

# 2013: "Becoming Christian Disciples: It's all about FOLLOWING Jesus"

Last October at our annual congregational meeting we, RLC, adopted our 2013 Ministry Plan. In that plan we adopted our 2013 focus: "Becoming Christian Disciples." Christian disciples are those who have heard the call of Jesus Christ and have unconditionally sacrificed their whole self and life to following Him. Jesus said, "Anyone who loves their father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; anyone who loves their son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. Whoever does not take up their cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds their life will lose it, and whoever loses their life for my sake will find it" (Matthew. 10:37-39 emphasis added).

Christian disciples know Jesus is who He said He is and did/does what He said he did/does. They know God's story throughout history and understand their place in that history of salvation which includes them. Christian disciples become true followers of Jesus by heeding His call and surrendering all life to him, receiving his power through the Holy Spirit. They take the step from knowing about Jesus to embracing Jesus for their own lives living in faith and obedience. Christian disciples do all God has for them in faith and life, by God's grace and power. They see themselves as having been gifted and equipped for the ministry appointed them and live lives in ministry and service worthy of Christ's calling upon them.

Well, it's now 2013 and time for us to begin our discipleship focus. In our 2013 Ministry Plan we adopted the following strategy to aid us in becoming Christian disciples:

Foundation for Christian disciples at RLC:

The 3E's: Equipping, empowering, and encouraging become the foundation for Christian discipleship at RLC. Our focus will be to equip God's people with the proper knowledge and understanding of Christ to know Him, empower God's people with the proper authority and opportunity to become His followers and encourage God's people to do everything God has created them to do. This will happen through sermons, newsletter articles, building and maintaining leaders through leadership development, etc.

Fostering Christian discipleship at RLC:

Smaller Groups: People will be encouraged to get involved with RLC through smaller groups where developing people, enabling spiritual relationships, and living God's Word for faith and life, as described above, will be the major focus for fostering and developing Christian disciples at RLC within these groups.

Facilitating Christian discipleship at RLC:

Programs: Though not programmatic in our approach, we recognize there are programs which help facilitate Christian discipleship. Programs such as Renovare', Trinity Living, The Truth Project, confirmation, mentoring, and growth groups will be emphasized and promoted throughout RLC and beyond.

So, don't wait to begin growing in your relationship with Christ through discipleship. Make a personal plan now to join a small group, find a ministry where you can serve, begin practicing the spiritual disciplines like; prayer, Bible study, regular worship, etc., and continue to become the person God has created you to be!

## From Pastor Steve



**RLC** in Mission for Christ: Shine!

Congregations in mission for Christ seek to **shine** the light of Christ into a dark world. From my earliest years I can remember singing, "This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it **shine**." What a great reminder: shining is exactly what Christ wants us to do. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus says, "You are the light of the world…let your light **shine** before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16). But what does it look like when we shine?

This week during Pastor Corey's sermon on "Salvation's Present" he referenced the Apostle Paul in his letter to the church in Philippi, "Do everything without grumbling or arguing, so that you may become blameless and pure, 'children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation.' Then you will **shine** among them like stars in the sky as you hold firmly to the word of life" (Philippians 2:14 & 15). The encouragement from Paul here is to do things without grumbling or arguing, that if we do we may become children of God. And children of God shine compared to those who are of the warped and crooked generation.

Is shining really that easy? We won't know unless we try it. So give it a try. Try doing things without grumbling or arguing. See what happens to those around you. See what happens to you, your heart, your thoughts, your feelings, your attitude. Take the light of Christ with you and, hide it under a bushel, NO! Let Satan blow it out, NO! Let it shine, let it shine!

