The RLC Council just concluded its February 14, 2012, meeting which included some very positive news regarding January, 2012 attendance/giving. For the first time since changing affiliation to the Lutheran Congregations for Mission in Christ (LCMC) the average attendance for the month of January exceeded the previous Januaries (2010 and 2011). This certainly is an indication we are again growing and our ministries are effective in outreach. Additionally, for the first time in a number of Januaries giving exceeded our projected budget numbers. We also are very excited that the "Call Committee" completed its efforts in nominating a perspective Lead Pastor – Steve Ernst! The congregation will meet on February 26, 2012, after the 11:00 a.m. Sunday Service to vote on this nomination.

Finally, the members of the Congregation Council are pleased about a new ministry opportunity within our church – members visiting and spiritually ministering to those members of RLC who are shut-ins. As many of you are aware about two years ago a number of RLC members were trained to provide communion to the shut-in members of our congregation. This has been a blessing for those giving the communion, as well as the shut-ins. Based on this, we have has decided to expand the program to include visitation by members of the congregation. Pastor Hogan will lead this effort and plans to provide training on this opportunity in March 2012. Lent is the liturgical (an arrangement and/or form of worship services) season in the Church year set aside for fasting, abstinence, and penitence in preparation for Easter. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, 40 days before Easter not counting Sundays (Sundays are not included because in the Church liturgical year every Sunday we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. That is why the Christian Church worships on Sundays and not Saturdays, the Sabbath before the resurrection of Jesus).

This Lent at RLC we will be worshiping on Thursday nights, as is our practice, and sharing a soup supper together (this is part of our practice of abstinence, not sharing a whole meal). Corey Smith will be teaching about Jesus using some of the names used for Jesus [Son of God, Son of Man, Christ, Light of the World, Adonai (Lord), Lamb of God].

On Sunday mornings through Lent Pastor Steve will be teaching us about the Spiritual Disciplines of Prayer, Scripture Reading, Fasting, Meditation, and Worship. Practicing Spiritual Disciplines aids us in getting closer to God, discerning his will, hearing from him clearly, casting our cares upon him, living in peace and by the power of the Holy Spirit and much more. Since its inception, the Church has put much emphasis on practicing and living spiritual disciplines with special emphasis during the season of Lent.

We hope you will join us this Lent as we grow deeper in faith and obedience to our Lord and Savior, Jesus.

Maintaining Your Optimal Health One Step at a Time

Over the last three months we have discussed some basics to maintain our optimal health. We have talked about receiving the flu vaccination, dietary needs, and the importance of proper sleep. This month we are talking about the importance of exercise. Although the Bible doesn't speak of exercise per se, we know that folks of the time period were physically active due to the lifestyle they observed.

Most people know that physical exercise is important for cardiac health, stamina, strength, and muscle tone. It also is known to promote sleep, help control weight, increase energy, help increase mood and decrease anxiety, boost metabolism, and combat health disease. The Mayo Clinic recommends setting a goal of 30 or more minutes of exercise every day. If you are looking to lose weight or have other fitness goals your exercise regimen needs to be modified accordingly. Before starting any vigorous exercise routine, make sure you check with your physician to make sure you are healthy enough to participate in such a routine. People most successful in exercising enjoy their chosen activity be it cycling, swimming, walking, running, dancing, working out at the gym, yoga, golfing, bowling, Wii games, martial arts or another activity. Some folks choose to incorporate physical activity into their normal day by taking the stairs instead of the elevator, parking at the far end of the parking lot to increase their number of steps to their destination, to garden or incorporate other physical activities. Whatever activity you choose, remember to keep moving. There is no age limit on the need to exercise.

Along with physical exercise, mental exercise is also of upmost importance. From birth on, we need to be mentally challenged to maintain our mental acuteness. As we age, this is even more important. Exercising your brain helps maintain your concentration, memory, creativity,


