Beginning January 16, we will return to receiving Holy Communion at the railing. We will continue to utilize the "Celebration Cups" (the all-in-one prepacked elements). The ushers will dismiss by pews to the front of the aisle. Fill in at the railing, leaving a comfortable space between households. The communion assistants will come along the railing with the tray of Celebration Cups, distributing with the phrase, "This is the Body and Blood of Christ, given for you." Simply take a Celebration Cup from the tray, open, and consume the wafer and juice. **Beginning January 16**, *all* of the Celebration Cups will have *gluten-free wafers*. (Individual gluten-free wafers will not be available.) When you are done, dispose of your cup and wrappers in the small bags attached to the backside of the railing.

For those who are not able to come to the railing, or who are not yet comfortable with coming to the railing, simply remain in your pew, and a communion assistant will come to you with the tray of elements for you to take while in your seat.

We are excited to be taking this step towards a return to normal worship, however we recognize that should there be a change in community health rates, we may need to make future modifications or changes. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation should that be necessary.

You will no doubt have read the article in October's Preview, *Good News Media Ministry Is Changing*, written by Good News Media Ministry (GNMM) Vice Chairperson Betty Quinn. There, Betty gives a good summary of this ministry's history and mission since 1978. Betty also announced the GNMM Board has moved to merge this ministry with Richland Lutheran Church (RLC) and legally dissolve GNMM as a separate not for profit organization. I'd like to take this opportunity to talk a little bit about this ministry's restructure as it moves under the Richland Lutheran Church organizational structure.

The RLC Congregation Council has approved, along with a broader Technology Purpose Statement, a vision/mission for our GNMM (Technology) Ministry Team. It reads, "In coordination with RLC's vision/mission and as a ministry of this congregation, the GNMM Technology Team exists to make disciples who worship, grow, serve and steward by utilizing technology to enhance **discipleship**, create a strong sense of **community**, ensure clear and consistent **communications**, and **steward** resources efficiently." If you'd like a complete copy of RLC's Statement of Purpose for a Technology Ministry, please call the church office.

This new purpose broadens and coordinates all technology ministry at RLC under one umbrella. See the Biblical Stewardship area of our Ministry Matrix on the wall in our hallway. GNMM Technology Ministries fall in the area of Biblical Stewardship and has three sub teams. A Fundraising Team (more about that below). A Hardware and Peripherals Team which will, as the name denotes, coordinate our technology infrastructure. And a Worship Operations Team which coordinates sound, projection and production (live streaming and recording) at our two Sunday morning worship services.

Some of you have been very faithful in financially supporting Good News Media Ministry. And for that you have our heartfelt thanks and appreciation. Furthermore, don't stop giving to this very important, and all the more necessary in our technological age, ministry. For the most part, RLC is depending on this ministry to continue to support itself. The creation of the above mentioned GNMM (Technology) Fundraising Team is specifically for this purpose. In fact, most of the previous GNMM Board will continue to serve this ministry on this team including Karen Filipy, Nancy Ballard, Betty Quinn and Julie Gearheard.

And remember, your gift will be supporting much more than just our Good News Today television program. From the Council Kristen Imhoff. Council Vice-President

Happy Advent! All my life I have loved seeing the blue altar cloths go up at the start of Advent. It signals the front end of a new church year - another "fresh start" where we begin again the systematic journey through the stories that remind us of what we need to know about God, ourselves, and our world. Have you ever thought of the church year this way - as a guided tour of sorts, through Scripture's message? The various church seasons focus on different aspects of Jesus' life and teaching through changing Bible readings, liturgy responses, hymns/songs, sermon topics, and even through color-coding cues in our altar paraments. Why do we repeat these themes each year? One reason: because we forget!

"Remember" is both an admonishment and an encouragement to us that is found all through the Bible.

What are we to remember? It's who we are to remember: God himself—I AM Who I AM, the LORD (YHWH) your God, the only God, the creator and sustainer. In his mercy, He gives tips for remembering Him in view of our human limitations: remembering the Sabbath (Ex 20:8); remembering all His commandments (Num 15:40); remembering God's deeds and wonders (Ps 77:11-12); remembering Jesus' life, death, and resurrection (Lk 22:19), remembering how much He loves us (Jn 3:16), just to name a few.

Why all this remembering? As I've pondered that question, one answer that pops up is that remembering breeds the trust in God that we must have to be in true, healthy, dependent relationship with Him, and that is God's desire for us. There it is – the uncomfortable idea of dependency! The Fall upended our comfortable dependency on God, but Jesus stepped in and lived an absolutely beautiful life of dependence on God the Father. He showed us that dependence on the right person (i.e. God) is the way to live the human life as it is designed to be lived. Spiritual growth, through the Holy Spirit's leading, is the way we move away from our self-sufficient fallen nature into the trust that fosters the relationship with God we are longing for.

Deep trust makes this dependency possible. Human beings generally trust based on history. When promises are kept, when truth is verified, when words (and then actions) communicate loving care, we will put our toes in the water of trust. As trust holds, we will be willing to go deeper into that trust/water. God will pass any "trust test" - His promises are always kept, His truth stands, and He has taken the greatest "love action" possible in Jesus. What God wants is for us to trust Him so much that we will completely submerge ourselves in our trust of Him, that we will have the closest possible connection with him, as Jesus did.

