# Funding Our Future

**\*\*Important Update\*\***: We're closely approaching our first goal of raising \$12,500 to be matched by the RLC Foundation for a total of \$25,000 to hire an architectural firm to begin to develop a Facilities Strategic Plan for Richland Lutheran Church. As a model of generosity and commitment to our future ("putting our money where our mouth is"), the Richland Lutheran Congregation Council and Staff took a special offering and gave amongst themselves \$6,955 toward this important first step. To date the rest of the congregation has given \$3,811 for a total of \$10,766. Though we are near our first goal, there is still a long way to go. You, too, are encouraged to prayerfully consider showing your generosity and commitment to the future of Richland Lutheran Church by giving to the Cornerstone Fund. ## Financial Update

### <u> Financial Report – January 2014</u>

As reflected in the financial summary below, our financial results for January are off to a slow start. Our offerings are down \$(1,479) or 3.1% less than last year for the same period. Our expenses are up \$1,469 or 2.4% more than the same time last year. For the year, our offerings are below expenses by \$(17,627) compared to (\$14,679) in 2013, a change from last year of \$(2,948). These results are reflected in the columns titled "Prior Year Comparison".

For the year, actual offerings are below budget by \$(8,953) and actual expenses were under budget by \$(987).

As a reminder, this year's approved budget is 9.8% higher than last year's actual offerings. For your reference, our average planned offerings/income per week is approximately \$16,150. For the month of January, our actual weekly average of offerings/income was \$11,411.

## President's Perspective - Church Modifications

It had been many years since Richland Lutheran Church's facilities had a major updating. Then, in October of last year, the congregation took a significant step to changing that, when they authorized the creation of a Capital Fund Account to pay for church modifications.

The first step in the process was the selection of an architect to work with the congregation to develop a conceptual Facilities Strategic Plan to better meet the ministry needs of the church. A task force has been working for several months to select the right architect for this critical task. They have finished their job and you will see an article on pages 14-15 describing their process and choice. By the time you read this, the Council should have approved the task force's recommendation.

Now progress lies in your hands. The congregation approved raising and spending up to \$25,000 for the architect's work. The Richland Lutheran Foundation offered the congregation a matching grant for this purpose up to \$12,500, or half of the authorized cost. Our job now is to raise our half of the \$25,000. Your staff and Council have risen to this challenge to lead by example. Between the staff and Council almost \$7,000 has already been contributed, leaving only about \$5,500 to go. **Can you help**? Once we have the funds in hand the architects work can begin.

Can you imagine our church facilities with the following changes?

- **Sanctuary** A vastly improved traffic flow to ease leaving the sanctuary after services. Enhanced lighting and dramatically improved sound quality.
- **Narthex** A larger narthex accommodating 200 people comfortably and with improved traffic flow from the narthex to other areas of the church. A more inviting narthex with more natural light and higher ceilings. A secretary or reception office attached to help visitors find our staff or meeting spaces. Multi-person restrooms near the narthex.
- **Parking** Increased parking capacity on-site for at least 130 cars.
- **Chapel** A soundproofed chapel so it can be used for meetings or Sunday School classes while musicians are practicing in the sanctuary.
- **Prince of Peace** Capacity to accommodate 300 seated people for a meal. Improved ability to break up the room into smaller temporary spaces for simultaneous multiple meetings. A larger and more functional kitchen including expanded storage space and improved sanitation.
- **Education Wings** Meeting areas for at least three groups of ten or more. A larger and more secure nursery by locating it closer to the sanctuary.
- **Office Space-** Elimination of our "hidden" main offices and more efficient space for our staff by consolidating offices in one central location. Visitors able to easily find the main office and the Lead Pastor.

These are just a few of the changes desired and as you can imagine it will take major changes to the middle portion of our facilities. But how exciting to contemplate being able to use such a facility for our existing and some totally new ministries. Help us take the first step by paying for the architect and then stand by for the future of Richland Lutheran Church.

# Our Journey of Faith, Hope and Love

Nearly a year ago, six of us accepted a challenge. It seemed straightforward enough at the start -- select an architect to help RLC develop a Facilities Strategic Plan, one that would guide future facility improvements in an orderly manner and be supportive of our vision, mission, and long range plan. And it seemed doable in fairly short order, considering the team. Everyone had experience funding, managing, maintaining, building, or improving church facilities. We were cheerful as we prayed for guidance that first night.

