## Pastor Kelly Westlund: The Newest Prepared and Sent Pastor From Pastor Steve



There has been and continues to be a pastoral shortage in the Christian Church in America. Among the reasons for this include the increasing age of the average pastor, 57 compared to 50 in 2000, according to Lifeway Research; the ongoing labor shortage to include clergy, reported by the Wall Street Journal; and the continued decline of enrollment at seminaries, described by Ministry Watch. Anecdotally, we know this to be true as well. In our denomination, Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC), many congregations are without a pastor.

There, then, are several questions which arise. Is there anything being done about this? How will this shortage be overcome? Whose responsibility is it to train and deploy pastors in the LCMC? Or among other denominations? The answers to these questions are not difficult to find.

The LCMC operates more like an affiliation of congregations than it does a denomination, though a denomination it is. That is namely because the LCMC practices true autonomy of congregations with a very minimal organization/leadership structure. Hence, there is no "mother ship," to train, teach, prepare, and send out pastors to its congregations. The onus of this work is on the congregations themselves.

The primary difficulty with this has been that most congregations in the LCMC came from church bodies, denominations, who did have a "mother ship" doing this work. That means, even if congregations know they are responsible for this work (which many don't), they are not themselves equipped to do it. This all means pastors are not being trained and deployed into churches, for the most part in the LCMC and especially our NW district.

If this isn't enough bad news, there's more. On top of not preparing enough pastors, those we do prepare often don't make it. The Center for Church Leadership's research shows "seventy percent of pastors in the Christian Church or Churches of Christ drop out of the ministry during the first ten years." I'm confident other denomination's numbers are similar.

If these trends are to change, it is incumbent on congregations within the LCMC to do the work of training and deploying pastors to serve our congregations. If this work isn't done, well, you know what happens.

The good news is, Richland Lutheran Church (RLC) knows this is our work and has been doing this work for many years. Lead Pastors, leaders and members have been preparing and sending out pastors since the church's founding. For instance, two of my esteemed predecessors, Lead Pastors Palmer Gedde (1970-1991) and Bill Martens (1997-2011), in partnership with the congregation, did this important work. Some of those trained and sent out include, Pastors Torvik, Ulleland, Foss, L. Gedde, Berg, Eibel, Ray, Moody, Shen, Haugen, Nau, and Schumacher. That's quite the list! In my tenure, we've raised up and sent out Pastor Corey Smith, who has just been called to Trinity Lutheran Church in Hermiston, OR and last

Next, Council is in the process of assembling the Facilities Fundraising Team, so if you feel God's call, please don't hesitate to contact one of your Council members. And finally (or maybe not finally), we have set in motion the replacement of our HVAC system which will, hopefully, be completed before the cold weather comes upon us. So, we are moving forward! Praise God!!

October is a very important and busy month for us here at RLC. First and foremost, it's **Pastor Appreciation Month**! I'd like to begin by saying, "Thank you, Pastor Steve for all that you do in serving Jesus here at RLC and our surrounding neighborhoods." RLC's culture surrounding requesting funds is one of prayer, patience and educating. This article is meant to inform you about an element of the proposed budget for 2024.

The largest increase to the budget is the cost to hire an associate pastor.

During the uncertainties brought about by COVID the council was led to leave the associate pastor's position unfilled. The budget was reduced substantially with that decision. Over the last 3 years, Kelly and Amanda have blessed us with their preaching. Their support in this area gave Pastor Steve necessary reprieves and time to perform some of the associate pastors' duties. Kelly and Amanda have also been assisting with these other duties. Now that we have been in full swing with all three services for more than a year and that Kelly has been called to another church, the council is recommending that RLC fill the associate pastor position. We believe the position is needed to serve the congregation more completely, and to give Steve and Amanda the time to perform the main duties of their positions.

The total increase to the budget is \$218,307. The salary for the associate pastor and cost of living increases and benefits for staff is the major portion of the budget increase. The council supports this budget increase and is praying in confidence that the revenue to support the 2024 budget will be provided. Please pray with us. Pray to discern how God is leading you to support the increases to our budget.



#### **Estonian Pastor to Visit RLC**

#### From Mot Hedges

Pastor Siimon Haamer, a 3<sup>rd</sup> generation Estonian Lutheran pastor, is the Director of the Tartu Academy of Theology. Siimon has been the point of contact for several RLC members who participated in short-term mission trips to Estonia through the Spiritual Orphan Network (formerly EEMN). He will be visiting Richland October 5-8,2023 and will give a presentation during Coffee Hour (9:45-10:45 AM) at Richland Lutheran Church on Sunday, October 8. He will be joined by his nephew, Mattias Haamer. Please make time for this informative message.





Under the control of the Soviet Union, Christianity was persecuted and most pastor in Estonia were killed or sent to prison. The legacy of living under communism still has a significant impact on the people of Estonia. 30 years later, many of the remaining Christians have difficulty in talking about their faith. A 2009 Gallup Survey found Estonia to be the least religious country in the world.

The Haamer family was directly impacted by this persecution. In 1947, Siimon's grandfather (Harri Haamer) was sent to a Siberian prison for 7 years for continuing to preach. His grandmother and father (Eenok Haamer, then a teenager) had to go into hiding from the KGB and spent 4 years living in an underground bunker.

In 2019, Pastor Siimon spearheaded an effort to expand the Christian outreach to the Estonian people through construction of the Home of Hope. In addition to housing the Tartu Academy of theology, it provides the following services/outreach: Christian radio station, Bible study classes for the lay person, 24/7 pastoral care hotline, youth bible camps, assist in resettlement of Ukrainian refugees, and more. Siimon is in America on a fund-raising trip to help pay of the mortgage of the Home of Hope.

Additionally, Mot & Pam Hedges will host an informal reception for Siimon and Mattias in their home from 5 to 8 PM on Friday, October 6, at 1821 Thayer Dr., Richland. Please join us for good Chistian Conversation and hors d'oeuvres.

#### **Proactive Sunday School Safety**

RLC has implemented a secure check-in/check-out badging system for all individuals entering and exiting the education hallway, including the preschool hall. A badging station is located near the corner of the education and main hallways. All preschool and elementary aged children will need to be accompanied by a parent/guardian for check-in prior to going to their classroom. Parents/guardians will be given a 'check-out tag' that matches their children to ensure only authorized individuals are picking up children after Sunday School. Children will not be released from Sunday School until an authorized adult returns to the check-out station for pick up. Older students and adults (volunteers or adults attending a class in room 123 or another room) will also be checked-in and out with a badge. Middle school and high school students will be released without supervision after they check out at the badging station. Our primary purpose is to proactively provide a safe and secure environment for our preschool and elementary students, so that in the event of an emergency we will have an accurate method of tracking everyone present in the education wing, and to ensure children are not exiting the building unaccompanied by an authorized parent/guardian. We acknowledge that this may be initially inconvenient, especially as we work the hiccups out of the system, but we hope that the safety of our children is worth a few minutes of inconvenience each Sunday, and we are grateful for your understanding and cooperation.
