

**Sunday school begins September 7** for kids age 3 years old through high school! We'll gather in the Prince of Peace fellowship area at 9:45 AM to meet our teachers, complete registration forms, and enjoy some refreshments.

Each week, the children will gather in their classrooms to explore the Bible, sing songs, and build their relationship with Jesus.

This year, the preschool and elementary children will be using the Spark Lectionary series curriculum. The 5th graders will be following a preconfirmation curriculum developed for our needs. The middle school students will be using studies especially crafted for a variety of topics pertaining to living life as a young adult in our world today. And based on a recommendation from the recent long-range plan, the high school class will be studying from the "original curriculum" – the Bible!

The RLC Sunday school follows the age guidelines used by the local school districts. Children should be age 3 by Aug. 31, 2014 to begin Sunday school and should attend the class that matches their school grade level.

Adult Sunday school classes will resume on September 14 in the Friendship Room with Pastor Dave Hogan.

This year's children's Sunday school offerings will be designated towards a ministry the kids are readily familiar with — Operation Christmas Child! The weekly offerings will be designated to help with the shipping fee for the anticipated 300 boxes Richland Lutheran Church will prepare this year. In years past, the Sunday school offerings have been designated towards things like filling an "ark" of animals through Heifer International so that impoverished villages would have a sustainable means of living through livestock and towards the building of a playground in Mafraq, Jordan. As Operation Christmas Child at RLC has flourished into a year-round ministry, the children have developed a hands-on, on-going relationship by the filling of "shoeboxes" with gifts. This will help build a sense of financial stewardship by sharing their nickels and dimes in addition to the toys and school supplies they would enjoy themselves.

# **Financial Update**

#### <u> Financial Report – July 2014</u>

As reflected in the financial summary below, our financial results through July are reflecting a positive trend compared to our financial results in 2013. Our offerings are up \$15,609 or 3.8% higher than last year for the same period. Our expenses are down \$(12,149) or 2.6% less than the same time last year. For the year, our offerings are below expenses by \$(21,579) compared to (\$49,336) in 2013, a change from last year of \$27,757. These results are reflected in the columns titled "Prior Year Comparison".

For the year, actual offerings are below budget by \$(24,317) and actual expenses are under budget by \$(32,730).

As a reminder, this year's approved budget is 9.8% higher than last year's actual offerings. For your reference, our average planned offerings/income per week is approximately \$16,150. Through the month of July, our actual weekly average of offerings/income is \$14,253, or (\$1,897) under plan per week.

## **President's Perspectives - Discipleship**

A person I have grown to respect is Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the German Lutheran pastor who left safety in America to return to Germany near the beginning of World War II to help encourage those in the church who were unwilling to put Hitler first in their lives. Last year I read again Bonhoeffer's book, "*The Cost of Discipleship*." Hear some of the things he was writing to his church brethren:

Jesus summons men to follow him not as a teacher or a pattern of the good life, but as the Christ, the Son of God. When we are called to follow Christ, we are summoned to an exclusive attachment to his person. Besides Jesus, nothing has significance. He alone matters.

Jesus' summons to the rich young man was calling him to die, because only the man who is dead to his own will can follow Christ. Jesus says that every Christian has his own cross waiting for him, a cross destined and appointed by God. The cross is laid on every Christian. The first Christ-suffering which every man must experience is the call to abandon the attachments of this world.

Is there some part of your life which you are refusing to surrender at his behest, some sinful passion, maybe, or some animosity, some hope, perhaps your ambition or your reason? If so, you must not be surprised that you have not received the Holy Spirit, that prayer is difficult, or that your request for faith remains unanswered.

The Bible never draws the antithesis between faith and good works so sharply as to maintain that good works undermine faith. There is no faith without good works, and no good works apart from faith.

Pastor Ernst in his sermon on August 17<sup>th</sup> told us that to ensure that we are not misled by any spiritual leader we must judge what they say by what the scripture says. So what does the scripture and in particular what does Jesus say about discipleship?

"Anyone who loves his father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; anyone who loves his son or daughter more than is not worthy of me; and anyone who does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me." – Matthew 10:37-38.

"If anyone comes to me and does not hate his father and mother, his wife and children, his brothers and sisters – yes even his own life – he cannot be my disciple. And anyone who does not carry his cross and follow me cannot be my disciple." – Luke 14:26-27.

