Team Night Experiment Complete From Pastor Steve, Lead Pastor

Many years ago, when I was at Talbot School of Theology at Biola University working on my MA in Christian Education, one of my favorite Pastoral Ministry professors passed down some sage advice. He said, "Students, whenever you change an existing ministry or start a new one, see them as experiments, for that is truly what they are. That way you don't have to evaluate that ministry only using the criteria of success or failure." He continued saying,

"Everything we do in ministry is a success for God's kingdom, but not everything works the way we thought it would."

I've been using this philosophy for over twenty-five years now have found much value in doing so. First, since an experiment is technically a trial or test, changing this up is perfectly acceptable. In fact, change is expected. This has kept me from locking in too tightly to how things should go. Second, an experiment is

tentative. There is little certainty about outcomes, if any at all. Third, if something isn't working, it's easy to move on from it, because we don't give it a value judgement.

Allow me to give you a couple of examples from my own ministry. Many years ago when I was serving as a Youth Pastor. I got the crazy idea to host a "Jello Night" with our middle school youth. They would eat Jello, they

would play in Jello, they would throw Jello, they would carve Jello...you get the idea. On paper it looked like great fun, but in practice it didn't work (I'll leave the gory details to your own imaginations). Anyway, because this was simply an experiment, we didn't have to give it a value judgement; good, bad or ugly (good thing too, because if we did it would be all three). We could simply say, "That didn't work," and vow to never do it again.

Fast forward twenty plus years to a couple of summers ago here at RLC. You guessed it, another great Pastor Steve idea, at least on paper. In a staff meeting, I suggested we host HeBrew's Café outside. To a person, the staff said, "That's a terrible idea and it won't work, it's just too hot." Well, did I listen? Not exactly. I said, "It's an experiment, let's give it a try." Two weeks later we moved back inside to the Prince of Peace fellowship hall because it was just too hot. Not my proudest moment. I say all of this because there are things we try which just don't work and that's okay.

One of our latest experiments, Team Night, has come to its completion. In the past, a night to bring

all of our volunteers together worked beautifully. Today, not so much. But that's okay, it's only an experiment. We trust God used it successfully for his kingdom and we now move on. So, please check with your Ministry Team leader to confirm where and when your team will be meeting next.

President's Message: Christ's Ambassadors From Sandy Steele, Congregation President

As Council embarks upon yet another year, my thoughts go back to a previous worship message by Pastor Steve - "Christ's Ambassadors". This message spoke to me – loudly and clearly; particularly, the words, "You may be the only Jesus that another person sees all their life." Paul tells us in 2 Corinthians 5:20 NIV, "We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making His appeal through us." I often like to refer to The Message for its translation and, in this case, it says "We're speaking for Christ Himself now..." Webster defines "Ambassador" as "a person who acts as a representative or promotor of a specified activity." As Christians, we are called to be ambassadors for Christ. And, that holds for Council as well – individually and corporately. What does this mean to me?

Well, first, let me introduce myself. My name is Sandy Steele and I come to you as your newly elected Congregation President. I join my fellow Council members thanking you for your trust and for giving each of us the opportunity to serve Jesus by serving our pastors, staff, and you in this capacity. It excites me to see where Jesus may be leading us here at Richland Lutheran Church and I am grateful to be a part of his plan whatever that may be.

So, back to "what does this mean to me?" Our constitution states: Council shall have general **oversight** of the life and activities of the congregation, particularly its worship life, to ensure that everything is done in accordance with the Word of God." I'd like to talk briefly about the word "oversight". Webster (again) defines "oversight" as (a) watchful and responsible care and (b) regulatory superdefinition vision. One suggests to me a management style and the other being more of a ministry style – or biblical. 1 Peter 5:2a tell us to "Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them". My vision for Council is to take watchful and respon**sible care** over the life and activities of RLC; to focus on ministry; to come alongside of our pastors, staff, and congregants as ministry partners – as Jesus did with His disciples and as Paul wrote in his letter to the Corinthians; to ask the question when discussing matters and making decisions, "What would Jesus do?" That, of course, does not and will not negate the business element for which your Council is also responsible - such as, carrying out the provisions of the constitution, bylaws, and continuing resolutions; financial decisions; and other important issues that pop up regularly – while, at the

same time, practicing watchful and responsible care "of the life and activities of the congregation, particularly its worship life..."

Where and how do we begin? With lots of prayer and turning it over to God for His wisdom and guidance. As we go into this new year in "the life and activities" of Richland Lutheran Church, I simply ask for your support and prayers for Council, pastors and staff, and the entire congregation AND love and forgiveness when Council may not get it quite right. We, in turn, will continue to keep you in our prayers. We are, after all, Christ's ambassadors – for better or for worse. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Dave Larkin for his years of serving on this Council as Secretary and President and especially for his continuing support and friendship over the years and going forward. I'm sure God has a plan for him.

I just want you to know how much this Lutheran Church has meant to me over the years. I've never been a member at the church, but I grew up just down the street from it. Its mere presence is a wonderful part of my childhood memories.

The upside-down cupcake church was also a place of refuge for me, being a teenager with so much turmoil inside, new emotions tend to be larger than life at 15. But one night, in particular, I had snuck out the window of my bedroom, just to go for a walk (my friends and I snuck out most weekends, just to meet up to giggle and talk on the corner.) But this night, I was upset and needed some space. I was troubled and found myself walking in the church's parking lot. On the north side of the cupcake was a door. Incredibly, it was unlocked and I walked in. It was a small room but there were some lights still

on, no one was there. The room had a beautiful stained glass depiction and wooden pews that glowed. I sat down and prayed, and I just sat there staring at that beautiful artwork of broken glass. It made me think that it takes hundreds of pieces of broken glass, that when put together correctly, will make one beautiful piece of work. Then I left and went back home. I know it doesn't seem like much of an experience, but for me, at that time in my life, it I can't remember what I was upset about, but I do remember this church and that night. And from what I've learned over the years, truth and love are what really matter.

I am happy to report I survived my teenage years, and I find myself moved back to Richland after being gone for 30 years. The trees are much bigger but my childhood home looks smaller, as do all of my friend's old houses. I'm happy to see the area has-

n't changed much, especially the upside-down cupcake church. I drive by it almost daily as I am fortunate enough to live closeby again. I received your postcard invitation to Christmas Eve services and I'm happy to say, I'll be there.

I also thought this little children's book (*The Velveteen Rabbit*) might be of service to your members and their families. I hope everyone can find their "real" selves this holiday season. And yes, you can go home again, it's always right there - in your heart and your head.

Thank you for just being the upside-down church in everyone's life.
