From July 17-24, over 20 of our high school students along with seven adults were in Seaside, Oregon for our annual Beach Trip. This year our theme was "Know Fear," a study on the fear of the Lord. It was a mix of Bible study, quiet time, worship, service, and amazing fellowship. What

truly struck me this year was a comment from Ruth, a woman who works at the Seaside International Hostel where we've stayed the last 11 years. She told me on the last day, "You don't realize what an impact you guys have...not just on the hostel, but on the community as well. People around town ask us if the "Lutheran kids" are at the hostel because they see your group out picking up garbage at the beach or pulling weeds at the museum. The community in Seaside knows when you're here." Ruth also mentioned that the Seaside Chamber of Commerce is excited each year when we visit because of our positive attitudes and willingness to serve the community. Even the nice folks at the Christian bookstore noticed over the course of the week how many Christians there were from Richland! It's nice to know that these "Lutheran kids" are making an impact.

I would like to give a big "thanks" to the congregation for their support of this ministry. We are also so thankful for all the food donations that we received for this trip---they were a huge help! And I am personally so very thankful for the last 13 years of being able to do the Beach Trip. It has meant more to me than you can imagine. Now to start getting ready for July 15-22, 2012— next year's Beach Trip!!!

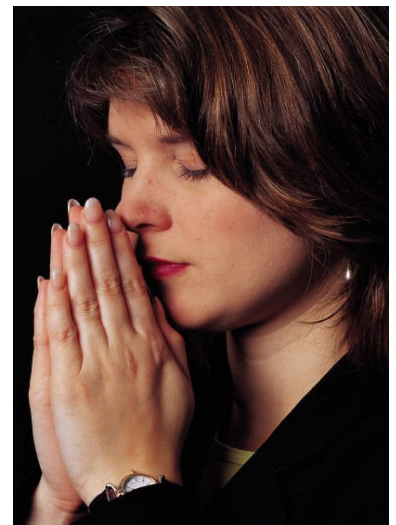
Permission to Pray, Is it Really Necessary?

You don't have to be around RLC very long to discover how seriously we take prayer. RLC folks are praying everywhere! In small groups, one-on-one, in emails, on the phone, wherever prayer is requested and needed. We share stories of prayer and God's faithfulness regularly. Case in point, whenever possible I join our Quilters on Wednesday mornings during their break time. There the ladies share prayer requests, stories of God's answers to prayer, and commit to regularly praying for those of RLC and beyond. We have built-in processes to share prayer requests and praises including the Prayer Partner e-mail list, weekly bulletin prayer list, the yellow worship slips, and now a dedicated email prayer hotline. It is clear prayer is deeply rooted in our DNA as a congregation.

This may be why some are asking why we need permission to publically list prayer requests and is this a new practice? As far as I know, there is nothing new here. It has been the practice of RLC to gain the permission of the ones for whom we pray. This is why on the yellow worship slip there is a box one can check to make sure the request isn't made public. Also, you may have noticed RLC staff members typically ask permission before making any prayer request public. Not all requests for prayer are intended for public prayer lists or email prayer groups. Lastly, when we announced the new email prayer hotline we emphasized, "If you have confidential requests they can still be sent to our pastors directly." We did this knowing some requests would require confidentiality.

There are many reasons folks don't want their prayer requests made public. If made public it may jeopardize their job, compromise their relationships, complicate their lives and/or break a confidence shared. That is why it is of the utmost importance to ask permission to publically list the prayer. Without permission we simply cannot, in good conscience and faith, list the prayer in the bulletin or send it to our prayer partners. This in no way means we don't value or emphasize prayer. It simply means we also value and emphasize confidentiality and respect privacy. So, when someone shares a request with you simply ask, "Is it okay to print this and/or send it to our prayer list?" Sure it's a bit of extra work but I know you appreciate in the end, it is *really* necessary.

Praying for Muslims During Ramadan

Imagine a prayer meeting with just a handful of people. Imagine the same prayer meeting a few years later which now includes millions of people praying for the Muslim world. 30-Days of Prayer for the Muslim World is this prayer meeting!

