## Incarnated into the Neighborhood



From Pastor Steve The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighborhood. We saw the glory with our own eyes, the one-of-a-kind glory, like Father, like Son, Generous inside and out, true from start to finish. -John 1:14

In Christian theology, *incarnate* means that God, in the person of Jesus Christ, became flesh by assuming a human body and nature, entering into the temporal world as we know it. In the prologue of the Gospel of John, the apostle speaks poetically about the incarnation, "The Word became flesh and blood and moved into the neighborhood" (the Message). I like Eugene Peterson's take on this passage, especially how he sees the place to which Jesus came, "the neighborhood." It's so personal, intimate, relational and gets to the heart of the incarnation of Jesus. Namely, God is now with us, Immanuel.

The Hebrew word, Immanuel, translated literally "God with us," is one of the prophetic signs Jesus is the Messiah. The prophet Isaiah writes, "Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel." (7:14, NIV). As we enter into the Advent season, I encourage you to remember God came to us, to you, in your own neighborhood. And there he remains.

It's so easy to get caught up in all the hubbub of this busy and demanding season. We shop, we entertain, we cook and bake, we write, we clean, we decorate and all this without giving up what is already keeping us too busy. The next thing we know we're limping past the new-year tattered and worn, seeking refuge. And what did we forget? The most important thing, God with us!

As you jump into this holiday season, be mindful of practicing the presence of God Immanuel. Don't neglect to set aside time and space for the Christ child. This will look different for everyone. Below are a few practices which might help:

- Intentionally begin your day asking God to be present in it. Perhaps you could start with a simple prayer, "Jesus, make me aware of the many ways you will be present with me today."
- Regularly stop throughout the day to remember the Lord's presence. You could set your phone alarm to go off a couple of times a day to remind you God is present. When it does, thank God for being mindful of you.
- Invite God into your otherwise normal day. Ask him to join you on your commute. Ask him to join you in your routine work. Pray God would increase your awareness of him in your conversations with others.
- Deliberately focus on worship and praise. Put on Christian radio, cue up

#### New Ministry Opportunity: Weekend Lunches For Kids

We have been given a great opportunity to help children in our community. RLC member Ellie Rosser, who works as the Communities in Schools rep at Sacajawea Elementary in Richland, brought to our attention the need for sponsorship of their weekend lunch bags for children in need.

Here is how it works: Each month we will pack up to 15 bags (one per child) that will provide 2-3 meals with snacks for one child for the weekend. The food must be non-perishable and must be able to be made by the child. We will shop for the food items and then have a day/evening when we will pack the bags and deliver them to the school. Each bag will have a label stating that these lunches were provided by their friends at Richland Lutheran Church, and we will also include the hours of our own Food Pantry. The approximate cost to provide 15 bags per week is \$60, making our monthly total around \$240. That's not much to feed 15 children for a weekend each week!

So, how can you get involved? Glad you asked. Here are our needs:

- We are looking for a few people who would be **willing to go shopping** for us on the day (or day before) we pack the lunches. A detailed shopping list will be provided.
- Folks who will **pack the lunch bags**. This will be done once a monthrotating between evening and day times.
- **Donated money** for groceries. The RLC Foundation has generously provided seed money to fund this ministry for this school year. However, beginning next fall, we will then use donations to continue to provide these important meals.

Because the need is urgent, we are hoping to pack our first bags on **Wednesday**, **December 4**, so they are ready for the first weekend in December. Also, because we are advertising our **Food Pantry** hours on each bag, please consider donating food or funds (or even volunteer to help) to RLC's Food Pantry. We serve many families in our community, and it's a great opportunity to feed those in need.

But I look forward to the process.

It has been an honor to serve you as your President these past three years and I encourage you to pray for and support your new President, Sandy Steele. Pray also each week for your pastors, staff, Council, and brothers and sisters in Christ. And never forget to love God with all your heart, and your neighbor as yourself.

**RLC** Friends,

A few months ago I took on a new role at RLC as coordinator for the Recycling volunteers. I've personally joined in the rotation, as well as talking with others who serve RLC in this way. I've learned some things I wish to share with you.

We can view our Recycling as part of our Stewardship role as members of Christ's church. God made humans the caretakers of the earth, his creation. So reducing the amount of waste we produce is part of that role. And yet, it's not always easy. The process here in Richland is not straightforward, leading to confusion as to what can and can't be included in recycling. Our recycling team has become frustrated and discouraged from having to hand-sort trash and garbage out of the recycling bins.

The main recycling point for the congregation are in the two large blue bins in the Prince of Peace fellowship hall. (The adjacent beige bins are for garbage.) Above the blue bins is a list of what can and cannot be recycled here. Here are some key points:


- No foods, liquids, or food-stained items can be recycled. (This means no pizza boxes, no icing smeared paper plates or trays, no cup that still has liquid in it, no dirty napkins.)
- Metal cans can be recycled if they are first rinsed clean. Clean aluminum foil is okay.
- Office paper, scrap paper, cardboard, and packaging paper is okay.
- Plastics. This is where it gets complex!

your favorite praise song, sing your favorite hymn as you do homework, wash dishes, prepare dinner, walk the dog, get ready for work.

- Regularly give thanks to God for his promises to "never leave nor forsake you" and "be with you always, to the end of the age."
- See God in the beautiful world around you. The Apostle Paul writes in Romans 1:20, "For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that people are without excuse." Look for God, who is unseen, in what is seen. A sunrise, autumn colors, crystal waters, blooming flowers, a human image bearer.
- Be deliberate about being still, practicing silence and making room for solitude.
- Meditate on God's word. Whether you use your Bible, an app, a devotional, or your memory, God's word always leads to God's presence.

\* Plastic items have to be certain shapes to be processed in the machines used locally. This means items with a neck or which come in at the top. For example: water, milk and juice bottles, ketchup bottles, salad dressing jars, and detergent bottles. No trays or lids.

- \* Everything must be clean and free of food residue.
- \* No Styrofoam anything

So, if an item isn't clean, please don't put it in the bins. Especially please don't put something on top of the other items in the blue bins that will render the entire contents un-recyclable.

And remember that your fellow-congregants are clearing out those bins and either dealing with the church's recycling at their own homes, or at a recycling location, and usually sorting them in the process. I'd like to thank those who have faithfully served in this behind-the-scenes role. I appreciate your efforts in facilitating this ministry!


