

Financial Update

As reflected in the financial summary below, our financial results through April are similar to our financial results in 2013. Our offerings are down \$(15,730) or 6.6% less than last year for the same period. Our expenses are down \$(24,261) or 9.5% less than the same time last year. For the year, our offerings are below expenses by \$(17,408) compared to (\$25,939) in 2013, a change from last year of \$8,532. These results are reflected in the columns titled "Prior Year Comparison".

For the year, actual offerings are below budget by \$(36,242) and actual expenses are under budget by \$(18,339).

As a reminder, this year's approved budget is 9.8% higher than last year's actual offerings. For your reference, our average planned offerings/income per week is approximately \$16,150. Through the month of April, our actual weekly average of offerings/income is \$13,976, or (\$2,174) under plan per week.

President's Perspectives - Justice for the Oppressed

Learn to do right; seek justice. Defend the oppressed. Take up the cause of the fatherless; plead the case of the widow. – Isaiah 1:17 (NIV)

"So I will come to put you on trial. I will be quick to testify against sorcerers, adulterers and perjurers, against those who defraud laborers of their wages, who oppress the widows and the fatherless, and deprive the **foreigner**s among you of justice, but do not fear me," says the Lord Almighty. – Malachi 3:5 (NIV)

This is what the Lord says: "Do what is just and right. Rescue from the hand of the oppressor the one who has been robbed. Do no wrong or violence to the **foreigner**, the fatherless or the widow, and do not shed innocent blood in this place." – Jeremiah 22:3 (NIV)

I have always felt a deep compassion for those less fortunate including those without adequate shelter, food, or medical treatment. But I believe God has been also speaking to me over the past couple of years about those who do not receive justice in our community. Most often God speaks to me through his Word. The three verses above are only samples of where he commands us to provide justice to the oppressed and especially the foreigner among us. In just a quick search, I found at least twenty-seven verses where God expects us to treat foreigners as well as ourselves. Biblical patriarchs or prophets including Moses, David, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Zechariah, and Malachi all tell us this.

Sometimes God speaks to us through other people; and for this issue, one who has spoken to me is my wife Carol. Carol has a deep compassion for those suffering injustice in our society. She has subscribed to newsletters about Hispanics who are mistreated and seek justice. She has also renewed annually a membership in the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People and we have attended at least one of their local banquets.

Most of us live in either Benton or Franklin counties. Franklin County's population is over half Hispanic, nearly 1 in 4 were foreign born, and 47% speak a language other than English while at home. Benton County is over 19% Hispanic with almost 18% speaking a language other than English while at home. Thus we come in contact with foreigners almost every day.

All of us, I'm sure, were shocked when almost three hundred school girls were abducted from their school recently in Nigeria and threatened to be sold. But we are much less aware I think of the volume of human trafficking for sex and the human trafficking for "slave" labor right in our own communities. A recent report from the Washington State Office of the Attorney General reported the following:

- Human trafficking is the fastest growing criminal industry in the world today. This form of modern day slavery is tied with arms as the second largest international criminal industry behind drug dealing.
- Washington's Task Force against Trafficking of Persons reports our state is a hotbed for the recruitment, transportation and sale of people for labor.

Richland Lutheran Church has worked at reaching out to the poor through Block Parties, the Union Gospel Mission, Habitat for Humanity, 2nd Harvest, etc. But I am not aware of our doing much to seek social justice for the oppressed and for foreigners. That was why I supported adding a goal on social justice to the recently approved Long Range Plan and advocated a goal in the 2014 Ministry Plan to "Focus on local social justice issues of Hispanic non-citizens in the Tri-Cities." Coming to a consensus on positions to take on social issues that involve legislation can be tricky for a church and I do not know enough about the issues or proposed solutions to know what I would support. So I am hoping that as a first step we can hold an event this year in which we could learn and ask questions about the needs and injustices in our communities. By being better informed we can then each individually take some step or action to obey God's command to us that we seek justice for the oppressed.

Patience, Patients

If you're reading this column in the June 2014 issue of the *Preview*, it can be attributed to: 1) the grace of God, and; 2) the patience of Ms. Kelly, the assistant in Pastor Steve's office. A word (or more) of explanation is in order regarding item number 2 in the previous sentence. Each month, the staff is dutifully notified by Ms. Kelly that their upcoming month's Preview articles are due to her, on or by the 15th of the current (preceding) month. A word of confession: each month, I strain my positive relationship with Ms. Kelly, by (habitually) getting this article to her past the deadline. Previously, I've resorted to bribery (if pieces of candy submitted with my late article constitute bribery) and attempts to get her to lighten up (fake excuse letters from my - long deceased - Mother, asking Ms. Kelly to forgive her son David because of his - non-existent - dog having eaten his article.) So far, it's worked! What a gal! Does this first paragraph of this month's article sound like I'm trying to butter her up because I'm once again late to the party? Hey, surely I'm too old to be able to stoop to such methods, aren't I? Anyway, if you're reading this in the JULY *Preview*, you'll know that I've finally gone too far; and I wouldn't want you to think unkindly of her.

As to number 1 in the previous paragraph: *anything* I manage to accomplish is owing to the grace of God. This article (whenever it might appear) is no exception, in view of my - once again - having been stricken with a bout of kidney stones just prior to the deadline date. Disclosure: my urologist initially informed me of a significant stone in my kidney; the next time I saw him he referred to it as a moderately large stone. At the rate he was downgrading it, I expected him to tell me at the last that I had a grain of sand. But I'm a wimp when it comes to the pain of kidney stones; and so, I had the stone crushed (it was a blast!); and at this writing I appear to be on the road to recovery - until the dreaded next stone(s) occur.

I feel like my Old Testament namesake, who had to pick up "*five smooth stones from the stream*" as he went to slay Goliath in **1 Samuel 17:40**. Each of us has their own personal Goliath with which to do battle continuously or occasionally. A Goliath might be: physical, situational, moral, emotional, mental, relational or spiritual. One or more of these likely apply to you, too. The imagery of life and/or church life as a hospital, is long-standing and ancient. Every one of us is a patient confronted with Goliath(s). As a fellow patient, allow me these insights: 1) *however* long and painful the encounter *and* recovery is, we are intended to learn, grow and mature in and through them; 2) therefore, the *length* of the injury and recuperation process isn't the *real* question (it will take as long as it takes to learn the lesson(s) intended for us), and; 3) it would not be good - or healthful - for us to have an instantaneous recovery *without* learning what God's allowing and building into us (rather it'd be even more injurious!). So, fellow patients: have patience in suffering Goliath (**James 5:7-11**). Oh, and thank you Lord...and Ms. Kelly.

Mission Trip to Lodge Grass, Montana

Nine of our high school youth and four adults will be making the trip to Lodge Grass, Montana, once again this month to spend a week working on the Crow Indian Reservation with Youth Works. Our group will have the opportunity to do much needed service work at homes on the reservation: typically exterior painting, minor repairs, and/or yard work. They will also spend a couple of days helping to run Kids Club, a program similar to VBS, for the children on the reservation, as well as a sports camp for teens.





There will be opportunities to learn about the Crow Nation and culture when they visit a care facility in Crow

Agency, Little Bighorn Battlefield, and spend time with one of the men on the reservation who enjoys teaching the groups about teepees, sweat lodges, arrow throwing, and the traditions of his people.


