Your True Identity in Christ

Colossians 3:1-4, 9-10

¹ Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. 2 Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. ³ For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, who your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory...9 Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices 10 and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Crea-

There is a lot of discussion these days about identity, especially personal identity, which seeks the factual characteristics determining who a person truly is, the authentic self. Identity is a struggle unique to human beings. I've been reading David Benner's, *The* Gift of Being Yourself: The Sacred Call to Self-Discovery, which I've found of great value for my spiritual formation. He writes regarding the distinctive challenge of identity for humans, "Body and soul contain thousands of possibilities out of which you can build many identities." He juxtaposes the rest of creation saying, "A tulip knows exactly what it is. It is never tempted by false ways of being. Nor does it face complicated decisions in the process of becoming. So it is with dogs, rocks, trees, stars, amoebas, electrons and all other things."

I know I've struggled over the years with my identity and, at times, have lived as a false, pretend or public self. I've falsely understood and presented myself as "having it all together." As "being completely self-sufficient." As "figuring it all out." But these inauthentic public personas leave me unfulfilled and unhappy. Truth be told, I

have little together, am fully dependent and don't know much. But even this isn't my true self.

The Apostle Paul writes to the church at Colossae reminding them or their true identity, "For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in *God.*" My true self, the believer's true self, is so wrapped up in God through Christ Jesus that we have died to the old self and have put on the new. And here's the important piece, this one true self in Christ Jesus is the only self that will satisfy. Though there may be thousands of possibilities for being, "in only one of these will you find your true self...that one possible way of being that carries with it the gift of authenticity."

I'd like you to consider your identity. Are you living your one and only God given authentic self or are you living a false, pretend self? God's desire is that you give up this old self and take on the new "which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator." Perhaps a first step toward your authentic step is to ruminate on Thomas Merton's words:

There is only one problem which all my existence,

My peace, and my happiness depend:

To discover myself in discovering God.

If I find Him I will find myself, And if I find my true self I will find Him.

What do you think?

Unexpected Moments

Life is like a box of chocolates (thank you, Forrest Gump). Sometimes it's sweet; other times you want to spit it out, scrub your tongue, and eat a whole tin of Altoids, never to open that box again. As many of you know, my wonderful wife lost her father unexpectedly a few weeks ago. His name was Jack Gilbert and over the last 26 years I truly enjoyed our time together, especially the last few years. He was in the Air Force, and even served on the rescue crews for the Apollo moon missions. He loved to hunt, work on old cars, and was a big Mariners and Seahawks fan. He loved his wife and kids (even the in-laws like me). We had no idea that on a typical Thursday for us, everything would be shaken up in just a brief moment.

All of us have unexpected moments. Losing a loved one, getting fired or laid off, finding out you owe the IRS, hearing that couple you thought was doing great is actually getting divorced. Of course, the natural question we have for God is, "Why?" Well, if I knew the answer...I probably still wouldn't be satisfied to be honest. It's in these unexpected moments that our faith in a sovereign, loving, perfect God must kick in. When Jesus' friend Lazarus was sick, and he was informed (Jn 11), Jesus didn't rush to heal him. He waited until Lazarus had died before He went to see him. By the time Jesus arrived, Lazarus had been dead four days. Can you imagine the anguish of Lazarus' sisters and friends (and I'm certain you can)? They mourned with no hope for four days until Jesus shows up. And here is the hope...Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, ²⁶ and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?" (Jn 11:25-26)

Our Savior *is* the resurrection and the life. He is the one who takes the awful chocolate and can make it sweet. Now, it may not happen as soon as we'd like, but He is the answer to the unexpected moments. I know sometimes it hurts beyond all hurt, but Jesus is saying, "Just trust me...I know what I'm doing." Ours is the God who doesn't make mistakes. Ours is the God who sees the full picture when we see only a sliver. Ours is the God who sustains all things by His word. This God is the resurrection and the life. Do you believe this?

Yep, it's been a tough couple of weeks. I miss Jack, and it breaks my heart to see my family mourning his death. Ugh...unexpected moments. But even amidst the pain, I know that my God is still sovereign, is still loving, is still perfect, and that he knows what is best.

Thanks to everyone who has sent cards, given hugs, and prayed for us. You are a wonderful family to be part of.

President's Perspectives - Ministry Opportunities

Our mission statement is that Richland Lutheran Church is a congregation of Christ followers making disciples who worship, grow, serve and steward. We do not only seek to make others disciples but we ourselves are involved in a lifetime of growing in our own discipleship.

