

### From Pastor Steve



#### **RLC in Mission for Christ: Truth Be Told**

"Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ." These words of the Apostle Paul directed originally to the church in Ephesus are perhaps some of the most profound instructions in all Scripture for becoming a healthy congregation.

Unfortunately they are also some of the most misunderstood and misused, misunderstood because they are taken out of context and misused because they are used inappropriately, most often because they were first taken out of context.

This passage occurs in the greater context of Paul's encouragement to the local congregation to "live a life worthy of the calling you have received." That is, to become the healthy church God wants them to become. A healthy church, again in this context, is one that is both united and mature in faith and life. Paul gives the encouragement to speak the truth in love, along with other behaviors, "So that, the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ." Without the goal of unity and maturity, speaking the truth in love, is misunderstood. Unfortunately many don't have the goal of unity and maturity when invoking this text. They have something else in mind.

When misunderstood apart from the contextual goal of the whole of Ephesians Chapter 4, unity and maturity within the body of Christ, this passage is often then misused. I might even say, abused. Have you ever heard someone preface a harsh comment or critical judgment with these words? Have you ever been shamed by someone using this text to support their shaming? When we use this text for any other purpose than to bring unity and maturity to the church we miss the point. Even truth spoken without love can harm and bring discord to the church. So, yes, speak truth, but don't forget the love which brings unity and maturity to the Body of Christ!



#### From the Council

It's December and the season of Advent is here. The focus of this season is the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ in his First Advent, and the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent. It is a celebration of truth about God, the revelation of God in Christ by which all of creation might be reconciled to God. Advent is marked by a spirit of hope, of expectation, of anticipation, of preparation, of longing, and of celebration.

This is my last article for the Preview as RLC President. It has been my honor and privilege to serve this congregation. I could not have done this job without your support and prayers. As I reflect on where RLC is now, it is a place of hope, a place where we celebrate the truth about God, and a place where we anticipate the return of Christ. In this season of hope, we remember God's promises and faithfulness. How do we respond to this? The sermon series in November has been about our faithfulness - in small things, in large things, and in all things. #### And Also With You

The title of this month's article is familiar to those attending Richland Lutheran. In the so-called *traditional*, or 8:30 a.m., Sunday service of worship, those very words are recited at least four times, forming a response to various initiating lines from the presider: 1) "The Peace of the Lord be with you" (*The Sharing of the Peace*); 2) "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all" (during *Praise and Proclamation*); 3) "The Lord be with you" (before the *Prayer of the Day*); and 4) "The Lord be with you" (as a part of *The Great Thanksgiving*). We also *imply* those words a fifth time, at the end of the service when the presider says, "Go in God's Peace. Shalom"; and we reply, "Shalom." Our "Shalom" utilizes the Hebrew word for peace in response to the presider's blessing, by indicating we too desire peace for/with that person - *and each other* - as we depart corporate worship, i.e., "And also with you." Something repeated five times in the service means it's important that we take note of it.

The first reciting of these words occurs after opening confession and absolution of our sins; and, we're quickly encouraged to "pass the peace" to one another. Some church liturgies (so-called "non-liturgical" churches have liturgies, too, but pride themselves on being "non-liturgical" - apparently ignorant of the meaning of "liturgy" referring to any order followed in worship) omit "passing of the peace", instead, conducting "greet your neighbor time". In such a service in the 90s (1990s that is - NOT my age), I walked up the aisle, greeting people, when a fellow stepped out from the pew in which he was residing, shook my hand and earnestly asked me, "Pastor, what's wrong with the Mariners?" I definitely prefer sharing Christ's peace with one another to that! "Passing the peace" is a Biblical practice of the Church since ancient times, carrying on Jewish tradition evidenced in Ruth 2:4. That it occurs after confession and absolution is proper. That it occurs prior to the communion celebration is sacredly wise: exchanging forgiveness and acceptance between us. It gives opportunity for you to participate at the table as someone in communion with Christ AND with one another. Otherwise you fall under the warning of 1 Corinthians 11:29: "...those who eat and drink without discerning the body of Christ eat and drink judgment on themselves." Paul uses the phrase "the body of Christ" here differently than in the rest of the communion passage; wanting us to know the congregation is the body of Christ; and that, in the passage's context: we must accept each other, extending sincere forgiveness for all real or perceived wrong(s) and differences between any of us: lest by failing to do so, you participate "in an unworthy manner" (v. 27) in the holy meal.

In the words of the angels in Luke 2:14: "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests." So, also may the peace of the Lord be with you! As for the Mariners? They're just being: the Mariners (sigh).

#### Advent Sermon Series



# Parish Health Ministry

The American Heart Association and American Stroke Association remind us of the importance of recognizing the warning signs and symptoms of a heart attack. Heart attacks often start slowly with mild pain and discomfort. Here are the signs that may indicate a heart attack is developing:

- Chest Discomfort most attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest and last more than a few minutes, or it may go away and come back. It can feel like an uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness of pain.
- Discomfort in other areas of the upper body this can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, back, neck, jaw or stomach.
- Shortness of breath this feeling often comes along with chest discomfort.
- Other signs may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness.


