RLC in Mission for Christ: Wind-Blown!

"The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit." These words of Jesus recorded by the Apostle John in the third chapter of his Gospel have new meaning for Seth (grandson of Carmie) and Sarah Peterson. As Seth stated in his letter to the Congregation Council (included on page 6) "those were not the words I wanted to hear." You can imagine them saying, where did that "wind" come from and where is it going? I know I did when Seth, Debbie Stankovich, Loren Schmid, Chuck Richardson and I sat

down with Seth just over a year ago to interview him for our then vacant Property and Grounds Coordinator position. We were surprised, to say the least, by the serendipitous work of the Holy Spirit when collectively we felt and then said to Seth, "We believe you're called to something else and you should listen." And perhaps even more surprised to be able to help Seth discover and then fulfill this call.

This is a great reminder to us at Richland Lutheran we must be willing to be "wind-blown." In the above verse the Greek root for "wind" and "Spirit" is the same, pneuma ($\pi v \epsilon \tilde{\upsilon} \mu \alpha$). So we can say accurately we must be willing to be "Spirit-blown." To be "Spirit-blown" means we are sensitive to hearing from the Holy Spirit and willing to go and do what He requires of us. This story of Seth and Sarah Peterson not only evidences their willingness to follow the Holy Spirit's leading but also evidences Richland Lutheran's willingness to do the same. The "outside the box" ways our congregation and its leadership have helped support Seth and Sarah gives me great pride and satisfaction. Nothing about this God work has been business as usual. Seriously, who could have planned all this except for the one who is the "All-In-All"?

Now it is Richland Lutheran's extreme privilege and pleasure to send out a "son" of our congregation and his family as partners in and missionaries of the Gospel of Jesus to the world. I hope you too, as a member of Richland Lutheran Church, feel the same sense of pride and satisfaction I do as we by faith and obedience send these out having headed the Spirit of God as He blows where He pleases. Letter from Seth Peterson

August 23, 2013

Dear RLC Congregation Council Members,

"We believe you're called to something else and you should listen."

Those were *not* the words I wanted to hear 15 months ago when I applied for the position of Property and Grounds Coordinator at Richland Lutheran Church. Having been unemployed for a long time, I *really needed* this job and knew I was qualified for it. Besides that, the prospect of working in the church where I grew up was appealing to me. But God had another plan.

Though I didn't get the job, knowing we were about to lose our home, Richland Lutheran Church offered us an opportunity to make one of the duplexes habitable in exchange for a roof over our heads. We accepted the offer, which ended up giving us the time we needed to consider what Pastor Steve had spoken to me. Since then, I've thought a lot about my life, and wondered what that "something else" was and what I should do about it.

I remember hearing that "still, small voice" around the age of seven. I didn't recognize it as anything unique – it was simply a part of me. I grew up in the church and I confirmed my faith at Richland Lutheran Church, but like many people, wandered off path and made my home amongst the thorns of this world. I was so lost until 2001, when in a park in Redmond, WA I came to the cross and once again gave my life to Christ. I had always known the Book, but it was the Author who saved me. I began to share the Gospel – in formal and informal settings. I have been teaching a weekly Bible study at RLC, and many people have come to know God and are also sharing the Gospel as a result.

Now, believing God has called me to ordained ministry, I have applied and been accepted to the Calvary Chapel School of Ministry in Costa Mesa, California. In addition to learning how to be a church pastor, the two-year Pastoral Ministry Program will give me an opportunity to explore church planting, evangelism, and worldwide missions. God has affirmed this calling through His Word and His people. He has begun to make provisions as we know He will. In fact, I received a partial scholarship for tuition, and just learned yesterday of a private donor who is covering the remaining tuition and book costs covering the entire two-year program. Now we are selling many of our belongings to raise the money we need to make the move and sustain us for the first couple of months we are in California. Our timeframe is short, but our God is big. We have no doubt He will make this happen. We are praying that you are part of that plan. We will be leaving September 8. The move is going to cost about \$2,000. Right now, we plan to live with Sarah's mother for about six weeks unless other affordable housing surfaces. Not knowing exactly what might be possible, I am not certain what I am asking for.

I admit to being a little uncomfortable asking for help, but I have been encouraged to do so. This congregation has and will always hold a special place in my heart for so many reasons. I am so grateful for everything RLC has already done for my family and me. That will not change, regardless of your decision. And I know I can count on your prayers to sustain us in the future.

May the grace of God be with you all. Seth D. Peterson

Sheep May Safely Graze

In the spring of the year 2000, one of my daughters-in-law made me an offer I couldn't refuse: she'd pay my way, if I would accompany her husband, herself, and one other of my sons on a three-week trip to Great Britain. I prepped for the trip by reading over 14,000 pages of Celtic history! It was good preparation, because every inch of Great Britain *is* history. We stayed in bed and breakfasts wherever we went: London, Wales, the Lakes country, Edinburgh, etc. I've often wondered if my daughter-in-law regretted the trip. She planned it all; but we had to keep moving to get to all the sights packed into the plan. Unfortunately, her male companions all love history, so she had to prod us on from one sight to the next, or we'd probably *still* be over there pouring over sights and documents. She commented to us, she hadn't taken into account that the three of us were all history buffs. Our response was: it was questionable if we were three history buffs, but we were three buff historians! She failed to see the humor in that.

I've uncovered some history concerning this month's article title. The music is recognizable to many as authored by J.S. Bach. It's not uncommon to hear it in churches as a prelude, offertory, postlude or other special music. It's part of a secular cantata Bach wrote in 1713. "Sheep May Safely Graze" is an aria from that cantata; and the lyrics were written by Salomon Franck. The words are described as a "not-so-subtle reminder of what Franck felt good rulers *should* do."

He used the metaphor of a good shepherd keeping watch, providing a place where the sheep can safely graze, in order to speak of rulers governing well, providing the people serenity and peace. The Holy Bible, in **1 Timothy 2:2**, therefore enjoins *us* to pray *for* those in authority over us that such would be the outcome.

The border line between England and Scotland is an historical site known as "Hadrian's Wall"; a high, long, stone impediment running the width of the island; erected under the Roman emperor Hadrian because the Romans were unable to conquer the Picts and Scots in the north. My two sons (ages 26 and 32 at the time!) were busily running up and down the top of the wall pretending to re-enact the battles of the past; Anna and I were sitting and resting on some the remnant stones of the former Roman occupation. No one else was at the site. Except...sheep. Glorious, dumb, sheep. Peacefully grazing sheep. As I pondered the scene: Hadrian dead; the Roman Empire gone; the Picts unknown; the Wall no longer effective: I turned to her and declared, "The sheep won!"

Troubled world? Trouble in the space you occupy in it? Psalm 95:7: "...He is our God, and we are the people of His pasture, the flock under his care." "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." (John 10:11). Hebrews 13:20, 21: "...our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, equip you with everything good for doing His will...to whom be the glory for ever and ever. Amen." In Him is our peace. In Him, the sheep have won!

The American Heart Association and American Stroke Association remind us of the importance to seek medical attention immediately when a stroke occurs as every second counts because time lost results in brain loss.

Know these warning signs and share them with others:

- Sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body.
- Sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding.
- Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes.
- Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination.
- Sudden severe headache with no known cause.

If you or someone has one or more of these signs, don't delay! Call 911 or emergency medical services immediately. Check the time when the first symptoms appear. A clot-busting drug can be administered within the first three hours to reduce long term disability for the most common type of stroke.


