- Week 5: Risk (Paul)

Lent is a time of contemplation and repentance as we focus our minds on the amazing gift of God's love in Jesus Christ. We hope you will join us this season of Lent for a different experience of fellowship and worship. Remember, don't be afraid to try the guacamole-you may just love it!

President's Perspectives - Blessings During Hard Times

By the time this *Preview* is printed it may well be sunny and warm. But as I write this we are in the middle of the worst week of winter weather I have ever experienced since moving here fifty-three years ago. Because our street normally has little traffic we were not included in the city's plans for plowing and the snow became too deep for our low sedan vehicles. We were marooned in our house for over four days before a private contractor was hired to plow our street.

While we experienced some restrictions during that time we also realized many blessings. It made me realize more clearly how God can use all things, even adversity, to bring about good. More than ever we were so grateful that we had plentiful food supplies in our home, that our home had electricity for lights, water for drinking and showers, that we had natural gas for heat, and especially that we had our gas fireplace. And when we couldn't get out, or our newspaper couldn't be delivered, we had access to news, our family, and friends through the electronic marvels of our age such as cell phones, computers, and television sets.

When I was reminded of the homeless I had seen begging on the street corners just the week before, I felt real compassion for their circumstances. Add to that the closing of the Food Bank and no delivery of Meals on Wheels for a couple of days.

We also experienced the good in people, including our neighbors, who we rarely see or speak to. I and a couple of other neighbors helped shovel snow out from below my neighbor Justin's vehicle when he got stuck, and later that night he came to our door to offer to drive us to the store anytime we needed it. When I tried to drive my car onto the street and got stuck within the first fifteen feet, another neighbor, Rob, came out of his house to try to free my car. He was joined by a neighbor, Don, I'd never met, to push my car back out of the street and into a spot near the curb. Tristan, a young man across the street agreed to help us shovel snow off the sidewalk for whatever we wanted to pay him and we learned about his school plans and career hopes.

Richard, a recent neighbor who had moved out in December, came by to warn the new residents of his former home about the risks of ice dams on a particular place on the roof. When he saw us shoveling he stopped to visit and then couldn't get his vehicle to move in the snow so we and other neighbors again shoveled under the car to free him.

The next day Sandy, a high school girl from across the street, came over with a couple of tools and offered to help us scrape any ice. Later that evening, Sandy and her mother, Laura, knocked on our door to give us a container of fresh, warm, caramel candy rolls that they had just made and were delivering to neighbors.

In all of these interactions, while braving cold and often back-aching work, we enjoyed conversations which we usually never experience with our neighbors. We all came together to work for each other and to provide what others needed. In all this I felt God at work.

Though because of the snow and ice we couldn't be with our church family, it reminded me of Jesus' command that his disciples must love another. As Jesus said in John 13:35 - "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." A lesson for all of us is to learn from hard times and use all our opportunities to show God's love to others.

Valerie Silva, Member-At-Large

From the Council - What's in a Name?

Let me introduce myself. My name is Valerie Silva and I'm a new member of the RLC Council. I've been part of this congregation since my family moved here in 1975. I'm a clinical pharmacist at Tri-Cities Community Health, where I'm privileged to work in helping our medical underserved population. I love music! How blessed we are to be able to praise God through song! For four years in the 1990s, I was a missionary to Kenya, with the World Mission Prayer League. I care deeply about the movement of God's church throughout the world. I enjoy learning about people of other cultures and like to study various languages to begin to understand what they reveal about the worldview of the people who use them.

My name is Valerie. It's originally derived from the Latin name: Valerius. It's spelled a variety of ways and used for both men and women as either Valerie or Valeria. In English, the accent is on the first syllable and, of course, we shorten it to Val. In French, Spanish, & Russian, the accent is on the second syllable. There are at least four Russian cosmonauts named Valery. In Kenya, many people called me Valeria, because it was much easier for them to pronounce, especially as it rhymes with malaria!

