President's Message: Change Strengthens Us

Those of us who've been around for some time have seen many changes here at RLC and we will continue seeing change, especially now that we're post-COVID. Sorry. There's that ugly word again. Winston Churchill once said about change, "To improve is to change; to be perfect is to change often." I'm not advocating that we strive for perfection, however I am suggesting that change is inevitable and oftentimes necessary to better our lives, help those around us, and ultimately serve God better - to improve. Change can be very daunting, especially because it brings uncertainty into our lives. I find it, sometimes, daunting myself. However, daunting as it may be, we must embrace it and we can do that only with God's help. We can use that time of uncertainty to lean on God - to trust Him and His promise that He will not abandon us. He is always with us and He will guide us through it. The process of change can help to strengthen our trust in God and grow us in Him. It can make us stronger. This brings me to the purpose of my message to you, which is simply to prepare you for some upcoming potential changes within our beloved RLC. Yes - we have seen many changes over the years, with more on the horizon which I would now like to share with you and, at the same time, ask for your prayers as we (Council) continue discussing and gathering information to bring to you. Pray that God guides us according to His will and that we hear Him, listen to Him, and obey Him.

Let me begin with our staffing here at RLC. Susie Nunamaker, as you know, recently retired from her position as our Worship Coordinator leaving a vacancy for both the Traditional and the Contemporary Worship Coordinators. We are currently receiving resumes and our Staffing/Executive Committee will be reviewing them and considering candidates for these positions. Kelly Westlund has been attending seminary (Fuller) over the last few years, studying for her masters in divinity and is now being sought after by LCMC congregations around the Northwest, which brings us all both joy and sadness. Many of us have been blessed with a ring-side seat watching Kelly grow over the years into a pastor with a genuine love for people and souls and a deep, personal love for Jesus. God is growing her and He is calling her into service as a Pastor - somewhere. In anticipation of the very likely event that Kelly moves into her new role outside of RLC, Pastor Steve, along with the help of Council, have begun developing a succession plan, including both a Ministry Assistant for Christian Service and the possible creation of an Associate Pastor in Residency program. More on that later.

This brings me to the parsonage at 1510 Farrell Lane. Pastor Steve and his family have moved out of the parsonage into their newly purchased home in West Richland. Yay for them! This, of course, is not new news. However, this now leaves us with an empty parsonage. So, what are we going to do with the property? As I shared last month, this will ultimately be your decision. There are several options available to us, among which is to keep the house as a parsonage to be included as part of the package for a Residency program, if that should come to fruition.


