DID YOU KNOW...The Congregation Council has made some necessary changes to staffing and has put together a staffing committee to evaluate future staffing needs and configuration at RLC to fit with our ministry vision and structure? All of this will have been covered at the annual congregational meeting last Sunday but in case you missed it, here it is. With the adoption of the RLC Ministry Matrix and other staffing changes in the last couple of years the Council has made the following changes to take effect January 1, 2015.

First, the responsibility for visitation has been reassigned to our two full-time, ordained pastors and the developing Visitation Ministry Team. While temporarily without the above, we were blessed to have Pastor Dave step up to fill this gap while we laid the groundwork for a lay-led visitation ministry. Pastor Dave has worked over the past three years to develop both the visitation ministry and to train a lay team to assume this ministry and we appreciate his service. Second, the hours allocated for the Ministry Assistant for Spiritual Transformation (Jenny Page) will increase from 20 to 28 hours per week in 2015 in order meet the growing needs of that particular ministry. Finally, the redistribution of duties based on the Ministry Matrix allowed for the position of Director of Administration (Debbie Stankovich) to be reduced to 35 hours per week.

The committee assembled by the Council to look at staffing will be paying immediate attention to the area of Biblical Stewardship. With an opening currently in the Property and Grounds Coordinator position and the

expected retirement of our Director of Administration in 2016 the Council believes, and I agree, they have an opportunity and responsibility to diligently consider God's direction here. Asking him, "what would serve our congregation best in this area as we move into the future?" As that work is accomplished, the committee will continue its work into the three other areas of ministry to come up with an intentional strategy and plan for all future staffing that fits with our ministry and mission. From the Council

Objective 6 of the 2013 Richland Lutheran Church Long Range Plan ("Our Guide for Today, Our Vision for Tomorrow") states that:

"...Richland Lutheran Church is a congregation that makes effective use of the resources provided by God to support His work."

It calls for increasing the time and talents that are donated by individuals to support the ministry and missions of Richland Lutheran Church" and to "...encourage everyone to discover and use their spiritual talents.

It occurs to me that within Richland Lutheran Church, there is a great, but often unrealized potential within its members to further ministry and missions of Richland Lutheran Church. We share our financial resources generously, and that is a wonderful thing. However, we are often less generous with our time and talents, rationalizing that the pastors or other staff, or others in the congregation will take care of it.

In his book, <u>I Am a Church Member</u>, Thom S. Rainer states "...with church membership everyone has a role or function. Church membership is founded on love. Authentic, biblical, unconditional love. Church membership is functioning membership. You should ask yourself and God in prayer, "...how can I best serve my church?" You should never ask yourself if you should be serving your church. If you are a member, you must be a functioning member. It's just that simple."

In his "First Pledge" Mr. Ranier reminds each of us that:

Because I am a member of the body of Christ, I must be a functioning member whether I am an "eye," an "ear," or a "hand." As a functioning member, I will give. I will serve. I will minister. I will evangelize. I will study. I will seek to be a blessing to others. I will remember that "if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it" (1 Cor. 12:26).

The message is simple: as members of Richland Lutheran Church, we are obligated to serve in whatever way we can. It is <u>our responsibility</u> to seek out ways to serve beyond putting a check in the offering plate. All are called to volunteer freely and not wait to be asked.

Presidents' Perspectives - Travels in Turkey


By the time you read this Carol and I will have returned from over three weeks of travel in Greece and Turkey. Our original plan was to go to Jordan, Israel and the West Bank. We were excited by the thought of seeing places where Jesus walked and worked while he was here on earth. But after more than 3,000 rockets rained down on Israel our tour company canceled the trip and we settled on a backup plan for Greece and Turkey. Here we hoped to see places mentioned in both the Old and New Testament and where momentous events took place that shaped the Christian church. We were unable to see all the following places in our three weeks but these give you a feel for how much has happened in Greece and Turkey that affect us at Richland Lutheran Church today.

- **Athens** is where Paul argued in the synagogue, the agora, or market place, and then was invited to speak with the Areopagus about his new teaching about the Unknown God Acts 17. We walked on the Acropolis and saw the meeting place of the Areopagus. The Areopagus functioned as the chief court of Athens with responsibility for judging murders, impieties, and were peculiarly attentive to blasphemies against the gods.
- **Constantinople (now Istanbul)** was made the capital of the eastern Roman Empire in 330 AD by the Emperor Constantine who had become the first Christian emperor. Today the Patriarch still located in Istanbul is the leader of 300 million Orthodox Christians. The second, fourth and fifth Ecumenical Councils were held here.
- **Nicea**, now Iznik is where the first and seventh Ecumenical Councils were held. The first Council resulted in what we now know as the Nicene Creed.
- Antioch, now Antakya, was where the followers were first called Christians. Barnabas was an early leader of the church here and he and Paul met with the church for about a year. Peter visited the church and remained here for almost six years.
- Tarsus, Paul's birthday place, is not far from Antioch.
- **Ephesus, Smyrna (now Izmir), Pergamum (now Bergama), Thyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia, and Laodicea** are all in Turkey. These were the locations of the seven churches that Jesus told John to write letters to containing what he was about to see in Revelation Chapter 1. We visited four of these cities; Ephesus, Smyrna, Pergamum, and Laodicea.
- **Ephesus** is where Paul spent 2-3 years preaching. Timothy became the bishop of Ephesus. The apostle John lived in Ephesus for 25 years and Mary, mother of Jesus, was also believed to have lived here. The book of I Corinthians was written by Paul from Ephesus. There are fascinating buildings and artifacts at this site.
- **Mt. Ararat** in eastern Turkey is where Noah and his ark finally came to rest on dry ground after the flood (Gen 8:4).
- Harran in eastern Turkey is where after his father died Abraham, Sarah, and Lot set out for the land of Canaan (Gen 12:5).

