From Pastor Steve -Lent Worship Series



Every August the Staff and I go on a three day retreat to, as the Apostle Peter encourages, "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." This last August we read and studied together a little book entitled, "I Am a Church Member" authored by Thom Rainer. They say, great things come in little packages, well, they weren't lying! The content of this short read focuses on what the Bible says about what it means to be a

church member. The presupposition of the author, captured in the introduction, communicates well the biblical teaching on church membership,

God did not give us local churches to become country clubs where membership means we have privileges and perks. He placed us in churches to serve, to care for others, to pray for leaders, to learn, to teach, to give, and, in some cases, to die for the sake of the gospel.

During this season of Lent, where we become more penitent and contemplative in our spiritual journeys, I'd like you to consider your church membership. What are *your* presuppositions, what are *your* practices, what are *your* attitudes as a member of Richland Lutheran Church? Does your understanding and practice of your membership align with what God's word says about the body of Christ, the church? Do you know what God's word says about church membership? Did you know the Bible talks about church membership?

You know me and know well by now where I'm going with all of this, don't you? This Lenten season we'll be working together, using "I Am a Church Member" as a guide and resource, to help us discover or rediscover the privilege and joy of church membership as the Bible teaches. I'm asking you to prayerfully consider wholeheartedly joining me on this magnificent journey. To put aside your own attitudes and presuppositions, to be

Financial Report - December 2014

As reflected in the financial summary below, our financial results through December ended on a positive trend for 2014. Our offerings are up \$21,489 or 2.8% higher than last year for the same period. Our expenses are up \$15,284 or 2.0% higher than the same time last year. For the year, our offerings are above expenses by \$6,313 compared to \$108 in 2013, a change from last year of \$6,205. These results are reflected in the columns titled "Prior Year Comparison".

From the Council - Helping the Community - RLC Food Pantry

"For I was hungry, and you gave me food." (Matthew 26:35)

Here at RLC, we take very seriously our call to minister to our world. Outreach is an integral part of who we are. We are actively involved in participating with the East European Mission Network in global missions, but we also understand that missions is also about ministering to those just across the street. Our Food Pantry is a wonderful outreach of the Christian Service Ministry and provides food for over 150 people a month in our local community.

Ministry Assistants, Joanne Woehle, Kelly Westlund and Jenny Page, distribute the food to those who come asking for help. They come in cars, walk from within the neighborhood, take the bus, or get rides from friends. The food RLC gives out is just enough for a few meals but makes a difference in the lives of those who need it. The staples are Tuna HelperTM, chili, soup, spaghetti, Chicken HelperTM, mac and cheese, canned vegetables and fruit, cereal and pancake mix. We don't ask for ID or proof of need. We just give to those who ask, showing RLC's love for God's people in need.

Chuck & Hermine Fordham and Vivian Stangeland organize the pantry shelves in a closet located in the preschool hallway. They discard the out-of-date items that come in and rotate the food so the food with the longest shelf life is in the back. Betty and Felix Quinn do the shopping at Costco and the Fordhams and Vivian pick up sale and other items at local grocery stores. RLC members are very generous with their food and money donations.

There are many stories behind the people who use the Food Pantry:

- · A grandmother in extremely poor health, getting by on Social Security, now has her son and grand-children move back in with her.
- · A family who had an extended member get put in jail and now has four more mouths to feed.
- Another family needed help when the wife's sister and her children move in after she became a victim of abuse.
- A boy who came in with his mom got excited when he saw the food and said, "Oh, thank-you, I'm hungry."

There is one woman who was a regular, but stopped coming. One day the church received a college graduation notice from her with an attached thank-you that said she couldn't have done it without RLC's help.

You Can Help

Remember our Food Pantry families when you shop for your own family. Donations of food, toiletries, paper products, baby food and diapers are gratefully received. Monetary donations are also needed to supplement donated items. Our pantry is currently pretty bare, so any nonperishable food is welcome.

Thank-you Chuck and Hermine, Vivian, Betty and Felix and the many people who contribute to this local mission.

Presidents' Perspectives - Friends and Fellowship

Our Neighbors - When Carol and I started our family here in Richland we lived in a north Richland neighborhood. Very soon we knew all of our neighbors on the block through our children. We enjoyed celebrating the 4th of July with neighbors on our street while watching our own fireworks and sharing homemade ice cream. We baby sat for neighbors and shared meals on occasion. We interrupted our yard work to talk about our families and each other's work.

After our family had grown and left home, we moved to a new neighborhood in south Richland. After twelve years there, we still only know a very few neighbors to any extent and none are really friends. Often we really don't even see our neighbors, as they get in and out of their cars in the garage, open the garage door with automatic openers, and drive away or back. Now, only two of us still mow our own yards so we see each other less even in the summer.