Initially, we were led to complete an assessment of our facilities. It outlined the history, strengths, and weaknesses of our facilities. The document was designed to be given to the architect so the firm could better understand our current conditions. It all seemed so logical. But the assessment raised *far* more questions than provided answers -- and most of the questions couldn't be addressed without professional help. How structurally sound *are* our existing facilities? Would it be more cost effective to remodel or tear down and rebuild certain portions of them? How much *could* we remodel without having to bring everything up to code? Would it be more cost-effective to build a new facility nearby or make extensive remodels to our existing structures? Should the Facilities Strategic Plan be phased? If so, over how much time, and placing which needs first? What qualifications should we look for when selecting an architectural firm to help us sort through all of this? We took some deep breaths and prayed that we would find ways to simplify the complexities.

We were led to an experienced, retired architect who spoke frankly and informally with us. By the end of that meeting, we at least knew what we were looking for -- an innovative firm, respected in the building industry, with processoriented capabilities, preferably local and accessible, skilled at nurturing relationships and managing a large-scale project, committed to Christ, and experienced when remodeling churches. So we identified architectural firms of interest, whittled our list down to six, sent out Request for Proposal packets, prayed that the right people would answer, and waited.

With three of the six firms responding affirmatively, we arranged and conducted tours of RLC for them then began reviewing and discussing submitted proposals. Due to professional conflicts of interest, this was as far as one of our members could go in the selection process. And so it came to pass, that five of us were led to two dynamic local architectural firms. We conducted interviews with them and prayed for clarity of choice.

But the choice was not clear, and we were determined that our decision would be unanimous. Four of us agreed that one firm stood out above the other. One member had reservations. No matter how long or how passionately we discussed the matter, we could not reach consensus. We added patience and perseverance to our prayers.

We were led to visit two churches remodeled by the favored architectural firm -- one in Othello and one in Walla Walla. We spoke with church representatives about their experience, and we saw firsthand the fruits of their labor. We had weather, holidays, illnesses, and work schedules to juggle; but it was important that *we all* attend the visits. The churches were really nice, and the spokespersons were knowledgeable, kind, and helpful; but the visits did not address one important issue. Neither church used the architect in the process-oriented manner we believed RLC needed. We learned a lot, but we were no closer to a decision. We prayed for direction.

Direction came in the form of one more church visit. A Richland church seemed to have used the architectural firm the way we envisioned. We listened intently as the pastor walked us through his experiences with the architect. His remarks were exactly what we needed to hear. Bethel had used the architect in a process-oriented way -- to help its congregation assess the community and the needs of the community then conceptualize a phased design for their new facilities in Prosser. The church, which is already under construction, is directly aligned with and supportive of Bethel's vision and mission. We poured over drawings and handouts produced by the architect. We asked a wide range of questions and received the answers we were looking for. The trust Bethel had in this architect left quite an impression on all of us. It was a trust built over time and based on the success of two other ventures. Before driving away, we agreed to meet the following week.



As we sat around our familiar meeting table February 11, it was with faith, hope, love, and tremendous respect for the Lord and one another. We had come a long way. When we voted this time, it was unanimous. We recommended that night that our church council employ the services of Meier Architecture and Engineering to help RLC develop a Facilities Strategic Plan. Our prayers were joyful -- sincere expressions of thanks and praise for a successful journey.

If all goes according to plan, a building committee will be selected in the near future. These individuals will work with Meier to develop a Facilities Strategic Plan that suits our needs.

It will take time and a lot of input to develop the plan. But you can be sure, if we are patient with one another and find ways to go forth together, we will all grow and benefit from this effort. And most importantly, we will have new and improved ways to spread Christ's message.

The Prince of Peace update completed in 2013 is symbolic of what we can do if we work together and follow God's lead. It was completed on a shoe-string budget, by a small group of dedicated members, who saw that God's "house" was slipping into disrepair. On several occasions, our forward motion was slowed and/or altered to maintain unity. The update is not perfect, but it will serve us well until professionals can make sorely needed improvements.



The update is also a pleasant reminder of RLC's historically progressive nature. We have been a leader in this community since our inception. Our little white Grange Hall was one of the first churches in Richland. Worship services were held in our modern new Prince of Peace while our unique and beautiful new sanctuary was being built. Back and forth construction has gone through the years. The energy of our members produced some of the largest Sunday schools and Vacation Bible Schools in the Tri-Cities and supported all kinds of other church activities. In fact, that is one of the things that struck us most during our first two church visits -- how active our congregations is. Our church is in constant use -- day and night. Our wear is well earned!

So as I close, I would like to leave you with this message of inspiration. Exciting times lie ahead! And they are just as exhilarating and promising as those RLC's last

generation experienced. I encourage you to listen, to learn, to find ways to become involved when opportunities arise! Contribute funds. Volunteer to be on a committee. Attend group information meetings. Provide suggestions. Become a part of the movement that helps others *turn to Christ at RLC*!


