Sing All by Joseph Farrar

I grew up in the Methodist tradition. The founder of Methodism, John Wesley, was the brother of hymn writer Charles Wesley, whose hymns are sung by many Christian churches of all denominations, including ours. Because of the things we value at Richland Lutheran Church, I believe the Wesleys would be right at home in our worship services, perhaps, I dare say, more than many modern United Methodist Churches.

In a 1761 edition of "Select Hymns," John Wesley committed to paper his "Directions for Singing." There are seven of them, and though I may write later on the others, I'm going to highlight two of them for you today.

III. Sing all. See that you join with the congregation as frequently as you can. Let not a single degree of weakness or weariness hinder you. If it is a cross to you, take it up, and you will find it a blessing.

Beloved Church, allow me to exhort you and encourage you. No matter what worship service you attend, no matter what you believe your vocal ability to be, whether or not you know the song very well (that's why we sing several verses), whether or not you even LIKE to sing, LIFT UP YOUR VOICE! The more you do it, the better you will become at it, the better you will know the songs, and the more you will enjoy it. It will INDEED become a blessing. Men, I'm especially looking at you here. Our culture squashes men from participating in music and other arts when they are young, convincing them that it is somehow... unmasculine. When a group of men lift up their voices in song together (as you have the opportunity to do on our current setting of "This Is The Feast," I can't think of anything that is more manly.

IV. Sing lustily and with good courage. Beware of singing as if you were half dead, or half asleep; but lift up your voice with strength. Be no more afraid of your voice now, nor more ashamed of its being heard, then when you sung the songs of Satan.

As a friend of mine used to say, "If you can't say 'Amen', then say, 'OUCH!" Again, I implore you, beloved of God to "Lift up your voice with strength." I came to a great realization when I lived in New Orleans. God was working on me regarding how I felt about how some display their emotional response in worship. I was definitely judgemental about some of these things. During Mardi Gras one year, it dawned on me that here are hundreds of thousands of people (including me) lifting their hands and voices up to a float made of paper and paint with excitement to receive a nearly worthless strand of plastic beads, yet I would judge someone about how excited they were to receive what we have to receive from Jesus

Financial Report - August 2014

As reflected in the financial summary below, our financial results through August are reflecting a positive trend compared to our financial results in 2013. Our offerings are up \$13,422 or 2.9% higher than last year for the same period. Our expenses are down \$(6,227) or 1.2% less than the same time last year. For the year, our offerings are below expenses by \$(27,169) compared to (\$46,818) in 2013, a change from last year of \$19,649. These results are reflected in the columns titled "Prior Year Comparison".

For the year, actual offerings are below budget by \$(45,598) and actual expenses are under budget by \$(38,976).

As a reminder, this year's approved budget is 9.8% higher than last year's actual offerings. For your reference, our average planned offerings/income per week is approximately \$16,150. Through the month of August, our actual weekly average of offerings/income is \$13,817, or (\$2,333) under plan per week.

From the Council

October is here! The beginning of fall is upon us as well as the annual congregational meeting. Members of the congregation council and staff have been meeting over the past few months developing and prayerfully considering the operating budget for 2015. This can be a challenging time, because no one really knows what our offerings and tithes will be in the upcoming year. It is a time when we need to trust God for wisdom and faith that he will meet all our needs.

Throughout scripture, it teaches us about being a joyful and generous giver as well as the benefits we receive from giving. Giving is really more of an attitude toward life than it is a specific act at one time or another. God has created us to be givers. It isn't something we have to do in order to please him so much as its something we need to do to keep us healthy. We are healthy and whole when we are both giving and receiving. When we give, we are simply reflecting God's image – he who gave everything!

St Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 9:6-8 "Remember this – a farmer who plants only a few seeds will get a small crop, but the one who plants generously will get a generous crop. You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. 'For God loves a person who gives cheerfully'. And God will generously provide all you need. Then you will always have everything you need and plenty left over to share with others."

RLC Foundation Purpose

The purpose of the RLC Foundation is to undertake new ministries which otherwise would not be possible within the fiscal limits of the regular church budget. The RLC Foundation receives, administers, invests, and supervises distribution of such funds through enduring endowments, the result of giving over and above the pledging and tithing of the congregation to the regular church budget. Gifts may be made in many other forms: gifts through wills, transfers in trust, gift annuities, life insurance, life and income trusts, stocks, bonds, real estate and personal property.

Donors to United Way may designate the RLC Foundation to receive their gift. Also, Thrivent Members can designate Thrivent Choice distributions for the RLC Foundation. Thus, if the desire to give is present, almost anyone can share in making the Foundation a more effective organization in carrying out the mission and ministry of our Lord – now and in the future.

The RLC Foundation Seeded Ministries include radio programs, the neighborhood ministry program (the block party), Jefferson Elementary Tutoring program and jump starting the RLC Long Range Planning Committee's Architectural Fund with matching funds among many others. The RLC Foundation is there to seed new ministries in our church.

