It Takes a Village to Worship

From Pastor Steve, Lead Pastor



In 2016, National Public Radio (NPR) in the U.S. researched the African proverb, *It takes a village to raise a child*, which means an entire community of people must interact with children for children to experience and grow up safe and healthy. Not able to determine the exact origins, their research of academics led them to numerous African cultures and peoples who embodied the spirit of the proverb. One academic, Arizona State University humanities professor, Neal Lester says, “The Africanist perspective is more about community, it’s more about collaboration. It’s less about what we can do individually...The essence of the proverb speaks to a certain worldview that challenges Western individualism.” I don’t know about you, but this seems to ring true to me.

I’ve been thinking over the past 14, or so, months about how this proverb captures the spirit and essence of our Christian corporate worship. Of course this is because we haven’t truly been able to worship corporately, communally, during the pandemic. Sure, we’ve been able to, by the grace of God and the stellar efforts of our technology team, worship ‘virtually,’ but we all know this isn’t the kind of community worship we all desperately desire. I believe one of the things God has taught me during the pandemic is the importance of Corporate Worship. I wouldn’t doubt, God is teaching you the same.

This has led me to rethink and renew the priority of corporate worship in my life. Not that it wasn’t a priority necessarily, but I ‘feel’ it differently now. Maybe that’s because I took for granted the opportunity to worship together, had grown desensitized to its importance and forgotten the necessity of its practice. Perhaps there is some good to come from the last 14 months of isolation and distancing. Perhaps, if I’m willing to learn and accept God’s forming of me, I will appreciate more deeply and embrace more fully the great gift of grace to gather freely and worship communally the God of the universe! I hope you too will allow God to speak to you about the importance of corporate worship. Because, as we know better than ever before, it really does take a village to worship!

From the Council

One of my “pandemic experiences” has been calls both to and from old friends. One call I received recently was from a friend I hadn’t talked to since my brother’s wedding in 1980. I remembered “Adam” fondly – he became a friend to me, my brother, and my sister and became a fixture in my parents’ house, that my mother called him “her black-haired son.” Since my family had often wondered about Adam, I was glad to get the call.

The call started out predictably – we shared how our lives unfolded, we talked about people and events from the past, he asked about my parents, brother and sister. What wasn’t usual for me was the thought that popped into my head as I listened to his story: “This guy needs Jesus.” As the call wound down, his last question to me was: “I remember you being a ‘church girl.’ Are you still a ‘church girl?’” And then he reminded me that his family never “had any religion,” and he said that he still didn’t.

This wasn’t like my other “blast from the past” calls. I wondered if God brought this long-lost friend back into my orbit because he needed Jesus, and I’m one of the people Jesus is counting on to spread the life-giving Gospel. I’d like to tell you my first reaction was “Woo hoo! Send me!” (like Isaiah), but I first felt a little more like Moses when he first heard God’s plan for him: “Really, God, I can’t be the right person for this job, can I? I don’t know how to talk to prickly unbelievers!” But I also knew that, of my brother, my mother and I, I was the one most likely to risk reaching out to Adam with the Gospel. Then I remembered the promise of Luke 12:12 – that the Holy Spirit would teach me what to say, when I was called upon to say something. So, I surrendered, and I answered Adam, “You could say I’m more a ‘church girl’ than ever!” We said good-bye and the call ended. He thanked me for the call and for “sharing my faith” with him.

That surprised me. I didn’t feel like I had exactly shared my faith with him. Adam’s comment, however, did make me think I should be ready for more, as Scripture encourages (e.g., 1 Peter 3:15, Romans 10:14, and 2 Tim 1:8). Now, I have always intended to have my “testimony ready” in a carefully crafted, comprehensive (yet simple and coherent) story that I could share. I’ve read books about apologetics, so I could be ready for push-back, but I can’t remember the arguments. When I feel inadequate I tell myself that Jesus just needs me to say what HE means to ME. Should be easy, right? But I never seemed to get that carefully crafted masterpiece put together.

