# The Sermon on the Mount and the Kingdom of God: Bringing Things Together



# From Pastor Steve

As most of you know, RLC has started a sermon series which takes us through the greatest sermon ever preached, the Sermon on the Mount. We'll be working through the text of Matthew, chapters five, six and seven. You may also know that I've started a Bible Study on Wednesday nights dealing with the Kingdom of God (Kingdom of Heaven in Matthew). What you may not know is how the Sermon on the Mount and the Kingdom of God are intricately connected.

To better understand the connectedness, let's take a cursory look at the first four chapters of Matthew. In chapter one, Matthew records the important genealogy of Jesus and his birth. To a Jewish audience who is expecting the Messiah (who will bring the kingdom) to come from the line of David, this is of utmost importance. In chapter two, Matthew records the visit of the Magi (about a year after the birth of Jesus), the Holy Family's escape to Egypt, and their eventual return to their hometown of Nazareth. In chapter three, Matthew fast forwards to the beginning of Jesus' ministry, recording the preparation of John the Baptist, and the baptism of Jesus. In chapter four, Matthew records Jesus' temptation in the dessert, the call of the first disciples and the beginning of Jesus' public ministry.

All this leads up to the Sermon on the Mount.

It is at the end of chapter four that Matthew records the primary content of Jesus' ministry and message, the Kingdom of God, "Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom" (Matt. 4:23a, NIV). This verse launches us into the Sermon on the Mount, which, as Matthew points out, is teaching and proclamation regarding the Kingdom of God. The introductory material in the beginning of chapter five, known as the Beatitudes (literally "blessings"), highlight the virtues and attitudes of the one who lives in the kingdom of God. All that follows instructs how one lives these virtues and attitudes in the kingdom.

So, understanding the Kingdom of God becomes truly important. That's why we'll be delving deeper into understanding the kingdom in our time together on Wednesday evenings. I hope you'll make the time to join us both Sundays and Wednesdays, making them your living and learning the Kingdom of God days.

# Learning from the Master's Words

Ah, yes, autumn. The trees changing colors, preparing to drop the leaves that were green and shade-giving all summer that will now be turning red, orange, and brown. The evening sun in golden radiance saying 'good night' a bit earlier. The morning sun yawning, and taking a bit longer to wake up and stretch its legs, breathing a cool breath to greet us and remind us that the season is changing.

I remember my Grandpa outside raking leaves, and how my brother and I would be so excited to play catch with the football at Gram's and Gramps' house. Smelling hot apple cider steaming on the porch while I planted bulbs on a hillside in the Cascades. Watching my boys jump in the mountain of leaves I had painstakingly created. I love the changing of seasons.

With the arrival of autumn, we are also beginning a season of sitting at the feet of Jesus and learning what it means to live as kingdom people. We have begun an expository sermon series on the Sermon on the Mount, the greatest sermon ever preached, spoken from the mouth of Jesus Himself. In this sermon, Jesus gives us a beautiful picture of life as His follower, of living under the rule and example of the Savior. And Jesus doesn't ask us to be anything that He Himself didn't model. We will look mostly verse by verse at His powerful words as we travel through Matthew chapters 5-7. I strongly encourage you to become familiar with these three chapters...read them each week or daily if you can. They are life transforming!

Jesus "went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, and he began to teach them" (Matthew 5:1-2). As we embrace this changing season, may we also embrace this new opportunity to sit at His feet, and learn from the Master's words.

#### **President's Perspectives - October**

**Pastor Appreciation Month** – Since 1992, October has been unofficially designated as Clergy Appreciation Month with Pastor Appreciation Day designated as the second Sunday of the month. (Hallmark Cards started this tradition.) While we shouldn't wait until a particular month to express our appreciation for Pastor Corey and Pastor Steve, being reminded this way is good for us. Being a pastor is a stressful job because of the time required to do the job, because of the stress of having to deal with emotional events and emotional people, and the weight of knowing God holds them responsible for how they shepherd the flock entrusted to them.