Presidents' Perspectives - The Annual Meeting

In the next few days you should see copies of the agenda and background information for the **Congregation's Annual Meeting** scheduled for **Sunday**, **October 26**. This is going to be a meeting where you will learn both where we have been this past year but even more important where we believe God is leading us for the next year. Get this on your calendars now! You won't want to miss this event.

Hear what the Staff and Council have to say in their reports about how 2014 has gone as well as getting an update on our finance.

Get an update on progress from the Facilities Building Committee. Two meetings have been held for the Congregation to give the committee your ideas of what needs to be changed to make our facilities more effective for ministry. Work has been ongoing since then to compile a prioritized list of those changes.

Get an update on progress toward the goals of the Guide and Vision, our long range plan. Council last month approved a few changes which you will also hear about.

You approved changes in our Constitution last year and they now need to be ratified by a second affirmative vote to make them effective. In addition, we have a few new minor proposed changes for your consideration as well as an important change to give flexibility to the Council to draw on operating reserve funds should a urgent need come up during the year that we didn't anticipate.

You will get to vote on your leadership as we add members to the Nominating Committee and to the Council membership.

We will look to our future as we consider a proposed Annual Ministry Plan for 2015 and a budget to support it.

We will be asking for your approval to use operating fund reserves to pay for a needed professional audit of the church's finances. This has been recommended by our internal Audit Committee.

The last item I want to make you aware of is the Audit Committee has recommended that the Congregation make a definite decision on whether to continue or drop plans for an off-site retreat center. No progress has been made on the retreat center for several years and input we are now getting from you suggests that we should consider instead an urban retreat center within our facilities in Richland. Should you decide to not proceed with the off-site retreat center then Richland Lutheran Church will return the money you have donated or ask if you are willing to repurpose it for the remodeling/construction of our facilities here.



It's Taken Me a Long Time to Look This Good

Readers of this column (your feedback tells me that there are some), might remember the character "Fonzie" from the TV sitcom, *Happy Days*. Almost every episode, "The Fonz" would stop at a mirror, run a comb through his hair, gaze at his reflection, give himself a "two thumbs up" sign and declare, "Hey! Lookin' good!" It was a comedic "running joke" that always got a laugh. What made us smile was that this routine pointed out something rather narcissistic in all of us. Narcissus, after whom this tendency is named, was the young fellow in Greek mythology who fell in love with his own reflection. Fonzie, according to the dress and hairstyles of the day, was considered good looking. Anybody who has seen the actor - who played that character - lately, in recent adds or programs, can see he's still a nice looking man; but he's looking older and more age appropriate!

I was *never*, to use a dated cultural-generational idiom, "the cat's pajamas" - or a trend-setter. I wasn't much to remark about, in terms of my countenance, bearing or sartorial splendor. In junior high, it was "cool" to have a pink corduroy shirt, and "ivy league" slacks with a buckle strap on the back (unbuckled!). I bought the outfit, and within two weeks the fad was over. Nehru jackets went out of style so fast, I didn't get an chance to kill them off. My sister claimed there weren't many baby pictures of me because Mom didn't think I looked so hot. I don't know if that's true; but I *was*, according to the idiom of the time, "sickly" as a child. My wife told me I have my Mom's hands and laugh. I gazed into a mirror in my mid-40's and declared, "Dad! What are *you* doing here?" Cousins tell me I resemble my dad. I *hope* they're not inferring I resemble him in his 90's! By *that* stage, he, who'd *always* been declared to be such a dapper English/Irishman, was often found wearing a ratty faded yellow shirt with best-forgotten ugly plaid pants and an old red bandana hanging out of the back pocket, as he toiled away in his flower garden! Any similarities *must* be genetic - after all, his name was Gene!

A favorite *Peanuts* strip involves Snoopy wearing snazzy jogging shorts, tennis shoes, dark glasses and a sweat band - out for his morning run. Charlie Brown comes into the picture as Snoopy runs toward him. He says to Snoopy, "*I've been watching you from a long way off, and you're looking good*." The thought balloon over Snoopy's head says, "*It's important to look good at a distance*." Too much of our life is spent trying to convince people/God we're looking good at a distance. Upon *closer* reflection, we're the culmination of all our hypocrisy and misdeeds. We might fool ourselves and others; but we're *not* fooling God. *He* sees us "up close and personal" from a long way off. The psalmist says (**Psalm 139:7**) it's not *possible* to flee from God's Spirit/presence. Pastor Corey reminded us in a sermon, when talking about God's omnipresence, it means *all* things are present before God. Don't be the person in **James 1:34, 24**, forgetting what you look like in the mirror of God's Word. Obey *IT* as you run to God; you'll resemble Jesus!


