From Pastor Steve



RLC in Mission for Christ: "The Right Question!"

The staff and I have been reading through the book of Acts in our devotional time during our weekly staff meetings. This past Tuesday we read the story of Philip and the Ethiopian eunuch. According to the text of Acts 8:26-40, Philip is led by the Holy Spirit to leave Jerusalem where he meets an Ethiopian traveling home from a time of worship in Jerusalem and is reading the prophet Isaiah. After a short interaction Philip "told him the good news about Jesus" (35).

After hearing the good news about Jesus the Ethiopian asks Philip as they come to some water, "What can stand in the way of my being baptized?" (36). What a great question revealing the Ethiopian's heart and attitude toward God and doing what it takes to get to know him better. A more typical response we might hear today is, "Why do I need to be baptized?" "Is baptism necessary?" "Am I ready for baptism?" "What happens if I'm not baptized?" You get the idea.

Often times we understand what God requires but ask the wrong questions. What if we approached spiritual growth with the heart and attitude of the Ethiopian? Instead of asking, "Do I have enough time to read my Bible," ask, "What can stand in the way of my reading the Bible?" Instead of asking, "Why should I pray daily," ask, "What can stand in the way of my praying daily?" Instead of asking, "Why do I need to practice spiritual disciplines," ask, "What can stand in the way of my practicing the spiritual disciplines?" I wonder if asking the right question out of the right heart and attitude toward God would lead to a deeper and more meaningful life in Christ through faith and obedience? What do you think?

In the meantime it is with immense gratitude that we thank those who have stepped up and filled the void left by this vacancy; specifically, Alane Evers, Joe Potts and his praise team, Teresa Zorich, Brenda Hoyt, Zemmie Iedema, Sue Meek, Scott Hardman, Jim Honeyman and those behind the scenes who make sure we have acolytes, ushers, communion assistants, etc. What a blessing you all are!!

So now we ask for your continued prayers and patience as we continue our search.

From the Council

Major activities remaining for 2013 in which the Council is directly involved include the review of the proposed RLC Long Range Plan, the 2014 Ministry Plan, the 2014 RLC budget, and the annual Congregation meeting.

Currently, the staff has provided the RLC Council with a proposed 2014 Ministry Plan. One purpose of the ministry plan is to establish annual goals for five major areas of ministry: Outreach, Worship, Nurture, Education, and Resources. The Council members are reviewing the Plan and providing comments for consideration and incorporation. The 2014 Ministry Plan will be presented to the congregation at the annual Congregational meeting.

The Long Range Planning Team is in the final throws of providing a draft of the Long Range Plan. Currently, the Team intends to provide the Council with the draft plan before the August 2013 Council meeting. Depending on the Plan's progress, the Plan will be discussed at Hebrews Café and may be discussed at the annual Congregation meeting.

In August the Council and the staff will begin drafting the 2014 annual budget. This is always a very challenging and labor intensive task. The bases of the budget are the 2014 Ministry Plan and funding its associated activities, maintaining the RLC facilities, staff salaries and benefits and benevolence. The budget will be presented the congregation at the annual Congregation meeting for review, discussion and a vote for approval.

The RLC Nominating Committee is working diligently to identify, interview, and nominate four members of the congregation to replace the four outgoing Council Members. The Council President, Vice President and two at-large members have reached the end of their terms. The nominees will be voted on at the annual Congregation meeting.

There is much to be done for the remainder of 2013 to prepare RLC in furthering our vision of being a congregation of Christ followers who are making Jesus Christ known to all people and advancing His Kingdom. The Council looks forward to active and full congregation participation at the October 22, 2013, annual Congregational eeting.

Beneath My Cool Exterior There Lurks a Growing Insensitivity!

Avid readers of this column (both of them) will recall that as a part of my June musings I told the tale of losing one of my front teeth just as we were to embark on a May trip to "O Canada!" An update is in order. I'd been running around with a temporary cap and bridge assembly since our return to the States. Finally on July 11th the dentist was going to install the permanent fix. We encountered a glitch, however. The evening of Tuesday, July 9th, the Mrs. and I were eating at Anthony's, thanks to a kind gift from some parishioners. In the middle of our meal, I heard a sort of sickening crunch in my mouth. The temporary fix had broken. Not to worry, except for the fact that: guess whose dentist doesn't work on Wednesdays? Not to worry, except for the fact that two other parishioners were eating in the same restaurant that evening and sauntered over to greet us at our table on their way out. Not to worry, except that now - since the dentist had destroyed a perfectly good eyetooth to create a post for the bridge - I not only had a large gap once again, but a significant snaggletooth alongside it. If that couple is reading this, I apologize for seeming more standoffish than usual, as I (pridefully) wanted to spare you a rather comedic Draculean grin in our exchange of greetings.

But wait (!) there's more! Guess whose dentist ended up being hospitalized on Thursday for heart problems? It wasn't until the following Monday before I was able to get the situation rectified permanently. Now here's the rub: I informed the dentist that the snaggletooth remainder of my formerly fine eyetooth was a bit sensitive. His response was that I shouldn't be concerned. He told me I was fortunate, because if I were a young man (Hrrumph!) the tooth surface would be a great deal more sensitive; because as we get older our nerve ending sensitivity to such pains diminishes (you could have fooled me!)

