Cornerstone Fund

The Guide and Vision adopted by the congregation in September 2013 is a vision of how we believe God would want Richland Lutheran Church and His people to change over the next five years. It emphasizes much more the character of how we believe God would want us to be than specific programs and activities. However, there is an objective regarding facilities, and the new capital fund is intended to address that need.

At the Annual Congregational Meeting in October, the congregation approved the establishment of a capital account for funding the development and implementation of a facilities strategic plan, and approved up to \$25,000 for an architect to prepare this plan during 2014. In order to ensure that our focus still remains on Jesus and not bricks and mortar, the new capital account has been named the Cornerstone Fund.

People have already begun to donate to this fund. At the time of this writing, \$4,106 has already been donated, and the RLC Foundation is matching every dollar donated by RLC members up to \$12,500. That seed money of \$25,000 is exactly what has been approved by the congregation for an architect to help us design facilities plan that will support and enhance ministries.

The Architect Selection Team will be making a recommendation to the Council in the near future. We are confident that the generosity of the congregation will make sure the resources are available when they are needed. Thank you for your faithfulness to God's ministry at and through Richland Lutheran Church.

DID YOU KNOW...You are welcome to stay at the communion rail after receiving communion for a time of meditation and reflection? Please don't be in a hurry to whisk through communion and miss the great opportunity to commune with Christ.

DID YOU KNOW...The Staff and Council of Richland Lutheran got together for a mini-retreat? Friday night, January 24, and Saturday, January 25, the Staff and Council met together to discuss how we work together to accomplish the ministry and mission of our congregation. Dr. Darrell Puls of Peacebridge Ministries worked through topics like, What are our

expectations, how do we best communicate, what constitutes good working relationships, what are the characteristics of biblical leaders, what are our roles and responsibilities, treating one-another with love and respect, etc. You are encouraged to pray for the Staff and Council as they work in ministry together.

DID YOU KNOW...A faithful group of about six folks gather every Wednesday night at seven forty-five in the sanctuary to pray together for Richland Lutheran Church and our ministry? We meet for about a half-hour to pray for people, ministries, programs, the community, and whatever else the Holy Spirit leads us to pray. DID YOU KNOW...That seventy years ago on the first Sunday in February 1944 the first worship service of Richland Lutheran Church, under the auspices of the National Lutheran Council, was held? Pastor Frank Carlson of Chicago led the congregation of twelve who met in the gym of Richland's Lewis and Clark Grade School. Pastor J. Milton Grimsrud, who a few months later would be assigned to

Richland Lutheran as pastor by the Defense Area Ministry, was in attendance as one of the twelve. Also in attendance was Sister Veda Johnson, a Deaconess of the Augustana Synod. Both Grimsrud and Johnson had been assigned to the Hanford Engineer Works by the Defense Area Ministry of the National Lutheran Council.

President's Perspectives

I write this the morning after the first Council meeting of the new year. A new year and a new Council, with new desires for a deepening partnership with our staff and the congregation's lay leaders in ministry. One of the new practices for the Council this year is to reserve a half-hour block of time to hear from one of our Ministry Teams each month so that we fully understand what they are trying to accomplish, where they have seen successes, where they have encountered challenges, and what kind of resources or help they still need.

Last night, Bob Thompson shared with us the ministry efforts of the Audio/Visual (A/V) Team. The A/V Team is somewhat unique in that it provides people and technology that support both the Good News Ministry television program and our weekly worship services. The Good News Ministry television program each week provides a shortened version of our 8:30 AM worship services to between 3,000 to 5,000 viewers. This is by far our broadest outreach to the community as well as providing a service to our shut-ins.

I'm sure you have noticed the many congregants serving by running the sound system and operating the TV cameras. What you may not have known about was the behind the scenes work of the people in the control room recording the input on Sunday and then the editors working on Mondays to select what was then sent on to the television station for broadcast. We truly owe a huge debt of gratitude to Ed Simonen who for years coordinated efforts, trained workers, and kept aging VHS equipment operational. Wayne Killand did a lot of the editing on those Mondays. Having filled in a few times, I know what a struggle it can be to cram a 26 minute sermon onto a tape representing the whole service that cannot exceed our televised total of 29.5 minutes.