## Tri-Cities Terrace 1 and Shalom Ecumenical Center

#### Invitation to the Tri-Cities Terrace I (West) Open House

You are invited to an open house to celebrate the 10th anniversary of the opening of Tri-Cities Terrace I on Tuesday, January 29th, 2013, from 2:00 to 3:00 pm. TCT-I consists of 59 apartments for very low-income seniors and is located at 1770 Leslie Road on land donated to Shalom Ecumenical Center (SEC) by Kadlec Medical Center. SEC for Affordable Housing, of which Richland Lutheran Church is a member, and the Episcopal Diocese of Spokane sponsored the construction and initial operation of this facility. Construction of the facility was funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the Washington State Housing Trust Fund (HTF). The board of directors for TCT-I includes Rich Barchet and Rob Barr from Richland Lutheran Church.

#### Good News from Shalom Ecumenical Center (SEC) Affordable Housing

A recent award of \$738,550 from the Washington State Housing Trust Fund (HTF) completes the requested funding for the construction of Kennewick Perry Suites (KPS). About \$1.8 million had previously been granted last year by HUD. The 14-unit KPS will house very low-income adults with developmental and physical disabilities. This facility is co-sponsored by Modern Living Services (MLS) and SEC. SEC was asked by MLS to co-sponsor this project because of SEC's experience and credibility with HUD and HTF, and SEC has been funding many of the pre-development costs. These costs will be reimbursed to SEC after construction begins in March or April 2013.

Also, HUD and HTF have committed to fund the construction early next year of the Hudesman House Apartments in Colville, WA. The facility will contain 13 apartments for very low-income seniors. SEC is the sponsor of this project and it is covering all pre-development costs, which will be reimbursed.

Richland Lutheran Church is a member of SEC and appoints three people from the congregation to represent it on the SEC board of directors. Presently, these are Rich Barchet, Warner Blyckert and Dave Wunschel.

## Financial Update

#### **Treasurer's Report - November 2012**

As reflected in the financial summary below, the financial results have been consistently above plan through November 2012. Our offerings are up \$27,403, or 4.1% higher than the same time last year. Our expenses are down \$(53,243), or 7.2% less than the same time last year. Year to date, our offerings exceed expenses by \$20,616 compared to \$(60,030) in 2011. These results are reflected in the columns titled "Prior Year Comparison".

Year to Date, actual offerings exceed the budget by \$13,420 and actual expenses are under budget by \$35,357. In addition, year to date "actual" offerings exceed "actual" expenses by \$20,616 and exceed the year to date budget by \$48,777.

In many ways the "times" have not changed since Charles Dickens penned his famous sentence – or really since Jesus' day. Jesus said, "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. When we look back at 2012, we see many blessings. This time last year Steve Ernst was Interim Lead Pastor... now he is our Lead Pastor; Corey Smith was not an ordained minister... now he has been ordained and is our Associate Pastor; and, Dave Hogan was our Interim Associate Pastor for visitation ministries... now he is our Associate Pastor for visitation ministries. And, we have enhanced our excellent staff with the addition of Jay Dixon as our Property & Grounds Coordinator and Lisa Wiegand as our Bookkeeper.

When we look back at 2012, we see the heart of Jesus alive in the hearts of our people — in programs like ShareFest, the Community Fair, Habitat for Humanity, Second Harvest, Union Gospel Mission, Jefferson School Reading Program, Luther Senior Center, Quilting and Knitting and the Shalom Ecumenical Center—all for people in need. We also see the heart of Jesus at work in our people as they join together in worship, participate in a Sunday morning or mid-week Bible Study, attend Sunday School, attend a Youth Group gathering, experience the Truth Project, take a Trinity Living course, attend a men's, women's, or youth retreat, learn from the Gedde Lectures, participate in Confirmation studies, or belong to a small/growth group.

When we look back at 2012, we see the heart of Jesus at work in people who visited or sent cards to those sick and shut-in, who provided communion as *Eucharistic Ministers*, who visited people with dementia, who prayed as a prayer warrior, who became members of our after service prayer team, who sponsored a needy child in a third world country as part of our International Sunday School, who witnessed to our Lord Jesus in Montana, in Russia, or in Jordan, or who baked cookies for a memorial service reception. We also see the heart of Jesus in the people in our congregation who are reaching others by supporting area-wide ministries: the *Good News Media Ministry*, *Bible Study Fellowship*, *Walk With Christ*, *Tri-City Men's Ministry*, *The Tri-City Chaplaincy*; or by those who sponsored a *HeBrews Café* or participated in *Christian Yoga* workouts.

