## **Lent Worship Schedule**

Join us on **Wednesday**, **February 17**, **at 7:00 PM** for our **Ash Wednesday** worship service. There will be seating available for in-person attendance and the service will also be live streamed for attendance at home.

This year, **Lenten worship services will be on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 PM**, starting February 24. These services will also have the option of in-person seating and live stream viewing.

As you may have noticed this is a change from our usual Thursday evening Lenten services. We have made this change for a few reasons. #### Could 2020 be a Sabbath Year for RLC?

#### From Pastor Steve, Lead Pastor



I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people—for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good, and pleases God our Savior, who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth.

- 1 Timothy 2:1-4

On the night of June 6, 1944, President Franklin D. Roosevelt addressed the nation on national radio asking them "to join with me in prayer." The night before he spoke about the fall of Rome, but did not mention until his address on the evening of June 6, "at that moment that troops of the United States and our allies were crossing the Channel in another and greater operation." As D-Day was first announced, Roosevelt led the nation in prayer.

Many people have urged that I call the Nation into a single day of special prayer. But because the road is long and the desire is great, I ask that our people devote themselves in a continuance of prayer. As we rise to each new day, and again when each day is spent, let words of prayer be on our lips.

A continuance of prayer! I wonder if this call to prayer is appropriate as we, this very week I write, inaugurate a new president? I wonder what our nation would look like if "we (rose) to each new day, and again when each day is spent, let words of prayer be on our lips?" Is this appropriate, would this prayer work?

In the Apostle Paul's letter to his young pastoral apprentice, Paul says of first importance that he, Timothy, ought to be in prayer. All kinds of prayer, supplication, intercession and thanksgiving. And for all kinds of people, specifically "for kings and all those in authority." I wonder why Paul singled out kings and those in authority?

According to theologian and biblical commentator, Philip H. Towner, though the immediate goal of prayer for kings and those in authority is, "that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness," there exist two other prominent biblical reasons. One, "the state and human government are a part of God's creative will." Romans 13:1 reads, "Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God." And two, "a submissive posture toward the state would lend the church credibility in the eyes of the world." 1 Peter 2:13-15 reads, "Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human authority: whether to the emperor, as the supreme authority, or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right. For it is God's will that by doing good you should silence the ignorant talk of foolish people."

Christian friends, we find ourselves in different, but no 'so' different, times than

#### From the Council - Luther's Small Catechism

A couple of weeks ago I was re-arranging some books and came upon a small well-used book with a biblical scene on the cover. My initials were written on the cover and I had doodled some shapes next to the biblical scene as well as on the blank pages at the beginning of the book. The title page read: A Short Explanation of Dr. Martin Luther's Small Catechism, A Handbook of Christian Doctrine, published by the Concordia Publishing House, copyright of 1943. I studied the book when preparing to confirm my faith back in the 60s.

As I thumbed through the pages, I could see notes made and underlining of key phrases (we did not have highlighters back then). The handbook gave instructions to the head of the family to teach his household the 10 Commandments, The Apostle's Creed, Lord's Prayer, Sacrament of Holy Baptism, Office of the Keys and Confession, Sacrament of the Altar, and how we should pray both in the morning and evening. Section 4 was comprised of Christian questions and answers for those who intend to go to the Sacrament. The remainder of the book detailed Luther's instructions concerning the chief parts of Christian doctrine with excerpts from the Bible as explanation.

As I reviewed the catechism, I began to remember why I kept the handbook all these years, its importance to my beliefs as a Lutheran Christian. I regret not referring to it within the last 50 years, but am glad I have now found it, to be used again, and treasured.

I invite you to re-visit Luther's Small Catechism. You can find a copy on the internet, download a copy from Augsburg Fortress as an app on your phone, or if you do not mind a slightly used copy with a young girl's doodling give me a call, I will be happy to loan it to you!

# President's Message: Partnership at RLC From Sandy Steele, Congregation President

I mentioned in last month's article that Council and Staff will be gathering for a time orientation of and training to help us better serve Jesus...and you – albeit virtually. One of the topics we'll be discussing in our series sessions will be "partnership"; not just partnership but spiritupartnership (partnership in Christ) and what it looks like as compared to management. This is a topic Pastor Steve and I have talked about on more than one occasion; so, I thought it would be appropriate to share my thoughts here with you.

First, let's take a look at the definition of both. Management, simply defined, is directing and controlling a group of people or an organization to reach a goal. Partnership, on the other hand, is a relationship between equals who connect, develop, and grow. Specifically, a spiritual partnership is partnership between equals for the purpose of growing in Christ. I would say it's like a marriage in many ways. Both parties are equal; one is no more nor less important than the other. We, as Council, are

prayerfully and intentionally assuming the role of, not just partbut, "spiritual ners partners" - with each other, with staff, and with you. We're all in this together and we serve Jesus Christ hand -in-hand together. It's the only way a truly spiritual partnership relationship can work together.

