# Financial Report - October 2014

As reflected in the financial summary below, our financial results through October are reflecting a similar trend compared to our financial results in 2013. Our offerings are up \$22,560 or 3.8% higher than last year for the same period. Our expenses are up \$21,709 or 3.4% higher than the same time last year. For the year, our offerings are below expenses by \$(42,722) compared to (\$43,572) in 2013, a change from last year of \$851. These results are reflected in the columns titled "Prior Year Comparison".

For the year, actual offerings are below budget by \$(39,916) and actual expenses are under budget by \$(50,395).

As a reminder, this year's approved budget is 9.8% higher than last year's actual offerings. For your reference, our average planned offerings/income per week is approximately \$16,150. Through the month of October, our actual weekly average of offerings/income is \$14,172, or (\$1,978) under plan per week.

# From the Council

The season of advent is a very exciting time for children. As a mother of three young kids, I look forward to Christmas coming but, at the same time, cringe at the thought of the mess my house will go through following Christmas day. The mess in my house is not one that is isolated to the days following Christmas, however; it's a year round battle that we struggle with.

My kids are blessed with more toys than I enjoyed as a child. Unfortunately, having more isn't always better. Sometimes my kids struggle with finding a toy because it blends in with the rest of the mess. Other times they don't take care of their toys because they don't cherish what they have.

The Advent season, similar to my house, can be cluttered at times. In my family, we will have three different Christmas programs to go to and several gatherings with friends and extended family. # **Presidents' Perspectives**

Seventy-six voters, about 17% of those eligible to vote, showed up for the Annual Meeting on October 26, 2014. If you missed the meeting, here is what was decided:

**Constitution Ratification -** Ratified previously approved Constitution amendments in the chapters on Membership and The Pastor.

**Bylaw Approval -** Approved two bylaw additions, C.11.04.02 and C11.04.03. The first requires the Council to develop a gift acceptance policy and requires a legal review whenever it is revised. The second bylaw authorizes Council to use Operating Reserve funds up to 10% of the approved budget to pay for <u>unanticipated but necessary expenses</u>. This is intended primarily to pay for emergency repairs that need immediate action. Council assures the congregation that this authority would be used very rarely.

**Nominating Committee -** Elected Karen Clark, Fred Kremmer, and Alyce Thompson to the Nominating Committee.

**Congregation Council -** Elected to two-year terms on the Congregation Council: Norm Gillette, Member at Large; Todd Maier, Member at Large; Sarah Hagensen, Member at Large; and Joel Sorensen, Secretary. Ben Barr will be ending his service on the Council after two terms and his participation will be missed. Thank you, Ben.

**Operating Budget** - Approved an Operating Budget for 2015 totaling \$837,000, compared to the budget of 2014 of \$840,000.

The 2015 budget assumes that our lay visitation ministers have received sufficient training and that our visitation program has been improved enough through Pastor Dave Hogan's efforts that it will not be necessary for him to continue in a paid staff position. Pastor Hogan has added immensely to our ministry and he has assured us that this is still his church and that he will continue to serve as a member. Council and staff are planning to provide an opportunity in January for all of us to thank him and Elaine for their ministry.

I also heard the congregation express their desire that our share of the budget going to benevolences increase to at least 10% of the total. I will be reminding Council of this desire when we begin planning the budget request for 2016.

**Professional Audit** - Approved funding a professional financial audit in 2015 for up to \$30,000 to be funded from Operating Reserves (currently totaling over \$285,000). Performing a professional audit at least every ten years is a recommendation of our Auditing committee.

This action passed by the smallest margin of all our actions so Council is reviewing the rationale and the cost for an audit. At our November meeting we invited a member of the 2014 Audit Committee to explain why the committee has recommended, for two years now, that a professional audit be performed at least every ten years. What we heard was that our committee members, while they have accounting knowledge, have never themselves worked professionally as auditors. Their concern is not that money has been inappropriately used or accounted for, but that a professional look at our financial <u>controls</u> is necessary periodically because of the size and complexity of our finances. Council will next look to see if an adequate audit can be performed for less cost before proceeding.

# Free Agency

Baseball fans are aware that shortly after the World Series is ended, certain players - whose contracts have been completed - are declared to be free agents. These players find themselves no longer under contractual obligation. By the end of 2014, I have known for close to four months now, that I will be a pastoral free agent going into the 2015 ministry season. With the approval of the new church budget at the recent Annual Meeting: it's official that the position I've been privileged to fill at Richland Lutheran would no longer be funded. The nuances of timing for submitting written articles co-opted my ability to write this column until the December *Preview* (there is no amount of bribery I could have given under the table - or over the table, for that matter - which would have persuaded Ms. Kelly to wait *that* long after the submission deadline to get this published in November's issue.) I have a boffo column I would want to write for this Christmas month issue; but it will have to wait for another time: because I promised to write *this* column for the purpose of allaying any rumors and misunderstandings regarding the closure of my position.

A second rumor I've already encountered is that I'm retiring. Now if you're talking about my personality, you might be right!! But if you're talking about retiring in terms of no longer working, you're very wrong. I was only employed for a half-time position (and we're *not* talking about only being employed during the half-time of some sporting event!) This made me semi-retired (even though I've never driven an 18-wheeler.) It's true, that going forward I will not receive monetary compensation from the congregation - nor be responsible for her visitation program; but it's *not* true that I've reached the end of my ministry for Christ in His kingdom or in this church. There are persons upon whom I'll call. I'll continue writing this column and a monthly Eucharistic devotional. I'll be available for pulpit supply, interim pastorates, intercultural ministries, funerals, pastoral counseling and consultation work, etc. I'll still do Thursday morning Bible study and teach adult Sunday school (I'm *not* retiring from all those l-o-n-g inspirational showers; and have three classes likely on the docket for 2015.) Suffice it to say, I *continue* as a licensed and ordained minister of the gospel. I'll no longer be a pastor *of* this congregation, but I *will* still be a pastor *in* this congregation.

The final rumor concerns the Hogans' ability to sustain themselves financially. I ask: who *else* should find themselves without compensation, but us? The Lord has *well* prepared us, by long (and many) experiences with Him in life and ministry, for days when Social Security is finally it. It's been a delightful *grace* from God to serve you these past several years as a pastor of this congregation. It came unsought, and now the Lord that gave, hath taken away. Blessed be the name of the Lord! I pray there's been much fruit in lives through this privilege. Thank *you* for the high privilege of serving Him among and with you!! See ya in church!!!

# Will You RSVP to the Invitation?

What would you say or think if your third-grade son, daughter or grandchild came home from Sunday school and proudly announced, "Mom, Dad, Grandma, I have an invitation to heaven?" Before you could say anything, they proclaim, "And I need to R.S.V.P.!"

"Wow" might be your response. Then, "gee honey what will you say?" Most eight year olds don't speak French to know R.S.V.P means "respondez vous sil vous plait" ("Or would you respond please"). But they know this R.S.V.P. isn't just for a kid's birthday celebration, it's to be with Jesus for eternity.

After you gather yourself from the floor and wipe away a proud tear for your child, you might remember Jesus said, "Unless you change and become like little children you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." Then the sobering memory hits you, Jesus wants us to become like little children too. Can we humble ourselves as children to R.S.V.P. and answer His call?

What a teachable moment for a third grader and for moms, dads, grandparents and friends that the invitation prompts such excitement. "Yes, Lord, thank you for your invitation and for being my Savior. 
