From Pastor Steve

Eternally Grateful

I have a confession to make, I love ice cream! I try not to have it too often, but man, is it a struggle. I love ice cream so much that I've convinced myself that it will be the mainstay of sustenance in heaven. If ice cream is already heavenly, I can't even imagine what heavenly ice cream will be like. Mind blown!

As a kid, we were fortunate enough to have a Foster's Freeze not too far from the house. At Foster's, they would take said ice cream, blend with milk and malt, slow pour into a paper cup, cap, insert straw and distribute to yours truly. Ah, the joy and euphoria of the chocolate malt...Delicious!

Now, fast forward to the last couple of weeks and enter into my surprise when I hear people talking about malts. "What's a malt?" "Who needs a malt anyway?" "Why are malts in the ministry plan?" Can you hear my responses? "Malts are heaven's sustenance; everyone needs a malt; malts are in the ministry plan, thank you Jesus!" A MALT is a team of both Council and Staff members who provide support to our four areas of ministry: Worship, Grow, Serve, and Steward. We put together these teams a couple of years ago for several purposes. First, we wanted the Council and Staff to work more collaboratively together in ministry and mission. Along with their other work, each year Council members agree to work directly in one area of ministry with the staff in that area to support the teams and members who also serve in that area. Second, we were looking for a way for Council members to be better connected with the members and ministries of the church. Third, Council members find more joy and satisfaction in their work when they are "in the trenches" doing ministry. The regular functions of these four teams are as follows:

- 1. Pray for one another and for those who are involved in your area of ministry.
- 2. Implement, review, and evaluate the regular functions and yearly tasks of the ministry teams in your area.
- 3. Intentionally communicate with ministry teams and team leaders in your area of ministry. Encourage them, support them, inform them, listen to them.
- 4. Review and recommend to Council any necessary changes to policy and other governing documents as needed.
- 5. Manage the budget in your area of ministry.
- 6. Report monthly to the whole Council on your progress in the above areas and inform them of any action needed to be taken.

President's Perspectives - In God's Service, Now and Then

Ministry Opportunities – Even as the Father sent Jesus into the world even so Jesus sends us into the world as his disciples and to continue to do the works of the Father. All of us have opportunities individually each day to bear witness to Jesus and show his love to those we come in contact with. whether it is someone at work or the clerk in the grocery store. We also have many opportunities to minister to others while partnering with other church members. Probably the most rewarding opportunities are when we know we have touched someone's life through our witness, an act of love, or through prayer.

But we also can minister through the organization and planning of ministries in committees, task forces, and ministry teams. Currently Council and staff are experiencing more difficulty in finding volunteers who feel a calling to help ministries in this way. We have a number of understaffed ministry teams and a number of understaffed committees and task forces. Recently, Council looked for candidates willing to serve on the very important Nominating Committee. As I write this article eleven members who were contacted turned us down.

If you have an interest in serving on a team, committee, or task force in some particular area of ministry would you let Council, or the staff, know? Meetings may not be your favorite way to spend your time but we truly need your wisdom and passion to make our ministries the most effective in advancing God's Kingdom.

RLC History Timeline – Hopefully you've noticed the ministry matrix on the hall wall outside Pastor Steve's office. It can be helpful in visualizing how our ministries are organized and how they all work together as Christ followers making disciples who wor-

ship, grow, serve and steward. The matrix helps our members to understand better where we are headed.

Our staff has proposed and Council is considering another change in our hallway to help the many new members of our congregation better understand and appreciate where our church has been over the seventyfour years since we first worshipped together. The proposal is to use the western wall starting across from the nursery to perhaps as far as the kitchen to show a timeline of the important events of our congregation's history. When was the first worship service held and when was the congregation officially organized? What important ministries have been started by RLC such as the Chaplaincy, the Luther Senior Center, The Good News Media Ministry, Jefferson Tutoring, The Shalom Ecumenical Center, and the Food Pantry and when did they start? Learning about our history helps us feel a bond with those who went before us, making sacrifices and showing God's love for our neighbors.

Council would appreciate hearing your thoughts on this proposal. Do you believe it would be helpful for us? Do you have suggestions on what events or ministries should be included in the timeline? What ministries or events had the most impact on your memories of our church's past?


