Financial Update

<u> Financial Report – February 2014</u>

As reflected in the financial summary below, our financial results through February are similar to our financial results in 2013. Our offerings are down \$(1,479) or 1.3% less than last year for the same period. Our expenses are down \$(9,007) or 6.7% less than the same time last year. For the year, our offerings are below expenses by \$(25,580) compared to (\$33,222) in 2013, a change from last year of \$7,642. These results are reflected in the columns titled "Prior Year Comparison".

For the year, actual offerings are below budget by \$(15,105) and actual expenses were under budget by \$(4,142). As a reminder, this year's approved budget is 9.8% higher than last year's actual offerings. For your reference, our average planned offerings/income per week is approximately \$16,150. Through the month of February, our actual weekly average of offerings/income was \$12,497.

Jefferson Elementary School Tutoring Program

The "2013 Guide and Vision" challenges Richland Lutheran Church to provide opportunities for everyone to use their time, talents, spiritual gifts, and material possessions to love others in our community and around the world by meeting their needs.

One meaningful response is the Jefferson Elementary School Tutoring Program. Since beginning a little over three years ago, volunteers from Richland Lutheran Church and other local churches have donated more than 1300 hours tutoring second, third and fourth grade Jefferson students in reading. And, this school year, they will donate nearly 500 additional volunteer hours.

The program has yielded positive results. Ann Brandes, program coordinator, reported to the RLC Council at the regular February meeting that test scores of the students participating in the program have shown improvements that are "well over typical growth" for students in their grade level for the past two school years; and that most have been able to meet grade level expectations. Beyond their participation in the tutoring program, she said that several of the students have taken advantage of other Richland Lutheran Church programs, among them, the annual block party, regular worship services, Vacation Bible School and Good News Today broadcasts.

Ms. Brandes noted that Jefferson Elementary School has identified additional students who would also benefit so there is always a need for more volunteer tutors. She said that small volunteer commitment (less than an hour for each of two mornings a week) will reward not only the student, but the tutor as well.

President's Perspectives - Council Progress

Have you ever sat in on a Congregational Council meeting? Meetings focused on policies and budgets can get just a bit boring. But with this year's first quarter just finished in March we have seen some exciting and meaningful progress being made.

Music and Worship - During our March meetings we approved a job offer to **Joseph Farrar** to serve as our new Director of Music and Worship and he has accepted. That position has been vacant since April of 2013, and we look forward to his arrival on May 1. In addition to leading the blended service on Saturday night he will direct the Chancel Choir at the 8:30 am service and lead contemporary worship at the 11:00 am service. We will continue to hire a person to play the organ at our 8:30 am service and for weddings and funerals. Our thanks again to the Search Committee of **Jim Honeyman**, **Paul Armatis**, **Eunice Weible**, **Lisa Corning**, **and Sarah Hagensen** along with **Pastor Steve**. They are the ones who did all the work and made Council's job so easy.

Architect Decision - Council also approved contracting with Meier as our architect for developing a Facilities Strategic Plan that will give us options for modifying our facilities to better meet our ministry needs. We only need another \$1,700 to meet our goal of \$25,000 for this part of the long-range plan. Help if you can. Our next step will be to finalize the architect's scope of work and pull together the team that will work with the architect and construction contractors over the next four to seven years. They will then seek your thoughts on setting priorities for changes. Our thanks go to the Architect Selection Committee of **Bob Thompson**, **Karin Nickola**, **Dave Brandes**, **Jay Dixon**, **Rich Siefken**, and **Debbie Stankovich** for their diligent work in recommending the architect.

Ministry Teams - Over the past three months we have also had an in depth monthly presentation on a Ministry Team. The three we have had thus far are the **Audio/Visual Team**, the **Jefferson Tutoring Team**, and the **Visitation Ministry Team**. I wish all of you could have the opportunity to hear what is going on in our church and community because of these dedicated team members. You can feel their passion as they talk about those being helped and the needs that still remain because the workers are too few. If you would like to get involved in a ministry area let the staff or a Council member know. We can put you in touch with the right person to make it happen.

It's About Time!

Daylight Savings Time (D.S.T.) has returned. I've heard the annual grumble about it from the Missus. *She's* the early riser in our home: getting up at 4:30 AM weekdays to go to the track at Chief Joseph Middle school and walk three miles. Many occasions she'll top it off by driving over to Badger Mountain in order to scale its heights, and then phone her husband to get him out of bed (!) before she drives back to prepare breakfast. The reason she grumbles about D.S.T. is, once the sun has finally gotten to the point where she can walk the track in a bit of sunrise, the clocks get set ahead an hour, and she finds herself walking in darkness again. *I* don't grumble about that. *I* grumble about those phone calls calling for me to get my day started as she's leaving the mountain! This leads to theological questions: *Should* a Christian walk in darkness? And; "Lord, why do so many (cheery) morning persons end up married to (grumpy) non-morning persons?

Despite *that* conundrum, time marches on. The best measure of that is to note one's baby is now 40 years of age; one's oldest grandchild is now in her 20's; and the youngest has reached the ripe old age of 10 months. Is *this* why we often look at them in the toddler stage and wish we could just sort of "freeze" them in cuteness? If *they're* not getting any older, then perhaps *we're* not getting any older? Well, spring has sprung. We've just returned from a visit to the generations succeeding us. The 10-month-old has a 27-month-old brother now fully mobile and talkative. This elder brother kept walking into the room proclaiming, "Hey, guys! Let's play baseball!" It's a reminder spring training is in full swing and (by the time you read this) the new season will have officially begun. Every fan knows at this time of year that hope springs eternal.

Remember when you first heard Jesus was going to return? Recall how excited you were about that? But - if you were in your teens or 20's - there were some caveats you might have considered. Come again, Jesus, but wait until I get: married/my degree/a career/children/grandchildren/that trip I've always wanted/my great retirement plans experienced and fulfilled. Be honest, we've all played this game, haven't we? I even added a few. Let me see Nebraska win a national title in football (well, ok, God is good, I've experienced that one several times); I'd like the Seahawks to win the Superb Owl (whoops, the end must be near). I'd like to see the Mariners with the World Series (Jesus' return could be delayed a *long* time before *that* happens!). 
