Summer Reading List

Can you believe summer is upon us already? With summer (hopefully!) comes some time to rest, relax, and enjoy an early sunrise or a beautiful sunset with a good book. Now, I always recommend reading the Bible-it is the only book that is *living and active* after all (Heb 4:12). But sometimes God blesses us with other fantastic books to strengthen our faith and give us food for thought.

Often I get asked, "Corey, what books do you recommend?", and rarely do I give a short answer. I wasn't much of a reader in high school, but when I became a follower of Christ, it was like I couldn't get enough to read. Over the years I've read some amazing and inspiring books, as well as some that were pretty awful. So, this month I'd like to share some of the books that I often recommend that have truly impacted my walk with Jesus...and I won't bother to share the stinkers!

Here are some of my absolute favorites:

- "The Holiness of God" by R.C. Sproul. This book changed my whole view of God and is considered Sproul's masterpiece.
- "Don't Waste Your Life" by John Piper. Want a book that will challenge your mind and heart? This is it.
- "The Bondage of the Will" by Martin Luther. The masterpiece of Luther. This is a tough read, but if you want a taste of the genius of Luther, this is a classic.
- "Look and Live" by Matt Papa. An easy read, but truly stirs the heart to open and see the glory of Christ.
- "A Simple Way to Pray" by Martin Luther. This little book affected my prayer life in a powerful way. Everyone should have this little gem on their bookshelf.
- "A Christmas Carol" by Charles Dickens. I know, a Christmas story? This story, however, is a beautiful picture of the "old man" versus the new creation. This story is pertinent any time of year.
- "In Christ Alone" by Sinclair Ferguson. A wonderful picture of who Jesus is, and what it means to be called His follower.

While nothing is ever as powerful as God's Word, these are just a few books that have been meaningful to me. Hopefully, you're continuing strong in "Read the Bible 2018", and perhaps you'll find some joy and challenges in this little list!

President's Perspectives

How can we reflect God's love to each other, our community, and beyond? Council will begin work this summer on the 2019 Ministry Plan and Funding Proposal. Ministry teams will be giving input into the process.

Our Vision and Mission statement says, "Richland Lutheran Church is a congregation of Christ followers making disciples who worship, grow, serve and steward." To organize ourselves, we have grouped our efforts into four large areas, centered on Christ. Ministry teams cluster around Christ in these four large areas.

Worship Spiritual Growth Christian Service Biblical Stewardship

In 2017 we celebrated, "Doing Life Together." Pastor Steve encouraged us to embrace, "God's call to love one another through deep, intimate, accountable relationships in and through Christ Jesus." We were encouraged by our congregation president to open our homes to one another and get to know more members over coffee or a meal. Our Hebrews' Cafe was revitalized. We celebrated the 500th anniversary of the Reformation with a German -themed congregational meal and meeting. We want to encourage one another to continue reaching out and drawing closer to our brothers and sisters in Christ - one family of our Father, who art in heaven.

Our focus for 2018 has been "Discipleship." The Great Commission is our mission. "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:19) We hope you find yourself involved in one or more of the groups of people at Richland Lutheran Church working to spread God's message of salvation. A diagram of the organization of the teams at RLC can be found on the hall wall between the Narthex

and Pastor Steve's (now Pastor Karen's) office. Are you involved in Good News Media Ministry, as a lector, an usher, the praise team, in choir, at a men's prayer breakfast, going to the women's LIFT group, mission trips, addressing outreach postcards, cooking, painting, sewing, singing, playing an instrument, praying.....? If you are *doing* things, you are a member of a "team" at RLC.

The third Thursday of every month, beginning at 6:30 PM in the Prince of Peace fellowship hall is Ministry Team Night at RLC. What does one do at a "team" meeting? Team members discuss their area of ministry. They communicate and generate ideas about how their area of ministry is operating. Perhaps they discuss ideas as to what they want to do next or how their ministry might change, grow, (You fill in the blank.) Council members attend, too, receiving input and information from the teams which effect policy and budget.

Council is beginning to gather information for our 2019 Ministry Plan and Funding Proposal. This plan will be presented at our annual congregation meeting on Sunday, October 28. We will have one service on that Reformation Sunday (10 AM), followed by a meal and the congregation meeting. Now is the time to give input into the planning and funding process. As a member of Richland Lutheran Church and member of our "team," come to a Ministry Team Night this summer on July 19 and August 16 at 6:30 PM. Childcare is available. Be a part of RLC's plan for the future.


