

Are You Optimistic or Pessimistic About the Church's Future?

The Church has changed dramatically in the last few years. Gone are the days of the "changing" Church, especially in America, for it has already and definitively "changed." Today I received a link to an opinion article in The Atlantic dated 5 February by Timothy Keller who writes,

As of 2021, the number of "religious nones"—people who don't identify with any established religion—in the U.S. had grown to nearly 30 percent of the population while professing Christians constituted 63 percent, down from 75 only a decade ago. The Pew Research Center recently projected the future of this trend: In three of its four scenarios, the percentage of Christians plunges to less than half the population by 2070, and in none does the trend reverse and the Church grow.

Friends, this isn't good news. One might even say this current reality could lead to a pessimistic outlook. "No really?" you say (with thick sarcasm). However, Dr. Keller takes an optimistic approach, even to this difficult reality writing, "So: Can Christianity grow again? Yes it can. Even the Pew report concedes that 'events outside the study's model' could lead to a revival of Christianity."

Romans 15:13 "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." On a recent Sunday I asked, "Are you optimistic or pessimistic about our church's future?" Let's be honest here, the last few years have left us weary, tired, and perhaps even a bit pessimistic about what God is doing with us here at RLC. And yet, as I read Scripture, we are called to be optimistic and hopeful about the Church's, our church's, future. In fact, Scripture is loaded with verses encouraging the believer to hope. One such verse is Romans 15:13, "*May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.*" Here we are reminded our hope is to be placed in and with God who fills us with hope by the Holy Spirit.

So...will you join in optimism and hope for our future at Richland Lutheran Church? Will you ask God to fill you with hopefulness by the power of the Holy Spirit? Will you surrender into God's future for us? Will you believe and trust our best days are ahead of us and not behind? Will you take Jesus at his word saying, "*I will build my church, and the gates of Hadeswill not overcome it,*" (Matthew 16:18)? Will you?

President's Message: Staff/Council Covenant Relationship

Council and staff recently gathered, as we do each year, for a day of orientation to help us better serve Jesus...and you. This is also a time when we come together to renew our commitment to each other to serve together in partnership in the gospel, with the help of God. It has been a while since I last shared our Staff/Council Covenant with you, so I would like to take this opportunity to do so now.

In summary and with the help of God, we promise to: (1) respect, care and pray for each other; (2) assume others have good intentions and motivations; (3) participate in decision making by speaking openly and honestly during meetings, not privately afterward; (4) listen without interrupting or talking over others, encouraging others to speak and listening with an open non-judgmental mind allowing disagreement without personal resentment; (5) seek what is best for the Church as a whole and not what is best for our personal preferences; (6) accept differences of opinion and conflict as inevitable, normal, productive, and respectfully; (7) the majority of our communication and decision-making will be face-to-face however, when necessary, it will be done so by phone or electronically AND when conflicts arise resolution will be sought directly with the person(s) involved and not taking it outside; (8) forgive each other and ourselves when we make mistakes, whether or not the other person acknowledges their part; (9) maintain the integrity of the Council by not breaking confidentiality or undermining the Council and its decisions; (9) support the final decisions of the Council even if we disagree, with these exceptions - if the decision is felt to be clearly immoral, contrary to Scripture, or not in accordance with the RLC Constitution and Bylaws."

We carry out this covenant only "with the help of God" because we cannot do it on our own – as we all know. Although this covenant was written specifically for those who serve in partnership on Council and Staff, it is my belief that it is also relevant to all of us here at RLC who love and serve Jesus. It's not always easy but, as we all know, we "can do all things through Him (Christ) who gives (us) strength." (Phil. 4:13) Amen and Amen!

From the Council: Reminders of Faith I Got from a Kidney Stone

A couple weeks ago, I experienced a pretty no good and maybe downright bad week. I found out that I had double hernias and will be needing an upcoming surgery. About 48 hours later, my body decided it would be a good time to take on passing a kidney stone. Having gone through this before several times, I knew my body would take it and that it would heal after passing the stone. However, I found out that this was my biggest stone – twice as large as my previous largest and at a size that most doctors recommend procedure. In the midst of my week long ibuprofen, hydrocodone, and flomax induced thinking, I was reminded of several lessons on faith that can greatly impact our life and our church.

First, God sometimes challenges us to take on our fears and step out of the boat, and this can be missed if we aren't looking for it. When I first found out this stone was the size of most that need procedures, my brain immediately jumped to the impending and unavoidable procedure. After several nurses and doctors affirmed the need for procedure, I began instantly seeking out this procedure and a doctor who could do it. Being on a wait list here, I looked in other towns to no avail. It felt helpless. Until on a Wednesday night when I passed the stone. By focusing all of my energy and attention on the procedure and finding a doctor, I lost sight of the fact that God was helping my body do something challenging. I started looking at the storm of what was being said, and did not hear God calling me to step out on the waves and go to him. As a church, we get so comfortable with what we know that we can miss God. Whether it be time of service, traditions associated with the church, or ministries offered, we have our comfortable boat. Let's not get so comfortable in our little boat that we miss God calling us to trust him and take our first step out on the wave.

Second, we are taught in the church to serve others and love others, as God commands, from a very early age. As we grow and mature in our faith, part of that includes knowing when we need love ourselves. I am a person who hates being limited and I want nothing more than to go full speed ahead, all the time. But I couldn't because my body physically hurt and I couldn't sit still for even five minutes. That gave my amazing wife, Cynthia, a chance to love and care for me, showing God's love for me through her. That also allowed the Council and my church friends to step in as prayer warriors and lift me up in prayer. As a church, we are called to serve. And part of serving is knowing when to step back and let others serve us. We all go through seasons of life when we can give more and when we need to receive more. As healthy Christians, we are called to be able to receive love from others, not simply give love to others.

Finally, God's timing is always perfect, regardless of our opinions or desires. Trust me, the last thing I hoped for after finding out about double hernias was a giant stone. Actually, in a bit of a cruel irony, I texted one of my best friends from the ER and said "They told me it is a Hernia. Thank God it isn't the boulder of a kidney stone that I have" (oh the funny ways God works sometimes). In my eyes, it felt like this was the worst possible time to get this health challenge. However, I was able to pass the stone with enough time to heal and not delay