"Upon further review" (terminology reminding us football will soon be returning) this growing insensitivity as we age begins to make sense. Hearing capacity ends up going, going, gone; visual acuity diminishes; diabetes leaves in its wake peripheral neuropathy in the feet and finger tips inured from daily required blood testing. And that's just the Associate Pastor for Visitation! Imagine what many of those for whom he has primary ministry responsibilities must be going through.

To linger into aging is to discover that the Lord will wean us from this earthly life by means of a growing insensitivity to it. The contextual translation The Voice renders Ecclesiastes 12:1, "And so we come to the end of this musing over life...remember your Creator, God, while you are young; before life gets hard and the injustices of old age comes upon you - before the years arrive when pleasure feels far out of reach..." It's God's grace bringing us to the point of truly crying out "Amen. Come, Lord Jesus." (Revelation 22:20b) Lord, as this world becomes more insensible to us, keep our hearts sensitive to You and to others!

Equipping Empowering Encouraging

No longer can we be mere hearers of the Word. By the power of the Holy Spirit, we must move our faith to action — to act differently because of our identity in Christ. People who are not yet believers are looking for evidence that God truly is sufficient, able, and willing to fill the emptiness in their lives. It is time for Christians to raise the bar and live more intentionally in accordance with His purposes.

Trinity Living Peer Coaching is a ten-week discipleship program designed to help believers identify God's will for their lives by emphasizing the power of the Holy Trinity. As participants move through the sessions, they are equipped, empowered, and encouraged by the promises in the Word as they intentionally change the way they live. Any Christ follower committed to seeking God's will and living in accordance with His plan should consider participating in this opportunity.

Trinity Living is an experience, not a program. The more you invest, the more you will grow personally and spiritually as a result of your experience. You and your peer coach will hold each other accountable for completing weekly action steps. Each session includes equipping from God-centered guidance and teaching, time for empowerment of the Holy Spirit, and encouragement from the words of Jesus.

Trinity Living requires participants to play two roles. Not only are you being coached, you are going to be a coach. This unique situation requires a higher level of commitment than typically found in a coaching relationship, so it is especially important to attend every session. Coaching is a one-to-one, confidential, ongoing arrangement intended to result in helping the person being coached make more informed decisions in order to achieve better results. Christian coaching is differentiated from secular coaching because of the role of the Holy Spirit. Both the coach and person being coached rely on the leading of the Holy Spirit for direction, trusting God to generate both the questions and the answers that lead to His will.

If you have been praying about this, now is the time to make the commitment. Sessions begin on Thursday, September 5, at 6:30 PM and will last two hours. The final meeting will be Thursday, October 26, 2013. Sessions are held in the Chapel at Richland Lutheran Church. Group size is limited to 12. Long Range Plan Team Update

Nearly a year after being given a directive from the Congregational Council to evaluate the long range plan of Richland Lutheran Church, the Long Range Planning Team (LRPT) is in the final stage of developing a document to direct and guide the council, staff, and the congregation. The LRPT anticipates having a document available for congregational review in the coming weeks, followed shortly thereafter by a special congregational meeting for a vote on adoption of the plan. Copies of the plan will be made available both electronically and on paper, with supporting appendices on the website and in the church library. As always, the members of the Long Range Plan Team are available to answer questions (email: LRPTeam@richlandlutheran.org, or by phone or in person). It is the prayerful hope of the LRPT that this will be a "living" document and will be the foundation of future annual ministry plans and ministry activities, being reviewed and revised as we grow spiritually and physically. This document is a response to Jesus' command to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind" and to "love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:35-41). With adoption of what the LRPT has come to understand to be not just a "long range plan" about facilities and programs but more a "long range MINISTRY plan," it is hoped that in the coming years, the RLC family will be able to look around and see that through personal, spiritual growth, we are a congregation who loves more deeply, serves more freely, and seeks to have Jesus in every aspect of life.

Parish Health Ministry

Parish Health Ministry Maintaining Your Optimal Health One Step at a Time

We will be sponsoring a Red Cross blood drive on Tuesday, September 17, from 1-6 PM. We have a goal of 25 donors for this drive. This will provide enough blood for up to 75 individuals needing transfusions. Any person who weighs over 110 pounds and is at least 16 years old or older can donate blood. However, some folks taking certain medications, having certain medical issues, or who have traveled abroad to certain countries may not be eligible to donate. You are eligible to donate every 56 days.

People donate for a number of reasons. They may have known family or friends who needed a transfusion at one time or another, or may feel compassion to help others in need. Reasons are personal and varied, and we are fortunate to have members of the congregation willing to give.

In preparation for donating, a good night's sleep is recommended, consumption of high iron foods in days before donating to ensure an adequate hemoglobin level, and an adequate consumption of fluid/water the day of the donation. Wear comfortable clothes and a shirt with sleeves that can be rolled up allowing easy access for the donation.

Donors are asked to bring in their Red Cross donation card if they have one or their driver's license for identification purposes on donation day. If you do not have a driver's license or card, two other pieces of identification can be substituted. The actual time to donate takes less than 15 minutes. After the donation, you are offered refreshments and fluids to re-hydrate and should remain for 10-15 minutes until you are feeling well enough to resume your other activities. This is a good time for some visiting with other RLC members as well.

Please consider donating, as we are scheduling donors at this time. Sign up on your yellow worship slip or contact the church office. If you have questions, review the Red Cross Blood Drive information site at www.redcrossblood.org/ or contact me at Bonindk@pocketinet.com. We hope you consider donating to help others live, as it is said in the Galatians 6:2 "Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ."