Over the past couple of years the A/V team has converted the TV cameras and video to a high definition digital system, reinstalled the sound system, expanded the wireless microphones, installed a new audio mixer and built and installed a new sound cabinet. Bob Thompson personally spent hundreds of hours including taking personal vacation time to coordinate all of this and deserves our very deepest thanks. The upgrades cost over \$82,000 to date with most coming from the Good News Ministry Fund but also some key funds from Memorials. About \$60,000 to \$70,000 of work remains to be done and will be completed as funding becomes available.

In the meantime the A/V Ministry team needs more workers who either have technical computer skills or are willing to learn. Their wish list includes a production manager, video editing personnel, camera operators, a graphics and web content developer, and a DVD production manager. While the TV program is now in high definition the team would like to also reach a larger audience through live streaming of services over the internet and producing DVDs of services that could be distributed to people who are sick or on vacation.

It is common for churches to encourage a Biblical standard of tithing 10% of income to God. What about our time? Typically we define a full work week as forty hours. What if each of us was to tithe our time by giving four hours per week in God's service? Imagine what an impact that would have on advancing God's Kingdom in the world. Is God calling you to this ministry?

From the Council

"A man's heart plans his way, but the Lord directs his steps." Proverbs 16:9

Slouching Toward Jerusalem

English literature majors will "sort of" recognize this month's article title taken from W. B. Yeats' poem *The Second Coming.* He wrote the poem contextually in a time of the impending horrors of war, in which it seemed the end of the world was soon to appear. His actual ending lines wonder: "what rough beast, its hour come round at last, Slouches towards Bethlehem to be born." In other words, something earth-shaking was on its way, just as the Incarnation and birth of Jesus had been. Anyway, modern international analysts - recognizing the placement of Jerusalem in regard to the end times' conflagration - have frequently co-opted Yeats' words and substituted the line "Slouching Toward Jerusalem" as the armies and politics of the world center around that locale. I have another sort of slouching toward Jerusalem in mind for this article: using slouching for declining health, and Jerusalem for the end of life (i.e., heading toward the New Jerusalem.)

And I am slouching more and more as I age. While I was never the winner of the elementary school posture contest (anyone else remember those?): I find it ridiculous that, if the doctor's office is to be believed, I'm a full two inches less in stature than I was at the time I married Lady Elaine. You might say she's taken me down a peg or two; but in reality its just more of the ravages of age: compression of the spinal column and becoming less flexible and more stooped (stupid?) I've discovered it's easier to put one's socks on by rolling back on the bed and lifting your legs in the air as you do so, than to bend over and try to reach the floor. Another sign of my declension is: being more prone to frequent allergy-related sinus infections. It takes forever for the antibiotics to work these days. Some have suggested I have acupuncture done to relieve this. You can bet I'm on pins and needles contemplating that. My Chinese fortune cookie last weekend claimed, "You could prosper in the field of medicine." At this stage, the much more likely scenario is that the field of medicine will prosper from me!

Aging ones slouching toward their New Jerusalem, should consider T. S. Eliot's religious poem *Little Gidding*, which says,

"With the drawing of this Love and the voice of this Calling
We shall not cease from exploration
And the end of all our exploring
Will be to arrive where we started
And know the place for the first time."

Those lines also appear on a wall plaque at a national site on Highway 2 in Washington next to a photo of space exploration. Eliot also wrote lines in *Gerontion* (related to geriatrics and aging) which are helpful as we begin a new year: "In the juvescence of the year Came Christ the tiger." If in our experience Christ seems ineffective, Eliot reminds us that He's actually no slouch; but crouching like a tiger about to spring. Never forget our Risen Ascended Lord is Victor. Even over aging! In view of my extreme sinfulness, I fear the springing of Christ the tiger; but I know that "simply to Thy Cross I cling"; and therefore when He does spring for me - I'll be wrapped in the arms of Love! That'll be poetic justice.