From sermons, Bible classes, spiritual and relational care through home or hospital visits, planning and equipping us for ministries, and supervising and guiding our great staff, Steve and Corey do so much to make a difference in our lives. I would encourage every one of you to reach out to our pastors. Let them know how much they mean to you. You could send a card, give them a call, or tell them face to face.

Thank you Pastor Steve and Pastor Corey for your teaching, the example you set in your lives, and your encouragement when I have had hard times.

Annual Congregation Meeting - In the next few days you should see copies of the agenda and other information for the Congregation's Annual Meeting, scheduled for October 28. This is going to be a meeting where we will review where we have been this past year and where we believe God is leading us for the next year. You will get to vote on your leadership as we add members to the Nominating Committee and to the Council membership. There will also be a proposed revision to a Bylaw and a second vote on a revision to a clause in our Constitution.

We will consider a proposed Annual Ministry Plan for 2019 and a budget to support it. The proposed budget is only 2.5% higher than 2018's but includes increased funding for repairs to our aging facilities and a 3% cost of living increase for our staff.

The Nominating Committee has been much more deliberate than usual in their search for God's leading in recommending candidates to serve on Council. They have been meeting for most of the year and spending much time in prayer and fasting as they sought God's will.

Council had planned on having a recommendation for the congregation on how to use the money that was originally given for an off-site Retreat Center but we just didn't get it done. We will commit to spending time in prayer and deliberation this next year to bring you a recommendation that we believe would best utilize this resource for God's Kingdom.

# Ted Stuenkel Member-At-Large

#### From the Council

In his Sunday morning sermon series on the Book of James over this past summer, Pastor Corey has been sharing with us the many ways our faith in God is tested and what our responses should be so that we can grow and become mature Christians. In our monthly Men's Ministry Bible Study we have also discussed portions of the Book of James with the aid of a pamphlet from Rose Publishing titled <u>Test of a Living Faith</u>, <u>The Book of James</u>. These monthly lessons should continue for several more sessions.

The idea of spiritual maturity (or perfect completeness) is a crucial concept for James. I am not going to review all the various themes found in the book of James, but rather I would like to discuss one question posed early-on in the pamphlet and then summarize the answers provided. Each of us needs to evaluate the question and answer in consideration of our own individual spiritual growth.

Question: Can we really become spiritually mature (or perfect, holy)?

Many places in the Bible, we are called to be holy. An example is Matthew 5:48, "You, therefore, must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect." I know that doesn't sound possible, but we must keep trying. We have been challenged by Jesus to be perfect.

Complete maturity as a Christian requires us to live a righteous, truthful, honest, and pure life in complete faithfulness to God and his will. At the same time we must have sincerity of heart and singleness of mind. While reading this I thought of the medieval saints such as Thomas Aquinas and Francis of Assi. This is definitely a difficult concept to envision in this age, but keep in mind that this is "complete maturity.

God shows the characteristics stated above as he relates to humans. Ephesians 5:1 states "Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children." However, when we are empowered by the Holy Spirit, the call to Christian maturity is attainable. This is what God originally intended from the beginning because we are made in God's image. Although reaching spiritual maturity requires hard work on our part, the good news is that God works within us to do the most difficult parts of that work. Our responsibility is to be receptive and allow God to enter our lives. This can be accomplished through prayer, Bible study, worship, partaking of the sacraments, service to others, and other spiritual disciplines.

Some of the ways we reflect spiritual maturity are the way we:

Respond to God's Word Relate to other people (especially the poor and weak) Show self-control and restraint React to trials and temptations.

I hope you find this article helpful and thought provoking. I realize that I personally have much work yet to do regarding spiritual maturity. I may learn important messages from the pamphlets, Bible readings, and discussions in the Men's Ministry Bible Study sessions, but the important factor (and the most difficult) is the application of those lessons in my daily life.

I wish to thank the members of RLC for allowing me the privilege of serving the RLC Council for the past two years. Peace to all.