Valerie is related to the root word for valor and means: strong, brave, robust, valiant, worthy. I have liked this and incorporated it into my self-image. Early on I also took on those fundamental American values of self-reliance, independence, "pulling yourself up by your own bootstraps", and "when the going gets tough, the tough get going". In many ways, these values served me well in my life. That is, of course, until they didn't. Until things were too hard. Until I was too broken. Until there was nothing left of my own strength. Until I was eventually forced to begin to learn about true reliance on God.

Would it shock you to know I was already a missionary when I finally started understanding this? That I hadn't realized how much my self-reliance means I wouldn't rely on God. That being independent means I wouldn't trust God enough to rely on him. That if I must figure my own way to pull myself out of difficulties, then I wouldn't truly seek God's plans for me. (Including the terrifying possibility that he's going to let me stay in those difficulties!) And, maybe most of all, that if I have to be tough, if I have to be strong, then I'm not going to be open to allowing God to work through my weaknesses. And, oh, dear brothers and sisters in Christ, this is a lesson I just keep having to re-learn! Even though God <u>always</u> shows himself to be worthy of my trust, I keep trying to grab the control back from him!

God's Word speaks to this problem; I know he understands my struggle. These are some examples:

Psalm 46: 1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."

Romans 8:26 "In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express."

2 Cor 12: 9b "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness. Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

Prayer and Fasting

Lent is starting soon and the RLC Prayer Ministry Team would like to invite you to join us in something a little different this year. Typically, we hold a prayer vigil that begins on Good Friday and ends on Easter morning. This year, we would like to add a new facet to our prayer vigil - fasting. For some of you, this may be a whole new experience, while for others it may be something you've done once or twice, or it may be a regular part of your devotional practices.

For our purposes, this involves fasting from food for a specific period of time. Fasting can take a variety of forms - for instance, eating only fruits, vegetables and water for a portion of a day, or having nothing but water. You may fast for only one meal, or two meals, or a full day. And, if your body is ready, you may even fast for two or three days. We recommend that you start small, maybe skip lunch or dinner one day, and build up slowly to a longer fast. If you have any medical issues that may make fasting difficult for you, it would be a good idea to speak to your doctor to see if, or how, you should fast.

Because we are focusing on spiritual growth in fasting, it is important then to take the time that you would normally be using to prepare and eat a meal for worship, Bible study and prayer. Turn on some praise music, read and contemplate on a passage of Scripture, and spend time praying and listening to God. You might consider keeping a journal of your time, noting what you studied, what you prayed about, and what you learned or heard from God in this time.

If you would like more information about fasting, please feel free to contact Elaine Keyes, Valerie Silva or Kelly Westlund on the Prayer Ministry Team. We will have another article in the April *Preview*, and will also start a Facebook group page on March 1 for the Lent season. You will be able to chat with others, ask questions, and get support for your fasting. ShopwithScrip Part 2

An article in last month's Preview explained how Scrip, which looks and works like a gift card, can be ordered at RLC and provide additional funds for RLC's Food Pantry. Have you followed the directions in the February Preview to check https:// www.shopwithscrip.com for the list of retailers? My husband and I find it easy to make a mental note of where we are buying items. When we get home, we check the web site and make a "shopping list" of what scrip cards we want to order. We bring our list on Sunday to Don Grewe, our RLC Scrip coordinator, who takes care of ordering the cards and has them ready for pickup on the following Sunday.

However, some of you may wonder if there is a way to order scrip which bypasses the need for transactions at church but may still benefit the RLC Food Pantry. There is.

With RLC's enrollment code, you may go to the Scrip website https:// www.shopwithscrip.com and "Join a Program." The enrollment code, 29C9CDE761931, is unique to our church. Anyone who uses RLC's code will be linked to RLC's program and all the rebates earned will go to RLC's Food Pantry.

Using this option, one pays for their card(s) using Presto Pay. You may order any of the electronic cards (ScripNow) without the coordinator assistance and also reload any of the participating retailers gift cards without the coordinator's assistance. The Scrip you purchase online will be sent to RLC along with the orders which are placed at the church on Sunday. You may pick your script card(s) up between services the following Sunday.

We appreciate your support of the Food Pantry program and are grateful to the volunteers who show God's love to shopwithscrip those who benefit.


