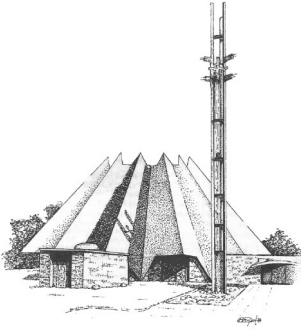

Worship, Together

Did you ever stop to think about our worship together, why we worship together as a body, how our worship practices came to be, what the liturgical year is? Over the next few months, these and other areas about worship will be explored. This month we will explore the very basic questions: Why worship? and Why is it important that we gather together as a community?

Why Worship? We worship to give praise and thanksgiving to the One who has given us everything we have. In worship, we meet God. We meet a God who is merciful—who touches us with hope and saves us from despair.

Although God is present everywhere—in nature—in human love, that is not the full story of who God is. It is not where God meets us and addresses us. The God who created the heavens and the earth is also the God of history—who repeatedly rescues the people of God and gives them hope. God's goodness is revealed in nature, but is also revealed in the Israelites' liberation from bondage in Egypt—and in our liberation from bondage to sin and hopelessness. God's power is revealed in the resurrection of Jesus from the dead—and in our baptismal resurrection to new life in Christ.

When we assemble for worship God is fully present. God, who is hidden in nature, is revealed in Word and Sacrament. We gather to meet God and to hear God's word of grace. We participate in the Eucharistic meal—a foretaste of the feast to come—the great banquet in the coming Kingdom of God. When we gather around Word and Sacrament, we are united and reconciled in Christ's name. Then renewed by God's Word and strengthened by God's meal - having heard and seen and eaten God's salvation—we go back out into the world. Worship touches us. It transforms us. It activates us for God's work in the world.

Why do we gather as the Church? In baptism we are made God's children and part of God's whole family in heaven and on earth. When we worship, we not only meet God, but also the rest of God's family. This includes not only our congregation, but also the whole church throughout every time and place. Together, we are the body of Christ in the world. Because of this, worship is a corporate affair. Worship is never about a private meeting between each individual and God. Although we might come into worship individually, we are called to gather around Word and Sacrament as a community.

God created us for relationships – with Him and with each other. While God strengthens us through Word and Sacrament individually for service, He also strengthens us as a body to be able to do a whole lot more of His work in the kingdom together than we are ever able to do individually. Praise be to God!

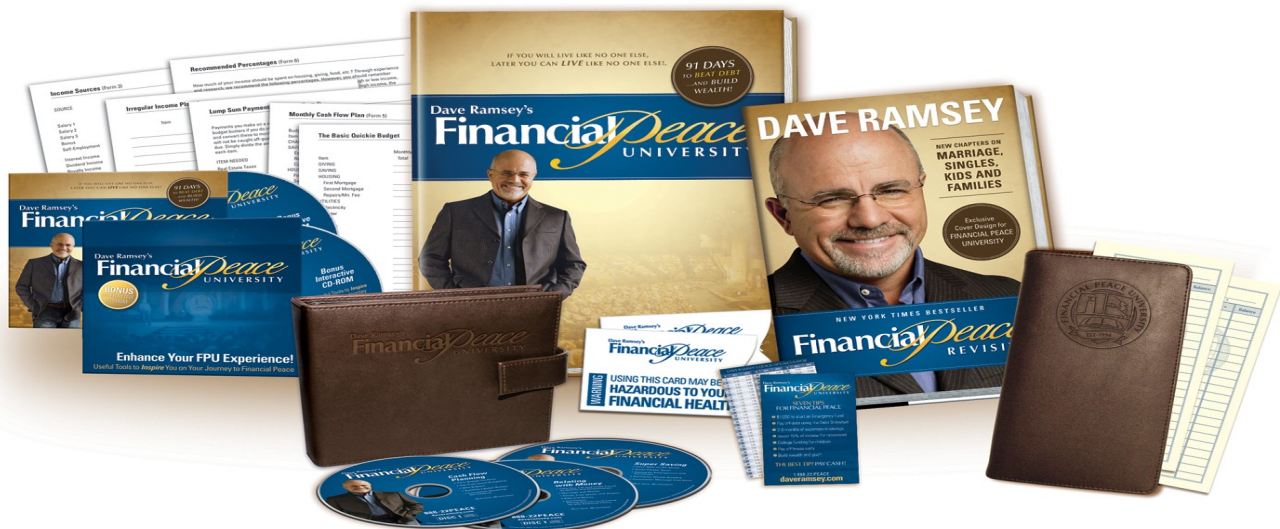
Financial Peace University Coming to RLC!

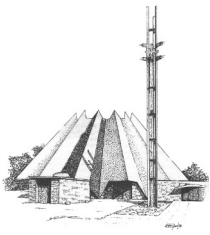

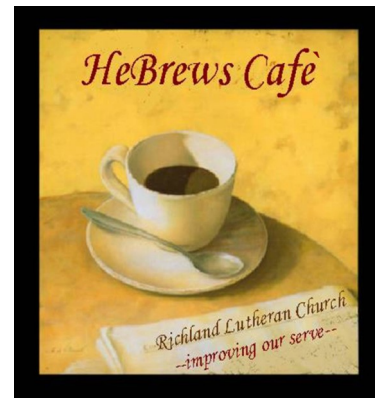
