2019 Estonia Mission Trip

On January 13, Pastor David Breidenbach, Executive Director for East European Missions Network, will be at RLC to talk about the mission field in Eastern Europe during Hebrews Café. He will also be available for questions and answers following the 11:00 service. The 2019 Estonia mission trip will be July 24 – August 12. Please come and learn more about how you can be part of the Matthew 28 Great Commission by going and/or sending.

Pastor David Breidenbach joined the EEMN staff as Executive Director in March 2015. David spent 14 years at his previous call, where he served as Associate Pastor and Director of Overseas Missions at Faith Lutheran Church in Albuquerque, NM. Faith Lutheran also sent out Pr. David and his wife, Angela, in early 2010, to start a second, satellite campus serving the people on Albuquerque's Westside and city of Rio Rancho. That satellite campus ultimately resulted in their planting a new LCMC congregation where Pr. Breidenbach served as Lead Pastor until accepting his call with EEMN.

Beginning in 2006, David & Angela, and their two daughters, became active in EEMN in various capacities: team members, hosting fundraising events, and serving as team leaders for short-term summer missions with EEMN to former Soviet bloc nations, including Poland, Slovakia, Ukraine, Russia, and Belarus. It was through these experiences in short-term summer missions and in developing relationships and a genuine love for the people of Eastern Europe that made the indelible impression and solidified their sense of call and passion for a life in full-time missions work in obedience to the Great Commission.

Adult Education Opportunities

Adult Sunday School Class on John — Dave Larkin will be leading a Sunday school class on the Gospel of John based on a seminary course taken at Regent College last summer. John's gospel is very unique among the four gospels in the events of Jesus' ministry it records. Matthew, Mark, and Luke all have Jesus doing his ministry in Galilee before going to Jerusalem at the end. John instead has Jesus going to Jerusalem five times and most of his recorded activities are there. Almost half of the chapters of John happen in Jerusalem during that last week of Jesus' life.

John mentions the Kingdom of Heaven only twice, instead Jesus speaks of eternal life. Instead of short parables told by Jesus, John has long discourses. The Holy Spirit plays a more central role in John. Only John reports the death and resurrection of Lazarus. He leaves out any account of Jesus' birth, barely mentions his baptism, there is no casting out of unclean spirits, no transfiguration, and no words instituting the Lord's Supper. But think what we would have missed without the beautiful prologue to John's gospel and that wonderful verse, John 3:16.

Classes will be held from 9:50 – 10:50 AM starting January 6, in the Friendship Room.

"Oh the humanity!" Greek tragedy? Or Shakespearean comedy?

This is a winter-spring class offering on what the Holy Bible has to say about being an actual human being. Pastor Dave will facilitate this class in Room 123 at 9:45 AM, between morning worship services, beginning on Sunday, January 13, 2019. Each class time is considered a single topic, so you need not commit to being at every session.

The format is a mix of lecture and discussion. We may be familiar with the quote beginning the class title, as exclaimed by news reporter Herbert Morrison when the Hindenburg caught fire, killing over 60 people in 1937; but over time the quote evolved into a more comic expression for human mishaps in ads and idiom - even the annual Darwin Awards! Ever hear the excuse, "I'm only human"? The only real assessment is what God expects from our humanity. Together we'll try to unpack in these sessions what God's Word has to reveal to us aout His purpose and provision. Any less a standard, and we're living a sub-human existence; or as the British would say, "We've rather made a mess of things."

President's Perspectives - New Year's Resolutions

My Personal New Year's Resolutions -It is a common tradition at this time of year to make New Year's Resolutions. I do it every year and then review how I have done in achieving those I made the year before. For 2018, I had eleven resolutions; some having to do with improvement in meeting physical needs (reducing my weight, reducing my mortgage ahead of schedule, getting my estate planning in order, & an investment earnings target of 6%), some with improvement of my mind (reading 120 books, travel to a foreign country, and auditing a college level course), and improving spiritually by working to advance God's Kingdom (averaging 18 hours/week in voluntary service, expressing gratitude/sympathy/love to others through at least three notes per week & helping others through our charitable giving for the year).

As I am writing this, with two weeks to go, it looks like I will meet eight of those goals. My investment earnings didn't go so well and I only reached half my goal on weight loss (I could fast for two weeks and still make it).

RLC Achievements in 2018 - So, what new things has our congregation achieved this past year? This is the short list that I would emphasize:

- **Pastor Steve's Sabbatical** With immense help from Pastor Corey and the stepping up especially of Kelly Westlund, Jenny Page, and Lisa Wiegand, the church successfully navigated a twelve-week sabbatical by our Lead Pastor. Council was able to bring in Pastor Karen Gardner and she played a key role in visitation.
- **Electronic Sign** This was an unplanned achievement whose idea came from two members, Lois Harrold and Pam Hedges. Most of the funding came from the Foundation with the remaining portion from memorial funds. This has resulted in a significant improvement in visibility of our ministries to the community.
- **Parking Lot Paving** Planned for 2017, the paving was finally finished in 2018, significantly improving both the appearance and the safety of our parking lot. It also increased the amount of paved parking slots. Thanks to Bruce Chaney for managing the contractor's work.
- **Retreat Center Funding Task Force** A task force was established to recommend the best use for the remaining \$97,000 in funds left after the congregation decided to abandon plans for building our own off-site retreat center. We expect to receive their recommendation in the first half of 2019 and be able to apply this money to ministry.
- **SCRIP Program** Council approved using the SCRIP program to raise funds for the Food Pantry. This was an idea from church member Don Grewe, who has volunteered to head up its implementation. The additional funding will allow RLC to meet more of the needs of our community for basic food supplies.
- **Ministry Growth** I have been much encouraged by the growth of some of our ministry teams. I think of the Maintenance Team, coordinated by Rich Barchet, who have performed so well that we have not had to hire a full-time staff member as we did for many years. Virginia Wood has been faithfully working to grow the new Eventide ministry providing Christian