Every time we revisit the stories, songs, and rhythms of God, we remember again and anew the truth, promises and loving actions that are lavished on us by our Father God through His son Jesus Christ. The history holds, our trust builds, and we go a little deeper into life with Him. The repetitive nature of our church seasons and rituals, as in all the various cycles God has designed into human life, can really help us connect with him in an ever-deeper experience if our hearts and minds are open, humble, and seeking. Re-hearing God's word also affords us a chance to gain new insights from familiar stories, yet another way that our experience of God himself deepens.

So—here we go! We'll start (again!) with the Advent stories/songs and our blue altar cloths (signifying hope), that remind us of the promise (fulfilled!) of the Messiah, the truth of the God-With-Us wonder of incarnation, and the loving action of Jesus' birth on earth that gives us our reason to hope. Let's remember together, all this upcoming year, who God is and how very much he loves us, so that we continue growing deeper into trust and relationship with God, through our precious Savior, Jesus!

As the Deer Longs...

From Pastor Sam, Visitation Pastor

Many years ago I remember reading an article in a magazine that said that when God created human beings that he built into our genetic structure what the article called a 'God gene' so that we would know about him and eventually come to follow him. I am not certain if there is a God gene, but my own life experience, as well as my Methodist background, tells me that it is God himself who is the one who is present within us and which gives us that sense of who he is as we begin our own journey of seeking to find Him.

As we enter the season of Advent, during which we prepare for the coming of Christ Jesus, I am reminded of my own faith story and how, despite being raised in the church, that I truly struggled for many years to come to find God. When I look back I see a zig-zag of coming close to him, then turning away. I see times of what felt like there was no God, and even no hope, until finally God reached me in such a way that I could no longer run away, or say no to Him.

For me the longing for God has been a life-long pursuit and even though I have found God, he still tugs at my heart to remind me that he is still calling to me to be with him. There is a psalm that always seems to remind me of that search and the joy I felt when I found what I was seeking; that psalm is Psalm 42 and it opens with these words:

As the deer longs for streams of water, so my soul longs for you, O God.

My being thirsts for God, the living God.

When can I go and see the face of God?

My tears have been my food day and night,

as they ask daily, "where is your God?"

Those times I recall as I pour out my soul,

When I went in procession with the crowd,

I went with them to the house of God,

Amid loud cries of thanksgiving, with the multitude keeping festival.

Why are you downcast, my soul; why do you groan within me?

Wait for God, whom I shall praise again, my Savior and my God. (Ps. 42:1-6 NAB)

What I have found is that the search for God is an everlasting part of the life of faith that I have lived. That longing for his love, and joy, and warmth, and presence, and guidance, and grace only fulfilled in the faith that I have in his Son.

As we enter the season of Advent we do so to remember the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and how it is through seeking and finding God that we find his peace in our hearts.

The Giving Tree for Union Gospel Mission From Betty Quinn

This year's Union Gospel Mission Giving Tree Project will coincide with Advent, and will officially end December 19. During Advent we (RLC) will concentrate on giving items to help with countering the cold, but will turn away nothing.

As in the past, a Christmas tree is in the Narthex during this time. There are again tags on the tree with suggestions for items to provide. You may take the tag as a visual reminder of what you want to give and then put it back on the tree when you return the item to the church. It is not necessary to take a tag nor is it necessary to wrap the gift. Even if you are still 'attending church' via Zoom or TV, you can come to the church any time during open hours to bring your gift for this project.

The emphasis of this project is to provide the local Union Gospel Mission located in Pasco with items to help provide their clients with basic supplies (socks, underwear) as well as items needed in the winter (hats, gloves, long underwear). The Mission serves many more men than women as you will notice by looking at the suggestion tags.

I vary the decorations on the Giving Tree each year and wanted to share how our entire church participated in its decorations this year. Deceased member, Kay Aase, made the star. Wallapa Hendrickson donated the origami fish representing early believers in Christ as the Messiah. The palm leaf crosses were made by Sue Meek and passed out at Easter services. Many hands sharing their love of Jesus demonstrate the reason for the season.

For new members and a review for the rest of the congregation, we have a plastic container at the far corner of the hallway by the door used for the Food Pantry into which you can deposit items all year long and they will be shared with the Union Gospel Mission. Remember that the Mission has a store that serves anyone in the community with no cost to the individual. This store has clothes as well as other

How to "Fit in" as an RLC Member in CCB

- Click on the dark gray "RLC Online Community Login" button
- Enter your username and password, and click the blue "login" button.
- Click your monogram/profile picture in the top right corner to view your personal profile page.
- Click the white "Actions" box in the blue gradient header.
- Click "My Fit" from the dropdown box.
- In the pop up window, you will find four categories: Spiritual Gifts, Passions, Abilities, and Personality Style. Scroll through each list, and click the associated check box on the right of each attribute or characteristic you have.


Required Minimum Distributions (RMD)/Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD)