The origin of this call to prayer and fasting for the Muslim world came about as a group of Christian leaders were praying about the Islamic world during a meeting in the Middle East in April 1992. God put a burden on the hearts of these men and women to call as many Christians as possible to pray for the Muslim world.

Today this event draws Christians worldwide to a united, global prayer meeting. The 30-Days of Prayer for the Muslim World prayer guide is now produced in more than 42 languages each Ramadan and distributed from more than 32 regional offices. Millions of Christians have joined together in prayer, across denominations, languages and cultures to pray for the Muslim world. As a result, a wave of missions mobilization and Muslim missions awareness is occurring across the globe.

This prayer event is planned to coincide with the Islamic month of Ramadan so that we, the Body of Christ, would get God's heart for the Muslim world. It has been seen that Christians take the prayer more seriously as they see their Muslim neighbors fasting and active during Ramadan. Spiritually Christians can relate to Muslims better and pray and fast for the Muslim world because they are praying during Ramadan. Ramadan also gives Christians a good opportunity to make friends with Muslim neighbors.

What Is 30-Days About? What Is The Purpose Of The Project?

The purpose is to call Christians to pray for the Muslim world, specifically:

- for greater breakthroughs for the Gospel among Muslims,
- an increased commitment to prayer by Christians,
- and for more missionaries to be released to work among Muslims.

How Can You Take Action?

You can access a special, prepared prayer guide by going to: <http://www.30-days.net/>. Here you can order your own copy or look at daily information posted there. There is also a **Children's Prayer Guide** available. You can also find out more about the Muslim world and about Ramadan, the holiest month in the Muslim calendar. If you ever feel discouraged and helpless looking at our world and especially at events in countries like Afghanistan and Iraq, Indonesia and Bangladesh, remember that we are not powerless to help. In fact, we have a duty as Christians to work with God in extending his kingdom among the many who do not know him. No matter who you are, you can be regularly praying for the Muslim world and take seriously our responsibility to change the world through those prayers!

- The Muslim world is a challenge to Christians—especially since 9/11. We will not impact Muslims through our theological arguments or political manipulation, but we will through prayer. The annual 30-Day prayer emphasis that coincides with the Muslim month of Ramadan has been a remarkable global effort to focus millions of Christians on prayer for the spiritual needs of Muslims. Is it surprising, then, that during the 15 years of the 30-Days Muslim Prayer Focus there has been a corresponding rise in the number of Muslims turning to Christ? May God call many more as intercessor-priests (Rev 5-8) to change our world and extend His Kingdom!

“Whom Shall I Send?”

Let me begin by quoting from Julie Penley's (RLC missionary to Mafraq, Jordan) last email to me....."It was so much fun to get your email and to hear about how things went at HeBrews Cafe on Sunday! We are so happy that people are interested and excited about what is going on here and about what they can do to help! There is so much work to do here that it's very unlikely that anyone who came with a willingness to work would feel like they couldn't fit in somewhere. I think the main thing that we would want a team to do would be to complete the playground by planting trees and ground cover, building a shade structure, picnic tables would be good. A fence needs to be built (we had a pack of 5 or 6 wild dogs right next to our house a couple of days ago. They are dangerous!) Then there is the inside. We need curtains in our office and in our living area. Bumper pads (for the cribs) would be nice. So if anyone wanted to bring material and do some sewing, that's needed. Also, if a team comes, it would be nice if someone took charge of cooking for the crew. That's a ministry in itself! There are other things needed inside - the towel bars in the bathrooms, plumbing work (there are no pea traps under the sinks, so we often have some bad smells coming through! Yuk!) caulking under the doors and in the windows, general fixing - sink door, etc. Just a thought of one more thing. We should have a shed somewhere in the yard to hold garden tools - rakes, picks, hoses, wheel borrow, etc."

As you can see there are a number of projects that need doing there in Mafraq. And so the question is.....Is God calling you to go to Mafraq, Jordan for a few days in October?

