RLC COVID-19 Safety Planning Team Update - June 2021

Hello friends and partners in ministry at Richland Lutheran Church, As you are aware, with the advent of safe and effective vaccines for the virus, the situation has improved to the point that the CDC has recently issued new guidance for masking requirements and the state has made minor adjustments to their requirements for religious observances.

After reviewing the new guidelines at our last meeting, the RLC COVID-19 Safety Planning Team has made some updated recommendations to the worship and ministry operations at RLC effective June 6. You should have received a detailed letter by mail outlining those recommendations, but below is a summary of what we're proposing:

Worship:

- Vaccinated individuals may sit in groups of up to 15 vaccinated folks and may elect to either wear or not wear a mask during worship. This also applies to choirs/praise team.
- Unvaccinated individuals should continue to wear facemasks, gather in co-habitational or family groups and maintain social distancing. This also applies to choirs/praise team.
- No "card checks" or screening will be required.
- Communion & offering collection will remain as it has been during the pandemic.
- The Sanctuary will continue to be sterilized before worship begins and after services conclude on Sunday evening.

Small Group & Ministry Activities:

- May resume under the same principles as above, effective Monday, June 7.
- Each group determines their approach to conducting their activities.
- Each group will allow individuals to determine their own comfort level and desired level of protective measures.
- No "card checks" or screening will be required.

The committee recognizes that there is a wide range of opinion and concern about the ongoing pandemic and what protective measures are prudent and necessary. We ask that all congregational members recognize that this is a deeply personal situation and that everyone will make the choice that is best for them and their family.

President's Message: We Want to Hear From You From Sandy Steele, Congregation President

We are a community here at RLC; we're family. As family, we do life together. So, we (RLC's Congregation Council) want to get to know our family and to hear from you. How do we do that? Well, first you need to hear from us; you need to get to know who we are and what makes us tick. There are many ways to do that but we find that the best approach is a relational one – an informal, organic process through conversation and LISTENING! So, let's begin with Council. Here are some ways we communicate to you:

The Preview – RLC's monthly Preview includes an article from a Council member sharing whatever is on their hearts, revealing to you a bit of themselves. We also use it as a way to keep you advised as to what's going on within the church.

Council Meeting Minutes and the Grapevine - Read the Council meeting minutes and the Grapevines. This is another way to keep updated as to the goings-on within RLC. The minutes are posted on RLC's web site for your information. Just click on "Our Ministries" tab, go to "RLC Congregational Council", scroll down and you'll find the Congregational Council minutes.

And, of course, a huge part of communication is listening and here are some ways we try (or would like to try) to listen to you:

Regular Council Meetings – you're invited to visit with us at our meetings where you can see us face-to-face and in action. Just let us know you'd like to join us and if you have something you'd like to share. We always reserve a place on the agenda for visitors.

Congregational Meetings – Whenever we're able to do so once again, plan to attend these meetings. These meetings also offer you the ability to see us in person and in action and allow yet another opportunity to share your thoughts.

HeBrews Café – This isn't happening right now, but once we're able to be back up and running Council can periodically host a HeBrews Café where we can mingle with our RLC family helping us to get to know each other and where you can talk to us and we will listen.

Coffee/Lunch – Maybe we can give you a

call (or you can give us a call) and say, "Hey, how about a cup of coffee or lunch? I have something I'd like to share with you." Of course, coffee or lunch will be on us.

Or just take time to stop and chat with us when you "bump" into us inside or outside of the church building and let us know what's on your heart.

Those are just a few examples of how informal, organic feedback can work - in both directions. So, let us hear from you and we promise to listen with an open mind and heart. Let us know what you're seeking from RLC, how we can best meet your spiritual needs, what gifts/passions you might have that you feel called to use here at RLC, and whatever else God has placed on your heart. And, if you have ideas of how to help Council better communicate and listen, please let us know. We welcome your honest, genuine, and loving feedback. Our desire is to honor God and to love His people. Your feedback is important to us!

While we're on this topic, I'd like to visit with you regarding some feedback on our Church Community Builder (CCB) software. It's been out there for a while now for your trial and use. We've received questions regarding concern for the security of our personal information through this new software. Jenny and Kelly have both done a great job of coming alongside to help us navigate through this major change; transferring our personal information to digital (CCB) making it safer and more secure by giving each of us control over our personal information. They've spent an extraordinary amount of time and effort in bringing this new program to us, helping us learn how to use it, and assuring us comfort in its security. So, I want to personally and publicly say "Thank You!" to both Jenny and Kelly. "Well done, good and faithful servant(s)."

