. The seeds are growing.

Such evidence of this is when a member shows a final act of stewardship through donations left to the Foundation in their will. Many choose to designate their United Way Contributions. The RLC Foundation also holds fundraising campaigns, such as "The Seeds of Ministry." Also year-end giving and monthly donations generate interest that leads to new programs as God leads. The RLC Foundation recognizes such one-time gifts of \$1000 or more, donations or memorials, on our "Golden Givers" plaque. Please take the time to look at the plaque located in the Narthex.

Each person listed on the plaque has a common bond. These members are all part of the many ministries to which the RLC Foundation has provided seed money. Training for two parish nurses, G3-"God Gives Growth," a midweek program for children ages 4 through fifth grade, RLC Men's Ministry, Shalom Ecumenical Center startup funds, "Lutheran Vespers" radio program, scholarship funds, church sound system upgrades, youth mission to Mexico City for work with children living in poverty, hymnals for worshipers with visual impairments, a new music ministry program, and others.

Most recently, the RLC Foundation provided each RLC member family with a God Sighting Bible and Program Study Guide. The program focus is on reading, reflecting and sharing the presence of God in our lives. One member wrote us saying, "I am enjoying reading through the Bible and am gaining new insights into God's word. Thank you for your generosity." Social networking opportunities with youth are also provided. Also, a new Eucharist Ministry enables fellow members to share in divine grace and human fellowship in a special way. A visitation team of volunteers receives kits and training to provide communion to members who are not able to attend services. And soon you will hear more about the upcoming Gedde Lecture Series in honor of Palmer Gedde (RLC Pastor 1970-1991), which will be presented annually to the community. Each year this series will bring top-notch theological speakers to the Tri-Cities. These theological and practical lectures, grounded in Lutheran teachings, will reflect Palmer's Lutheran values and his commitment to promoting spiritual growth. The first year's lecture is planned for February 2011.

Our "Seeds of Ministry" campaign will focus on Galatians 5:22-23, the Fruit of the Spirit. It is exciting to see seeds growing and producing fruit. Good fruit. Twenty-three years of planting the seeds provided by the contributions of our members and using that to plant seeds for new ministries is exciting. So please join us on Sunday, November 21<sup>st</sup>, when the RLC Foundation hosts HeBrews Café. Also, please consider giving to the RLC Foundation. You will receive information regarding the "Seeds of Ministry" through your mail along with our brochure. What's next for this unique Foundation? Not sure, but it is sure to be exciting.

# International Sunday School

One way we can make a difference in the lives of disadvantaged people around the world is by sponsoring a child through a group like World Vision or Compassion International. As a sponsor, you will help provide a child with nutritious food, health care, and education. Typically, the cost is about \$35 a month. Not only does this help the child sponsored, but it sensitizes us to the needs of others and builds relationships with children in other lands. Many of our families already sponsor a child and find it a very meaningful form of outreach.

To highlight this ministry, RLC members will be encouraged to sponsor a child in 2011. More information will be coming out in December. The plan is to create a bulletin board with pictures of the children we are sponsoring. This will be our "International Sunday School." Younger children in our own Sunday school will be encouraged to pray for them, and older children will be encouraged to write to them. This will be an enjoyable way to help others and grow in our own awareness of what it means to "do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with your God."

Last year, over 8 million children received shoebox gifts around the world. Many of these children had never received a Christmas gift before. Samaritan's Purse, who oversees Operation Christmas Child, includes a story book in each shoebox. The books share the gospel with the children - in their own language. Won't you help touch the life of a child?

G3 and WILD! will be holding their annual shoebox packing party on **Wednesday**, **November 17**, **at 6:30 PM**. You can help in several ways:

- We have lots of donated shoeboxes that need to be wrapped with Christmas wrapping paper.
- Donate your gift of \$7 per shoebox to cover shipping.
- Donate small gifts—they can be left in the big box in the Prince of Peace fellowship area under the mailboxes.
- Pack your own shoebox, include \$7 for shipping.

Some gift ideas are: socks, t-shirts, school supplies, toothbrush/toothpaste, books, hard candy/gum, stuffed animals, sunglasses, toy jewelry, flashlights/batteries, yo-yo's, small cars, hair clips, balls, comb/brush, soap, washcloths, stickers, small coloring books, etc. All gift items must be **NEW**. We cannot include used toys, clothing or other items.

Also, please do not include anything that may be weapon/war related, chocolate, liquid or lotions, medications or vitamins, or items that may break in shipping.

Purchase gifts based on these age groupings: Boy or girl age 2-4, 5-9, 10-14. There will be labels available to mark the appropriate gender and age for each shoebox.

# Mission Possible - Dominican Republic

When I heard a local church was sponsoring a mission trip to the Dominican Republic, I thought it could be fulfilling to return to the country whose people I had worked among as a Peace Corps Volunteer from 1967-69. Actually being a part of the Mission Possible team was truly a blessing. Nineteen of us, aged 14-78, spent 10 days together, serving and learning so many things. We were members of six churches and there werethree three-generation families and a mother with two of her children within our ranks.

The initial focus was a construction project at a small chapel, working with three Dominican men to build a covered patio to be used to give catechism classes to the youth. We carried lots of supplies and removed debris, cleared the ground, broke up the hard earth with a pick ax and shovels and leveled the ground so a concrete floor could be poured. After the column forms were poured, we carried small rocks to support those forms. It actually got finished while we were there.

A second important part of the mission was the service given by a doctor and a Spanish-speaking nurse from our team. Dr. Darin and Sofia visited the local clinic and were also able to mentor the new young doctor who had just begun her service there six months earlier. They also spent several hours in a rural home where neighbors from the surrounding area had been alerted that a Dr & nurse from the United States would be there to treat their needs. They also went to the local hospital and made several home visits as well as seeing some Dominicans who came to where we were staying. They were like magnets, attracting people with health concerns wherever they went, including the beach! Waiting for their return in the evening was one of our highlights as we were eager to hear how they had served.

Another area in which we had some input was some opportunities to work with the children and youth. As several of you donors know, we took some sports equipment for their youth programs and needy children. One day we played games with the kids and one of our youth brought art supplies and he gave them the opportunity to paint - which thrilled them. Another day at the local center for poor or "at risk" youth, several of our teenagers played soccer with their teens.

We had several opportunities to relate with Dominicans at their small chapel as well as the large local church and youth center. We also did a brief devotional study of the book, A Hole in our Gospel, which was very fitting for our mission.

We took six duffel bags, each weighing about 49.5 pounds, full of sports equipment or art supplies plus two tubs of donated medical supplies. Thank you to all of you who donated equipment or contributed cash. There is much more to tell so please join some members of our team who will be at RLC for **HeBrews Café** between services at 9:45 AM on November 14.