There are those of our friends who worked to the glory of God by serving in the kitchen to enhance our fellowship, sharpening pew pencils – so people can fill out their yellow slips and take sermon notes, working in the library – so others can draw closer to God through books and DVDs, by singing in the choir or by playing an instrument - so we can have a meaningful worship experience; by serving as ushers and church friends, as communion assistants and acolytes; in communion prep and by providing church decorations, supporting our cookie ministry, painting the church, assembling bulletins, accounting for the offering and setting up the *Prince of Peace* for a different venue.

In our congregation, we have had members die, people endure sickness and poor health, and people who have and are now experiencing difficulties – in their careers or in their relationships with others. But, having Jesus in our heart has made the big difference in 2012. And it is sure to make the big difference in 2013 . . . and to eternity. ## This Little Light of Mine

The title for the month is recognizable to most as an old Sunday School children's song. My best recollection of it, however, is from a Christian Education class I took at one of the several institutions of higher learning I've attended getting educated beyond my intelligence. The teacher was up front, instructing us, when the school's philosophy teacher came sneaking in the back to access his own classroom. The philosopher, a somewhat youngish man, had a completely bald pate. Our prof started leading us in the song titled *This Little Light of Mine* (it's a joke, folks - the idea is that the light was reflecting off the guy's bald head.) Upon further review, if I have to explain it, you've lost the joke (it was funny at the time; I guess you had to be there!) anyway, they were very good friends and the object of the laugh simply smiled, waved, and went on his way.

That scene was brought to mind last month when asked to pull an annual preaching assignment at a pastor friend's church during Advent. As I sat in the congregation while he was introducing me, I was struck by the the fact that in the light over the pulpit, it was evident he no longer had a *receding* hairline - it was mostly gone! Yet another indicator that I and my companions must be aging.

I have the high privilege, at this age and stage of my life, to serve in the capacity of Associate Pastor in the arena of Visitation under the auspices of Richland Lutheran Church. Often as not, that means I'm ministering to and with persons of (*ahem!*) a certain age - and older. Ah, the ravages of age: it's an organ recital! It consists (but not restricted to only the elderly), of persons suffering from: various heart and cancer problems, joint replacements, hearing and sight impairments, permutations of memory loss, arthritis, rheumatism and lumbago, leathern bladder and kidneys (as to bowels, out of respect for my departed Mother, we *won't* "go" there, lest she would have been scandalized), and....hair loss, etc.

The aging may identify with Elisha in <u>II Kings 2:23, 24</u> who being jeered as a "baldhead" by a group of youths, called down a curse on them and: "two bears came out of the woods and mauled forty-two" of them. I too am not always a cheerful sufferer, but I do believe this is the most interesting time of life. It may not be the most exciting time: except for the anticipation of getting closer to Christ.

Aging is interesting: you've got enough history to look back and see clearly recognizable patterns in your life identifying the consistency with which God has been leading you all the way in what you would've called "good" times, and "bad" times. This permits faith, trust, and loyalty to Christ to increase; allowing you to be more peaceable in suffering. An imprisoned (and likely bald) St. Paul once joyfully wrote: "I have learned the secret to being content in any and every situation..." (Philippians 4:12, 13). THAT'S letting the light of Christ shine at every time and situation of life. "Don't let Satan poof it out." Permit His strength to LET IT SHINE through you this year!