"In the same way, any of you who does not give up everything he has cannot be my disciple." – Luke 14:33.

So what is Jesus saying here? First he is saying that to be his disciple we must love him more than any other person whether parents, children or spouse. Our love for him is to be so much greater than for others in our lives that in comparison it is even as we "hated" them. (He is not, of course, saying that we should hate anyone.) We must love him even to the extent of being willing to give up our lives to follow him. We are to love him more than anything we possess or desire in this world.

Regrettably we find it too hard or become complacent in our discipleship and often don't put Jesus first. When conflicts come for our use of money and His needs we put our desires and pleasures first. When He asks for some of our time we are reluctant to do so because we want to pursue success in our careers, enjoy our sports, and use our time on what we enjoy.

I was impressed when my mother's church in Salem, Oregon, for 2014 asked that as a minimum each member give 10% of their money to God's ministry and four hours each week in doing ministry. Imagine what a difference it would make if Richland Lutheran Church members were to agree to this small step in discipleship. Our church and the community would be changed.

Many of our ministries are not as successful as we would want because we do not have enough volunteers. One of the staff's goals for this year was to have every Ministry Team led by a lay person

# **Static Cling**

Our title utilizes an advertising phrase for products which purport to reduce/eliminate "static cling." They've been on the market long enough that the phrase has crept into American English idiom. You've immediately begun to think I'm going to build toward an idea of something that will prevent: our pant cuff from sticking halfway up the sock on our calf; or, the hem of our dress embarrassingly failing to hang properly, instead hung up somewhere higher on one's hosiery or undergarment. "Static cling" also conjures up images of either toilet paper, or a dryer sheet, peeking out of our pant leg or dress. If the dryer sheet is the culprit, it gives the lie to the idea that it'll reduce/eliminate "static cling." The term means: (according to Webster, to whom I was introduced by my Dad when I'd ask him for a spelling or definition, and he'd reply, "I have a friend named Webster...") the sense in which electricity produces "stationary electrical charges, as those resulting from friction." It's from the main definition of the word "static", referring to "bodies, masses or forces at rest or in equilibrium: opposed to DYNAMIC."

Elaine and I used to regularly attend University of Nebraska at Omaha's college wrestling matches. They won the small college national title while we lived there. Once they had an exhibition match with Campus Crusade for Christ's "Athletes in Action." A UNO wrestler named Bruce Strauss was pitted against a recent Olympic and national champion. Despite being virally ill, Bruce performed anyway - fighting to a draw entering the last period. His opponent couldn't get out from under him in that period, while Bruce was on top. He defeated a superior opponent being awarded what they call "riding points." When it was over, the referee tried to get the two wrestlers separated, but couldn't. Bruce had passed out, desperately hanging on. You might say, he was statically clinging. They actually had to pry them apart! It's like listening to a Saturday NWPR program entitled *Inland Folk* hosted at WSU by Dan Maher (blind from birth). Listeners are familiar with hourly station breaks during his three-hour program. The audience is implored when entering a break to: *"Hang on! Hang on!"* 

Actually, we *all* have some embarrassingly shameful t.p. peeking out from beneath the façade we present to the world and one another: and the exposure beneath that façade is creeping up on us. The *only* way we can rectify this is to "Hang on! Hang on! Hang on!" to Jesus. It's best exhibited in Scripture in **Genesis 32:22-32** where Jacob wrestles with Yahweh, and *will not let go* until He will bless him. A spiritual limp will be the sign of it; eternal blessedness the proof. Terminally sick in sin, we must statically cling to the Lord in order to be at rest. As the old hymn line says: "*Nothing in my hand I bring, simply to Thy Cross I cling.*" God isn't fighting us; we cling to Him by faith - our riding points. Will you and I determine to persever to the end with Christ? I don't know about you, but *this* sin-sick soul intends to cling to Him until I remain at rest. You couldn't pry me loose!

and not a paid staff member. Of the twenty Ministry Teams identified in the 2014 Annual Ministry Plan only seven had lay leaders identified at the beginning of the year.

Do you want to be a disciple of Jesus? Start by meditating daily on the scripture to learn more about God and what he commands us each to do. Pray daily for His guidance and for the needs of others. Be alert to those around you who need spiritual, emotional, or physical help. Ask our staff how you can get started in ministry. Let your life be all about Jesus.


