RLC in Mission for Christ: Moving from "Church" to "Spiritual" Conversations

Last week Maria Frame and I were blessed to attend the LCMC Annual Gathering in Denver, CO. While there we heard some inspired speakers including Reggie McNeal, noted author and speaker. In our time with Reggie he encouraged us,

LCMC, as we continue to be in mission for Christ, to move from having what he called "church" conversations to "spiritual" conversations.

You know what he means by "church" conversations, don't you? They go like this: "Hi, Sally, keeping warm today? The sanctuary is a bit cool, I sure hope they get that fixed." Or, "James, what color do you prefer for the new carpet? I kind of like the darker shade." Or, "Did you hear what pastor said to Jessica's parents? He told them it's their responsibility, not his, to disciple their kids. Can you image?"

We all have these "church" conversations regularly. In fact, I may be chief among conversationalists when it comes to these shallow, superficial interactions. Reggie encouraged us to go deeper and more intimate with one another in our interactions to have "spiritual" conversations.

Spiritual conversations get to the heart of the life of discipleship, intimacy and love of one-another. In congregations who are in mission for Christ these are the kinds of normal conversations which take place regularly. They go like this: "Mark, how's your life in Jesus going?" Or, "Lisa, I saw your name on the prayer list, would it be okay to pray with you about your upcoming surgery right now?" Or, "To be honest, Earl, I'm not doing well at all. I'm feeling beat down and discouraged and I'd welcome your wisdom and counsel on what's going on."

By far, the easier conversations to have are the "church" conversations. You don't have to "put yourself out there" or bear others' burdens but are these the kinds of conversations Christ wants us to have? Clearly not. Christ desires us to depend on one-another, go deep in Christian discipleship, and bear each-other's burdens. This simply cannot happen unless we're willing to have "spiritual" conversations. So, go for it. Find a friend, another member of this same body of Christ, and dive into conversations which really matter and which will make a difference. And see how God works!

Giving Thanks – Thanksgiving!!

The 2012 Advent and Holiday Season is nearly upon us. God is NOT a Replacement Ref!

He's not even a regular referee. Regular referees make mistakes. He *is* a righteous referee, however. He is *the* referee. I've been thinking about this lately. Partly because of the fall season. Partly because of a certain game played recently with which some of you may be familiar. True confessions: I only saw the last three minutes of the game in question - as I recall, my devotions must have precluded my seeing the rest of the game (puff, puff). Those final minutes turned out to be the most significant part of the game. The last play of the game (until a belated extra point conversion) turned into a major subject of controversy. It centered around exactly *who* possessed the ball in the end zone. It was exacerbated because the game referees were replacement fill-ins for regular referees embroiled in contract negotiations. It was aided and abetted by the network broadcasting the game having an agenda to stir up such controversy.

I won't belabor the description of the play. You'll get a sense of it in a description of some lessons we can learn about God, life and salvation, in what follows. It will be necessary for you to "play along with (humor?) me" in this allegory or analogy. Consider the ball as a metaphor for human life. Maybe that life's even *yours. Who* possesses that life? We're *all* propelled in one direction of the *end* zone - a metaphor for, well, the end of life. There's nothing we can do to stop it no matter how much we dye graying hair or cover up balding heads or any myriad other ways we create the impression we're not headed to the grave. *"...people are destined to die once, and after that to face judgment,"* (Hebrews 9:27). There's no after-the-fact *conversion* in this game.

Through grace-granted faith, Jesus is on our team. The good news is He's already in the end zone awaiting us. *"Christ is the culmination of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes,"* says St. Paul in <u>Romans 10:4</u>. That word "culmination" would better be translated as "goal". Indeed that's what Paul, again, means in <u>Galatians 3:24</u>: that the law was to bring us to Christ.

Jesus, for a catch, only needs to get one hand on us (one-handed catches are legal catches). "*I will uphold you with My righteous right hand.*" (*Isaiah 41.10*). Christ is such a sure receiver that no matter how much the *Enemy* might contest for our life, He can beat him with one hand! (John 10:28) As this isn't an amateur version of the game being played, the test of an immaculate reception is: the receiver must have *both* feet on the ground in the end zone with a hand on the ball.

"I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end He will stand on the earth." (Job 19:25) *"I see heaven open and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God."* (Acts 7:56) In His incarnation and ascension, your life takes its firm stand with Christ by faith. God, the Ultimate Referee, is right there on top of the play, and: *"Will not the Judge of all the earth do right?"* (Genesis 18:25)

Maintaining Your Optimal Health

One Step at a Time

Preventing Falls

Falls can occur anytime, anyplace, and to anyone while doing everyday activities. The number of falls and the severity of injury when one falls increases with age.

Those who fall are two to three times more likely to fall again. This is due to a physical and psychological component. A person who falls may have balance or strength issues which contributed to the fall. They may have impaired vision or medication side effects which are contributing to falls. The physical environment may be unsafe, leading to a likelihood of further falls. A person may also develop a fear of falling which may lead to limiting activity, thus increasing the chance that continued weakened muscles and imbalances cause the very thing one is trying to avoid - falling. We can address these issues to help prevent falls.

Speaking with one's doctor is essential. An eye exam, bone density test, a check of one's hearing, a thorough examination of medication (interactions and side-effects), and permission/ recommendation of an exercise program are all topics to discuss.

With your doctor's permission, begin physical activities designed to strengthen muscle, improve your balance and increase your endurance. A proper exercise program can decrease your risk of falling. When exercising at home, practice near an immovable object such as a wall or kitchen counter so you can catch your balance, if needed. Keep a cell phone, portable phone, or MedicalAlert/Lifeline in a pocket or on a lanyard "just in case." Learn the proper technique of how to use a sturdy chair to get up and down from the floor and practice doing so. Place a sturdy chair in every room in your house, again as a "just in case," and also to give you peace of mind.

One's environment can be made safer to where falls are less likely to happen. An excellent listing of "Prevention Tips", a checklist of environmental hazards to correct at home can be found in an article, "Preventing Falls in the Elderly" by K.R. Tremblay, Jr. and C.E. Barber from Colorado State University at www.ext.colostate.edu/pubs/consumer/10242.html.

A short list of things to do to prevent falls includes:

- Don't hurry
- Wear proper footwear fitting shoes, nonskid soles, replace loose-fitting slippers, avoid high heels, and never walk in stocking feet
- Improve the lighting in your home, including a night-light along the bedroom/bathroom route
- Use caution outdoors, watch for unmarked curbs and uneven ground

Most importantly - Prepare. Prepare yourself now. Prepare your home now. An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.