We not only bring new people to worship but also worship ourselves and use our gifts to help others to worship. We not only seek to grow spiritually ourselves but use our gifts to help others to grow spiritually. We use our gifts to serve the poor, the sick, those in prison, widows, orphans, and migrants, both within the congregation but also those who still do not know God. We act as good stewards of the many gifts and blessings God has given us individually and to the congregation as a whole.

Our expectation is that every member will be involved in a ministry. Whether it is as part of the Prayer Team, the Visitation Team, the Chancel Choir, teaching Sunday School or helping with VBS, repairing and maintaining our facilities as part of the Property Maintenance Team, Ushering, or counting offerings, our ministries continue to need more help. If you have an interest or gift in any area of ministry, let the staff know that you are available.

Council also has several committees or task forces that currently are in need of more help. I have listed a few below:

- **Scholarship Committee** We need at least one more to help plan and implement the award of scholarships to students during 2020.
- **Compensation Committee** We also need one or two more people to help on our compensation committee. This group advises Council on salary actions for staff each year and periodically adjusts the salary ranges for current jobs or establishes salary ranges for new positions.
- Facilities Building Fund Raising Committee We need at least two more people to serve on this committee whose job is to encourage giving to our Capital Fund for the new facilities our congregation will need in the years ahead. They are also looking at whether to seek professional help for fundraising, and what level of funds we need in cash before taking on Phase II of the building program.
- **Staffing Review Committee** Any time a staff position becomes vacant this committee purposely reviews our needs and recommends whether to refill it or to modify the remaining staff's duties to meet our needs. We need two additional people to serve on this committee.
- **Financial Audit Committee** Each year a three member committee performs an audit of the financial data from the prior year and how well our policies and practices are doing at protecting the financial resources on the congregation. Each year we need one new person to serve on this committee.

From the Council

By the time you read this article, Richland Lutheran Church will have held its annual congregational meeting, elected new council members, and charted a course for 2020. Once again we have committed as God's people to be a part of the greatest commission in history, to go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey all that Christ commanded. And, he has promised to be with us always, to the very end. (Matthew 28:19 - 20)

Working together as the body of Christ is never easy. Each person in our congregation has different God-given talents and strengths, but they have also experienced pain, disappointment, and rejection. What makes each a unique piece of pottery in the hands of our Maker, also makes it a challenge to coordinate our various interests and endeavors. After all, look at the work it takes to keep only **two** people united in marriage. Add a few more and keep people working in harmony as a family. Yet, God has called us to work with numerous brothers and sisters in Christ for the glory of God. (see Ecclesiastes 4:9-12, Romans 12:4-5, 1 Cor. 12:12)

It has never been easy. We read in Acts that the early church grew by leaps and bounds. Yet in Chapter 6 a situation of neglect caused disunity which threatened their witness, discontent which threatened their spiritual lives, and distraction which threatened the apostles' ability to pray and preach.

How can we learn from their situation? Like the early church, we must focus on our mission. RLC's mission statement, "Making Christ Followers Who Worship, Grow, Serve, and Steward," as well as our logo, remind us of our plumb line.

When we vacationed in California in September, my husband, Larry, and I attended Sunday services in Santa Maria, CA. The LCMC church we attended, Bethel Lutheran Church, had their mission statement on a large wooden plaque by their front door. It said:

As the baptized people of God, we INVITE PEOPLE IN, to experience a living relationship with Jesus. BUILD PEOPLE UP, equipping them to be faithful Christians. SEND PEOPLE OUT, to serve and share Jesus Christ.

Jesus tells us what we are to be about and the early church can serve as a model. The apostles needed to choose a replacement for Judas. They met, talked over qualifications, prayed, narrowed the candidates, and asked the Holy Spirit to guide the decision. A group of widows was being neglected. The early church gathered all the disciples to discuss the issue and find a solution. They chose seven men, known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom, for the job. Then the apostles prayed and laid their hands on them.

We meet, we talk, we pray, we send people out to do. Remembering the grace of God we each have experienced, we extend that same grace to others as we meet, talk, pray and work at a congregational meeting, council meeting, Team Night (Third Thursday, 7 PM), and every ministry listed in RLC's 2020 Ministry Plan and Funding Proposal booklet.

Paul writes to the Ephesians in 3:16 - 21, "I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses

knowledge - that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! 


Children's Event