Turns out, I didn’t need it. Adam started asking me questions - questions that I could easily answer like, “You don’t really believe Jesus actually walked on the earth, do you?” I knew exactly how to answer that. So far, I haven’t gotten a question that I couldn’t field. The key was letting go of me and grabbing onto the Holy Spirit, and trusting enough to just roll with the moments as they unfolded. Who knew that a high school friendship could lead to sharing Jesus more than 40 years later? God did. Who knew my years of prayer and study could prepare me to answer questions? God did. Who knows how it will turn out? God does. None of this was what I expected when I picked up the phone, but isn’t that exactly how our surprising God works? Walking with Jesus is an adventure, for sure!

For the Holy Spirit will teach you at the time what you should say.

Sharing our “testimony” can take all kinds of shapes. We do it by answering questions with Biblical truth. We do it with how we live when we love like Jesus. We do it by sharing our personal stories of life with Jesus. We’ve been commanded to “Go, therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit” (Matt 28:19), and if Jesus commands, we can be sure that the Holy Spirit will be arranging both opportunities to obey and spiritual support to get the job done. The Gospel isn’t shared if we who know it, don’t speak it when called by God to do so.

You, too, are one of the people Jesus is counting on the spread his precious Gospel. My prayer is that you will sense the Holy Spirit guiding you into those opportunities where you are called. Some settings, like mine, won’t be what you expect, so be open and aware. The Holy Spirit will show you a need, help you recognize that you are being called into action, and equip you to do the job. Isaiah and Moses – and too many others to count – have been chosen and well equipped to do what God asked of them. I was, and you will be too – Jesus promised.

The Renewal of Our Faith

Have you ever found times in your life when you struggled with what it means to be faithful? Many people that I have talked with tell me about those times when it can be difficult to be faithful; and that particularly during this time of pandemic how being faithful can sometimes be hard to do. But what I have also learned is that when those times do appear is that it is God who inevitably provides the path to what the renewal of our faith means.

One story about that idea comes from 2 Kings 22:1-23:37. It is a story that shows the grace God had for the people of Israel who had strayed from him; and how it was God who provided the path for them to return to faithfulness to him.

In 2 Kings 21, we read how King Manasseh led the people of Israel to abandon their faith in God to become followers of Ba'al. When that happened we read how God becomes so angry with them that he declares "Behold, I am bringing upon Jerusalem and Judah such evil that the ears of every one who hears of it will tingle" (for more details about that read 2 Kings 21:10-18)

But even though Israel often turned away from God he always provided a way for them to come back to him; which brings us to the story in 2 Kings 22:1-23:37. In the opening verses of this story we learn that King Josiah, who had been king for 18 years, sent his servant, Shaphan, to the High Priest Hilki'ah, to obtain from him tithes left by the people in the temple, so they could use that money to pay the workers who were doing repairs to the house of the Lord. What we learn in 2 Kings 22 is that while the repairs were underway, a copy of the book of the Law was

found buried within the walls of the building.

The text says, "Hilki'ah the High Priest said to Shaphan the secretary, 'I have found the book of the law in the house of the LORD.'" We then learn that Hilki'ah gave the book to Shaphan who read the book; and then he read it to the King who said to his servants and priests: "'Go, inquire of the LORD for me, and for the people, and for all Judah, concerning the words of this book that has been found; for great is the wrath of the LORD that is kindled against us, because our fathers have not obeyed the words of this book, to do according to all that is written concerning us.'"

In this passage we see how Josiah turned to God to better understand what the book of the Law had to teach him about how to be faithful to God. The book that the workmen found was an ancient copy of the Book of Deuteronomy and 2 Kings tells us that after the book was found God led King Josiah to remove and destroy all of the symbols, and buildings, and Ashe'rah poles of Ba'al worship that Manasseh had commanded Israel to believe.

Even though this is one of many stories of the struggles Israel had with being faithful to God, it is also a story of how God was faithful to Israel as well. This story also reminds me of how we know the saving grace of God that we see fulfilled in the coming of God's Son, Jesus Christ, as Lord and Savior.

Just as Josiah used the discovery of the lost book of the Law to lead Israel to return to faithfulness in God, we too have the word of God that is able to also do that for us.
