Wednesday Night Connect

6:00 —**Dinner is served!** Each week, we serve a hearty meal in the fellowship hall to get us geared up for the evening's events. Ravioli, sloppy joes, baked cheesy pasta with meat sauce, and "Chef's Choice" are the rotating menus, with the occasional pizza night thrown in just for fun. We start serving promptly at 6:00 PM and serve until either the food is gone or 6:25.

6:30 — **Shared worship time!** After dinner, we'll gather in the sanctuary for a few minutes of worship. The Praise team will lead us in a couple of songs — it might be what something from the upcoming week's song list, it might be a new song they're working on and want to start introducing to the congregation.

6:45 — **Here we go!** At this point, we will split off into our own activities for the evening:

Nursery—available for infants, toddlers, PreK and kindergarten-age children

Super Kids! - an exciting and energetic group for children in 1st-5th grades. We will connect with the kids in the narthex, and then move downstairs to the Super Kids! Room. (Red-door room in the preschool hall)

Middle school small groups—A small group experience just for middle schoolers, where we'll dive into God's Word and grow together as disciples as we discuss how what we read applies to our lives today. (Room 200, upstairs)

Chancel Choir—Come sing with us! We will use this time to rehearse what is sung on Sunday morning during the traditional worship service, as well as to connect with each other through this act of service. We will gather together in the choir

President's Perspectives

School has begun and summer is over. Your president is back from trips to Israel/Jordan and a seminary course on the Gospel of John. During the summer I missed two of three Council meetings and I am grateful for how our Vice President, Jenifer Haler, stepped up to fill in the gap. Similarly, our Lead Pastor Steve Ernst was on Sabbatical for twelve weeks working on his doctorate and while he was gone we were so fortunate to have Pastor Karen Gardner to help fill in the gap. But with September here the regulars are now back. We all look forward to the fall season, but before we start that, I thought you might like a summary of what the Council has been doing during those summer months.

Something Old - You may have heard the phrase; something old, something new, and something borrowed. If I can use that as an organizing theme let me start with the "old." Each Council has the flexibility to make its own decisions and the 2017 - 2018 Council decided they wanted to return to something old. The 2016 Council had decided to end the long standing Christian Education Scholarship ministry but the current Council decided to reinstate it. So Council is reworking this ministry and for 2018 has approved awarding five scholarships totaling \$3,000 in educational assistance.

We also approved quarterly Benevolences of \$20,084 for ministries including Walk with Christ (\$2,500), Real Resources Foundation (\$3,500), Lutherhaven (\$1,800), Jews for Jesus (\$1,000), Journey with Christ (\$2,500), LCMC Seminary Debt Relief (\$2,000), LCMC Lutheran Disaster Assistance Fund (\$2,000), Institute of Lutheran Theology (\$2,000), 4Tucson (\$500), The Masters Institute (\$500), Lutheran Military Veterans & families Ministries (\$1,000) and Lutheran Association of Missionaries and Pilots (\$784.20). The plan is to use 12% of your tithes and offerings to help those outside our congregation.

Something New – Pam Hedges and Lois Harrold, with input from others, came to Council to propose entering the 21st century with an electronic sign for the church. With significant financial help from the RLC Foundation and a lot of practical help from our Property Maintenance Team, that vision is today a reality. Council and staff are always open to new ideas from you on how we together can do ministry better and advance God's Kingdom.

Another "new" thing to look forward is to May 3-4, 2019 when RLC will host the LCMC NW District Gathering. A wonderful committee headed by Pete and Joan Mattich are putting together a detailed plan and schedule for this event and have already lined up two outstanding Keynote speakers. I don't want to steal their thunder by giving any more details but keep looking for information on this wonderful opportunity for all us to participate.

Something Borrowed — Okay, this might be a bit of a stretch, but preparations are nearing completion on a proposed Ministry Plan for 2019. In the past few years most of this planning and most of the goals have been proposed by our staff. But in line with Pastor Steve's desire to share the ministry with all, we have "borrowed" a practice from our past when lay members had more direct input into ministry. Your Ministry Teams have been asked to provide input all during this summer on how to make their areas more effective and to describe objective intentions for next year. This should provide all of us more ownership in the plan that the Congregation will be asked to approve at the annual meeting in October.

From the Council

The book *Who Broke My Church?*: 7 Proven Strategies for Renewal and Revival by Kent R. Hunter captured me by its extensive research and the following description in the Introduction:

"As you will discover, when God revitalizes His movement in any area of the world, it begins with those who have holy discontent. It is likely several of those people exist in your church. They love the Lord. They love the church and respect the pastor(s) and staff. They are involved, generously giving of their time and money. They are not the whiners and complainers found in almost every church. They are discontent about the lack of fruit. They are dissatisfied with puny results or business as usual. They know too much from Scripture to accept mediocrity. They will not settle for simply managing the congregation. They believe what Jesus said: The harvest is ripe (see Matthew 9:37). They are deeply troubled that many young adults consider the church irrelevant. They recognize the church exists to make a difference."

"Those who hold discontent are the 'early adopters' of a move of God: Spiritual seeds that represent the organic start of a coming harvests - if they are cultivated and nurtured. You may discover that you are one of them. If not, you may be about to become one. If you choose to take this journey, get ready for the greatest God-adventure of your life."

The keynote speaker at the National LCMC Gathering in Des Moines, Iowa this October will be Kent R. Hunter. He will speak about the *7 Proven Strategies for Renewal and Revival* as well as Church Doctor Ministries, an organization which works with churches who want to reach the unchurched and revitalize the mission of the church to make disciples. Richland Lutheran Church's 2018 Theme has been Discipleship. Our theme for 2019 will be Discipling Together.

This fall you might join others at Richland Lutheran Church who will:

- 1) Read Who Broke My Church?: 7 Proven Strategies for Renewal and Revival by Kent R. Hunter.
- 2) Listen to Kent R. Hunter's keynote address to the LCMC Gathering. The LCMC's Gathering in October (https://www.lcmc.net/images/files/18_ag_registration_FINAL.pdf) will be live-streamed, according to their web site, at www.lcmc.net/live. Due to the time difference and schedule Kent R. Hunter's keynote addresses will be on Monday, October 8 and Tuesday, October 9, at 9 AM which becomes 7 AM locally.
- 3) Prayerfully consider looking for ways that help us renew our efforts to be disciples, following Jesus's instructions in Matthew 28 by making disciples of all nations teaching them to obey everything Jesus commanded Discipling Together.

Adult Education Opportunity



What are we communicating to those who come to our church or Bible study group for the first time? We might be verbalizing words of welcome, but what if we are presenting a message that says the opposite? The most powerful communication tools we have are often not our words. Much of our communication is presented in a nonverbal way. So what are we really saying to those just beginning to come around to the truth of God and His church?

In this study we will look deeply into the posture and attitude that exemplify the right kind of invitation. We will look at what we need to do so that those who visit our church don't just hear but also feel the message "You really are welcome here."