Our Church - I suspect the change we have noticed in neighborhood relations is one that many of you have also experienced. It is sad when this happens in the neighborhoods where we live but even worse when it happens in our churches too. Over the past two months I have been hearing RLC members, who have transferred from other churches, talking with sadness that they do not feel they have any friends within the church. Carol and I have felt this way at times too during our eight years here. Our closest relations have come only during this past year through sharing our thoughts and feelings in the small group that formed after the Renovare Weekend.

Over the last decade Richland Lutheran has had several members transfer from other local Lutheran congregations. How long do you think they will remain here if they do not establish connections and friends? We need friends; God made us that way. Even before recorded history, when humans lived as hunter/gathers, we know they lived in groups for mutual material and social support.

God's Command - God intended his followers and disciples to be known for their love for each other. Jesus said to his followers, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." Love is much more than polite conversation or warm feelings. There are many definitions of love but for me the true essence of love is wanting to be with the other person and truly wanting what is best for them.

Becoming friends with other church members to the point of loving them takes effort and time spent with them. It often means giving up time that we would like to be spending in some other way. Friendship means sacrifice. Greetings during a service or a short conversation in the narthex or at a HeBrews Café won't do it. I think that for many of us the most effective way to friendship is through sharing meals together. There is something about talking while enjoying food together that brings people together like no other activity.

Taking Action - How long has it been since you invited someone, that you don't know very well or at all, to your home for a meal? Consider forming a new habit. At least every three months invite a member of Richland Lutheran, who you don't know, to your home for dinner. Let us show love to one another as Jesus commanded us to do. You will fill a need and find enjoyment for yourself.

Advice for the Lovelorn

One glance at the headline and you may assume, that in my newfound "status" (?) at Richland Lutheran, I've determined to turn these articles into an advice column. It is a temptation. I can only imagine what manner of wackiness, seriousness, hypocrisy, heresy and sinfulness an "Ask Pastor Dave" column might uncover from within *any* congregation granted anonymity by the use of pseudonyms in correspondence. Over 40 years of pastoral experience gives me the sad feeling it could be shockingly eye-opening to discover what *some* parishioners might indeed *really* be thinking, facing or believing. But instead, as this is February's article, I'm intending to draw on over 50 years of marital experience in a Valentine's Day tie-in. Hence, the title.

Last year marked the significant 50th wedding anniversary for Elaine and me. You should know that our marriage has survived being preceded by a three-year courtship during which I was, most of the time, unsuccessfully pursuing a person who didn't *want* to be courted by me. Believe me: I know something about being lovelorn (a term referring to pining away in love...somewhat akin to being "lovesick")! So, my first advice for the lovelorn is: prayerful persistence. It doesn't guarantee the goal, but it certainly forms/informs the relationship. Now, you're probably thinking, "Hogan, we see what you look like. We know all about your sick sense of humor. We're well acquainted with your obviously manifest and manifold flaws. *Anybody* would be justified in not wanting to be pursued by you!" I'm very self aware, and don't disagree with your assessment. It's just that even loners aren't meant to go through life alone. Every person has this immense, innate creational need to be loved, to love and to be in relationship (I'm skipping a great deal of proof from God's Word substantiating this statement). I am three weeks older than Elaine. I've often considered that in the intervening three weeks from my birth, God took note of me and concluded, "That boy needs help!" Hence, Elaine.

Oddly, the relationship *has* survived. *Both* of us forgot our 10th anniversary! My second piece of advice for the lovelorn is that you each must have a sense of humor: self-deprecating humor toward yourself (not at your mate) and your relationship. It survived my well-worn line, "Sure, you're upset at me now; but when I turn my back you're going to smile and think, 'He says the cutest things!" During our courtship, contemporary cards from me were a staple. So why would our 50th wedding anniversary be any different? Oh, I bought her the flowery obligatory serious card; but she knew, and expected, the other card - the real one. At Christmas, the annual call alerting us to such a visit came. You're told they're all ill, but *think* they'll be well by the time they get here (what! in four hours?!) The predictable result(?): at this writing it is January 15th; I've been well enough to get out of the house *once* since New Year's Eve day. How can you not love sick granddaughters who want to snuggle up to you? I'm reminded of the vows "in sickness and in health". I'm reminded of the irony I'm about to teach a course on healing at church. I'm reminded of **Song of Solomon 2:5**, **5:8: "I am sick with love."** (ESV) I'm reminded of Jesus, Who continues to pursue and court us even when we rebuff His advances. I'm reminded of the high and holy hilarity of God, the Creator, in Jesus pursuing such unlikely and unlovable creatures (who, me?) See the lovesick Jesus in **Isaiah 53:3,4 "rejected by** (us)...acquainted with (sickness)...(bearing) *our* (sickness)..." (ESV, alt.)