There are the cities with churches that Paul wrote letters to including Colossians, Philemon (a man living in Colossae), Galatians, and Ephesus. There are many more sites, more than I can discuss here, that were visited by Paul on his three missionary journeys. This is truly the land of the New Testament from the book of Acts to the Revelation of John. We were blessed to be able to experience it.

Turkey Stock

On Sunday, November 30, we will be making turkey stock for the Union Gospel Mission! Please bring your turkey carcasses and washed vegetable trimmings (except broccoli) to the church kitchen either before or after your church service and we will put them in the kettles. For those who attend the Saturday service there will be a spot marked for them in the fridge (and for those who might be out of town Sunday but would still like to contribute). If you are interested in helping in the kitchen with this project please talk to Mike Strasburg (509) 943-2783 home (253)797-1008 cell. A few pressure canners to speed the process along and an outdoor turkey fryer would also be helpful and appreciated if you have one you're willing to lend.

"What is stock and why is it important?" was a common question last year:

Stock makes no sense. The main ingredients would normally be thrown in the garbage and the secondary ones (bay leaves, peppercorns etc...) don't improve the look of things. When water is added it resembles something you would find in a garbage disposal. It's proven to be a unique conversation starter for those who haven't seen it. Then time is added in such an overwhelming quantity that it becomes the defining primary ingredient. Stock, sometimes referred to as "liquid gold" by cooks, is an investment of time that transforms unusable discards into something that improves everything it goes into. For the people who invest their time and talents cooking at the mission and see overwhelming need on a daily basis its presence is, by its very nature, a source of encouragement. In Mathew 25:40 we read "*The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.*" Sunday, November 30, marks the beginning of Advent, a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of Jesus' birth and a time to look forward to his inevitable return. I can't think of a better way to do that.

The Greenhouse Effect

Our title is certain to enlist more readers than normal (and readers of this column *are* normal!) because of controversial association with the hot-button issue of "climate change." We can imagine readers who'll find themselves wading in to try to discern political leanings - if I'd disclose that I'm a climate change believer or denier. Sorry to disappoint. The column is *not* about *that* definition of the greenhouse effect. Readers of the column are used to the tactic of taking a well-known phrase and turning it into an article with a different twist than the title may suggest. This month is no exception. Have no fear; I'll *not* be writing in the manner of the "crazy uncle" whom everybody hopes to avoid at the family reunion because he's always off on some political rant against the left *or* the right.

It *is* a recent family reunion which *does* provide occasion for this article. The Hogan clan has just returned from another autumnal gathering of all the progeny Elaine and I - with the blessing of God - produced. There are 19 of us now. We've reached the stage where *this* year a couple of the grandchildren are old enough that career and college obligations prevented their ability to attend. That's why the celebration of our 50th wedding anniversary was held earlier than the actual event: getting *everybody* in our family together is complicated - akin to planning logistics for the Normandy invasion. Going forward, the ability of *all* of us being able to get together at one time/place is diminished - excepting a death.

Hogans are characteristically on the move (one ancestor bears the title of *The Wandering Hogan* in Irish lore). Many of the early Christian Celts traveled a great deal in the interest of Christ. They categorized their travels in terms of descriptive color-coded martyrdom. The most common, with which *all* Christians should be able to identify: *green martyrdom*. It refers to repentance. Lutheran in particular should relate to this - despite predominantly Scandinavian/Germanic roots. The very *first* of Martin Luther's 95 points nailed to the Wittenberg door says in brief: that repentance is the *continuing* attitude and way of life of the Christian. Sadly, most Lutherans are ignorant of this fact of the Reformation (the celebration of which occurs in the month in which I'm writing this - *not* the month of publication).

A second form of martyrdom was *red martyrdom*. You can guess its meaning since you're red-blooded. It means giving up one's life for Christ and His cause. A Celtic word, *hiraeth*, gave expression to martyrdom's final sort: *white martyrdom* - extreme yearning for home, one's kin, loved ones and familiar geography as they chose this separation of their lives for the cause of Christ. This was the martyrdom they believed was the hardest to endure. "*...parting is such sweet sorrow*..." is Shakespeare's expression in *Romeo and Juliet*. Do we feel *that* deeply about one another in our desire to attend our weekly reunions at the service of worship (**Psalm 122:1**)? Do we feel this as we depart to suffer the white martyrdom of separation in returning to what Christ has called us to in our serving Him in the world? If not, it's a thing to be repented of and we'll need to go green!