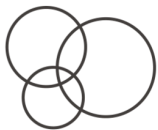

The online member database portal



For just over six months now, RLC has been utilizing an online database called Church Community Builder, or simply **CCB**. You may recall the rollout late last summer, when you received an email inviting you to “activate your profile.” About one-third of our active congregation has logged in to this utilize this powerful new resource for our congregation.

When logged in, you are able to use CCB as the most current member directory, view the church calendar, make an online offering or payment, sign up for altar flowers, submit a prayer request, respond to a scheduled volunteer opportunity or sign up in advance for a volunteer opportunity (like ushering, lecturing, etc.), communicate with others who are in a group with you (like a bible study group, or a team/committee) and share files with each other, review your giving and print your own statement whenever desired, update your personal data, and so much more!

With CCB, the church staff has already been enabled to stream line mass communications such as the Grapevine and the Prayer Chain. As we begin gathering again for a full worship schedule this month, and move towards scheduling more worship assistants and others, CCB will be our primary means of scheduling and communicating with volunteers. As a volunteer, you are able to schedule yourself for months in advance in a coordinated manner when you serve in multiple areas (for example, GNMM and ushering), or block out future dates to let team coordinators know of your availability. It also gives you the power to easily let others on your team know when you are unexpectedly unavailable and need a substitute.

RLC understands your privacy and security of your personal information is of high concern with this system. Church Community Builder uses high-grade 256-bit certificates and modern TLS to encrypt access to the application, regardless of whether it’s user logins, accessing user data, or processing financial transaction data. These enterprise-level certificates maintained through Comodo Cybersecurity, provide assurance that your data is protected between our servers and your computer. On the user end (that’s you!), the system requires that all individual logins require at least one numeric and one alpha character and that their password must be at least

What is the Work of God?

From Pastor Sam, Visitation Pastor

*"What must we do, to be doing the works of God?"
Jesus answered, "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent."
John 6:28-29 RSV*

About five years ago I was serving as the Pastor of the White Salmon United Methodist Church when my wife, Christy, took a sunset photograph of the Columbia River Gorge from a vantage point in Rughton Park. The park is located in Hood River, Oregon, and it is on a cliff that overlooks the waters of the Columbia River as they flow toward the Pacific Ocean. I always liked the photo she took so one day I asked if she could have a large print made of the picture with the words from John 6:28-29 printed on the image.

The reason I am writing about this photo is related to a lesson Jesus taught that is found in the gospel of John about what it means to believe.

In the John 6:14-34, a group of people who had been amongst the 5000 people fed by Jesus came to see him the day after he had fed them. Jesus knew that they came in the hope that they would be fed again, and he tells them that he knows this about them. Yet, despite their reason for coming to him he continues to teach them lessons about the Kingdom of God. He tells them “do

not labor for the food that perishes, but for food which endures to eternal life”. He tells them that the Son of Man will give eternal food to them; and then they ask him a question which is “What must we do to be doing the work of God?” [John 6:28]

This has always seemed to me to be an odd question for them to ask; nothing Jesus said to them seems to lead to that kind of question. But it is his answer to that question that has long been valuable for me because he replied, “This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent.”

Martin Luther once commented that the message of John 3:16 is “the gospel in miniature, so pregnant with meaning that it can never be exhausted”. Now even though these words from John 6:28-29 are probably not as profound as “For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son”.....his answer does point to one of the most basic beliefs of our faith; for without believing that Jesus is the one sent by God as Lord and Savior we would have no faith at all.

six characters long to further ensure the security of the data. After five unsuccessful attempts at login, a user's account is automatically locked for a 60-minute period. Additionally, the site also automatically log users out of sessions after six hours of inactivity to prevent unauthorized access. Additional information about the security of CCB can be found here: <https://churchcommunitybuilder.force.com/s/article/Getting-Started-Security>

RLC has instituted additional safety measures with the database, such having new user requests be held until verified for authenticity, making the profiles of children under age 18 unsearchable except by staff, certain group leaders (like their Sunday School teacher) and their own family. *(note: we must have a complete birth date for your child for this feature to be enabled. Without a complete date, a child WILL show up in a search within the system by any approved logged in user).* We have also set the system to prevent others from seeing your full birth date and anniversary (others will see only a month and day; no year. You and certain limited staff members, however, will see your complete information on your own profile).

Access to this online member portal is available through the church website (click on "[Member Log In](#)" on the top menu bar on the front page, as well as through the church smartphone app in the "Connect" tab.

The RLC staff is excited to fully implement all aspects of this software in partnership with you, our congregational family. If you have any questions, feel free to contact any member of the staff.