Wait.....there are other ways to be a part of this Mafraq ministry. As you can see money will be needed to purchase equipment, shade trees and more. If you feel called to help in this way simply make a check out to RLC and designate it to Samaritan's Purse.


But wait....there is one more way to help and this involves everyone. Prayer! Pray for the work the Penleys are doing. Pray for the opening and operating of the baby home, where they are serving. Pray for those whom God is calling to go that they would hear and take the challenge. Pray for those who give of their finances to support this home. And pray that all is done to the glory and honor of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Scholarship Opportunity

For those pursuing a graduate degree in a science field, or know someone who is, a scholarship fund was established by Kathy Higley in memory of her husband, Bruce, who had a lifelong passion for and career in science and engineering. 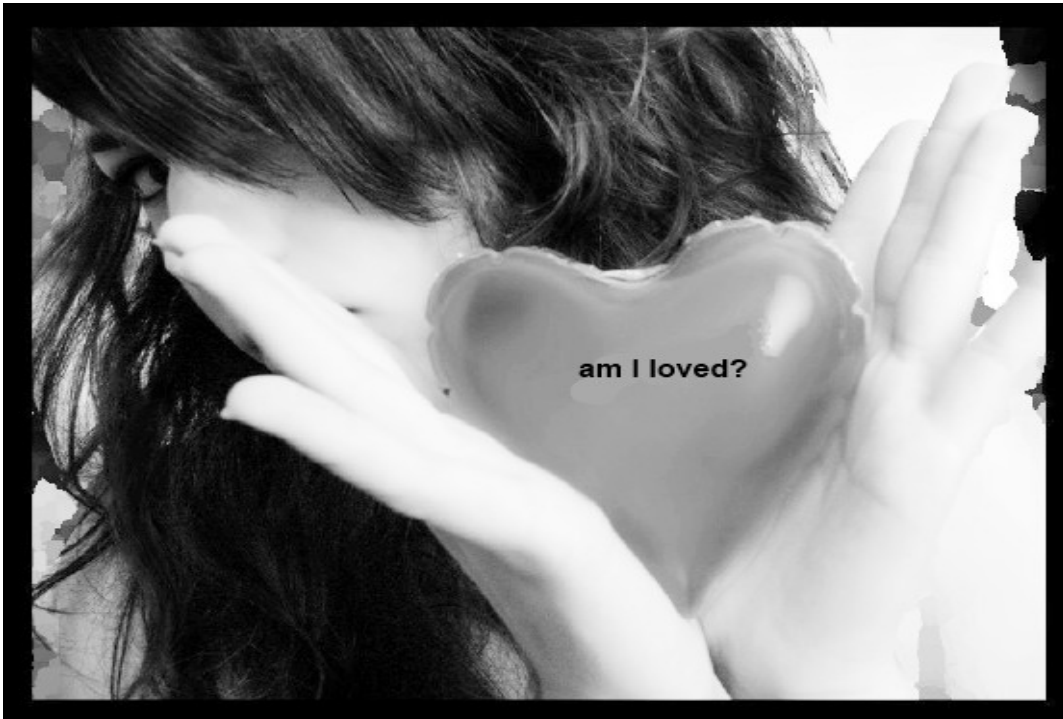

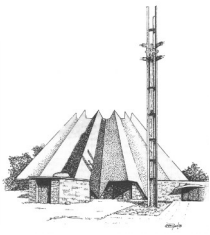

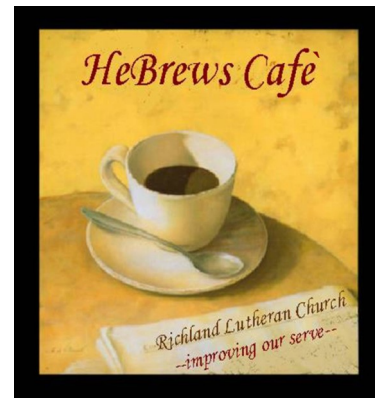