## Parish Health Ministry

#### Maintaining Your Optimal Health

#### One Step at a Time

The last free seminar of 2012 at Oasis Physical Therapy was, "Learn Healthy Habits; 8 Important Factors in a Healthy, Pain Free Life." According to Dr. Mindi Irvine, DPT, practicing these eight natural, inexpensive, habits will effect every aspect of your life, improving one's physical and emotional well-being.

#### Dr. Irvine's List of 8 Natural, Inexpensive, Healthy Habits

- 1. Develop a spiritual relationship.
- 2. Learn to decrease your stress.
- 3. Stop smoking.
- 4. Get 8 hours of quality sleep each night.
- 5. Exercise 20 30 minutes 3-5 days a week.
- 6. Aim to get fresh air and sunshine, daily.
- 7. Eat a balanced diet.
- 8. Drink 1 oz. per pound of body weight of quality water a day.

Having attended the last five or six seminars and being presented with strictly medical advice, I was thrilled to hear that #1 and #2 on the list of eight important factors dealt with one's spiritual life. According to information given at the seminar, stress, worry, and guilt nibble away at one's quality of life, leading to illness. Dr. Irvine encouraged participants in the packed room of participants in November to increase their trust in God. She quoted Isaiah 40:31 - "Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They... will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not faint." She encouraged listeners to give their worries and guilt over to God. "Thank Him for what you have, and ask Him for what you need," she said.

## An Update from Your RLC Long-Range Planning Team (LRPT)

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." Matthew 22:36-40 (NIV)

After three months of praying, reading books and articles, studying our church and our community, and discussing various opportunities, your RLC LRPT is beginning to see a clear direction for developing our long-range plan. It shouldn't be surprising – actually, it's awesome – that the basis for our planning is these two main instructions of Jesus, "Love God with every thing you have; love your neighbor as yourself."

First, the LRPT seeks to strengthen our capabilities and capacities to help the members of our congregation grow spiritually — *to love God with all their heart*. To support the planning associated with this initiative, we will be conducting the REVEAL Spiritual Life Survey, <a href="http://www.spirituallifesurvey.com/">http://www.spirituallifesurvey.com/</a>. This survey will help us identify and develop spiritual growth programs, allocate staff and lay resources, and identify key plant and equipment needs. This survey will be offered to the whole congregation and is scheduled to take place January 26 through February 9, 2013. So, plan to help us help you in your spiritual walk with Jesus — take the survey when it is announced.

Second, the LRPT seeks to strengthen and provide more focus for the work we do as a congregation in the community – *to love our neighbors as we do ourselves*. To address these needs and our capabilities and capacities, we are using a book and a workbook by Kennon L. Callahan titled the <u>Twelve Keys to an Effective Church</u>. This material is quite detailed -- but our team is working to develop methods for gathering information from key groups and all our members. The 12 Keys Survey is planned to take place from April 7 through April 21, 2013 – with follow-up focus groups in the May-June time frame. These activities will help identify what RLC can do over the next five years to help our neighbors and to support our RLC vision: *Richland Lutheran Church is a congregation of Christ followers making His name known and advancing His kingdom*. What we identify to do, or to be, will help us allocate staff and lay resources, and, identify key plant and equipment needs.

Our team has developed this objective statement: "The objective of the Long-Range Planning Team (LRPT) is to evaluate the spiritual, relational, and physical needs of the RLC Congregation and the citizens of the Tri-Cities and provide recommendations to the congregation regarding the future direction of Richland Lutheran Church." It is the goal of the LRPT to roll all the information up into a document by the first week in August, 2013 so that we can (1) have a roll-out early in the program year, (2) establish well-considered education programs for September 2013, and (3) provide guidance to the 2014 Ministry Plan and Budget.

Please continue to keep our congregation and the LRPT in prayer and plan to participate in the planning process. RLC has been blessed to be a blessing in our community – Luther Senior Center, the Good News Media Ministry, and The Tri-City Chaplaincy are our main contributions. God will provide us with the capabilities and capacities to love Him more and show that love to our neighbors. Until He returns, we must endeavor to make His name known and to advance His kingdom.