When I was first introduced into the world of "management" (and in my early adult years), I didn't know this and, believe me, it was a rocky world for a while for me and for those around me. I certainly didn't view "manager's" role as a partnership, nor did I treat it as such. And, nor did I always treat my personal relationships as a partnership. It is only by the grace of God that I have come to learn and understand what "partnership" and, more especially, spiritual partnership is really all about.

A spiritual partnership, be it in your marriage, your work or personal life, or your church life, isn't really that difficult; at least, in my opinion, it shouldn't be. However, it does require prayer and intentionality remembering first and foremost that we're all **equal** and respect that equality; value others' opinions and their perspectives. Who knows? You may actually hear and learn something new. It also requires **trust** which is necessary in any relationship, particularly a spiritual relationship. Afterall, open honesty is necessary for a true partnership to succeed and that requires trust. And, of course, we need to honor and respect each other – always and in all circumstances. I find that when we set ourselves aside consider the other person's views and perspectives, we learn and we grow.

In a partnership we work together as a team, not individually and "not lording it over" other(s); we learn from and trust in each other, leaning on each other's strengths; and we help each other. This is what our partnership is all about here at RLC. This is how we grow and this is your Council.

## Shalom Ecumenical Center (SEC) for Affordable Housing From Rich Barchet

Richland Lutheran Church is a member of the Shalom Ecumenical Center for Affordable Housing together with Lord of Life Lutheran church and All Saints' Episcopal church. The mission of this non-profit organization is to provide affordable housing for low-income seniors and disabled adults. Our congregation currently has three directors on the board including Rich Barchet, Warner Blyckert, and Erlan Leitz.

SEC has existed for over 22 years and has sponsored the construction of four facilities for low-income seniors (Tri-Cities Terrace East & West in Richland, Edison Terrace West in Kennewick, and the Hudesman House in Colville, WA). These facilities provide 156 apartments for seniors. SEC has sponsored two facilities for disabled adults (Tri-Cities Terrace South in Richland and Edison Terrace South in Kennewick), and has co-sponsored Kennewick Perry Suites These facilities provide 42 apartments for with Modern Living Services. disabled adults. All of these facilities were funded primarily by grants from HUD and the Washington State Housing Trust fund. There are boards of directors for each of the above facilities and Rich Barchet, Warner Blyckert, Rob Barr and Mark Underwood also serve on one or more of these boards. SEC is are currently looking for more directors to serve from our congregation on the facilities boards, so if you are interested in learning more about these opportunities, please talk to one of the above.

One of the main activities of SEC in the last year was to look for land in Pasco to build a low-income housing facility for seniors. Because HUD has not issued opportunities for obtaining grants to finance the facility, we are beginning to look at alternative financing methods. In December of 2018, we made an investment of about one-half of our available funds in a Waddell and Reed Investment account. This account has increased in value about 25% since the investment was made. Funds from this account and our savings accounts will be used to purchase the land in Pasco after financing of the facility is secured.

The board has decided to support Catholic Charities of Eastern Washington (CCEW) to construct and operate a supportive housing facility for chronically homeless people in the Tri-Cities. This 50-unit apartment building would be called Pasco Haven and will be built in Pasco at the corner of Lewis and 20<sup>th</sup> Ave. The facility will be similar to several apartment buildings that CCEW has built and currently operates in the Spokane area. SEC's involvement will be to provide some operating funds if other funding sources are not sufficient. CCEW has recently obtained a Washington Housing Trust fund grant to provide some of the financing.

SEC also supports another affordable housing project in the Tri-Cities, Elijah Family Homes. Some of our directors also participate in the WA Affordable Housing Conference. Finally, SEC is supporting Modern Living Services, which is building a disabled adult care facility that will be called Carmina's Place on property adjacent to Edison Terrace West and South.

## **Helpful Tips from Rich Barchet**

If you are eligible for the COVID vaccine, here are some helpful tips to get yours:

Go to: <a href="https://prepmod.doh.wa.gov/client/registration?clinic\_id=39">https://prepmod.doh.wa.gov/client/registration?clinic\_id=39</a> Scroll down to see all places that are administering the vaccines until you find a location that still has available appointments. Then click on the blue "Sign-up for an appointment" button and follow instructions. If there are no locations with available appointments, try again later or on another day. The prime time to sign up is between 5 PM and 7 PM. You may need to check back several times because updated schedules are posted irregularly. Once you are scheduled, if your appointment is at the Fairgrounds, arrive about an hour before you are scheduled. You will probably get your vaccination ahead of your scheduled time. After being vaccinated, you'll need to wait 15-30 minutes to be sure you experience no adverse reaction to the vaccine.

## **Online Giving**

During this unusual time of congregational life, where we are worshipping mostly via live stream, and holding meetings and gatherings through virtual connections, you are encouraged give digital giving try.
