For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." I've often referred to these verses from Ephesians 2:8-10 as the "Lutheran Standard." Our understanding and emphasis of "saved by grace through faith" informs our understanding of all life and faith and reminds us we have been created to live God's sovereign dream. "Created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do," means God has a dream for all of us who are saved by grace through faith.

Join us, Richland Lutheran Church, as we embark on a month of Scripture reading, preaching, prayer, meditation, contemplation and exploration to discover God's dreams for us. Pastors Steve and Corey will be leading us through a sermon series called, "Livin' God's Dream." From the Council

Many years ago a rather frazzled pastor showed up at his church to find that the regular organist had called in sick and had arranged for a substitute. The pastor was already stressed with trying to figure out how best to talk to the congregation about the upcoming roof repairs and simply told the substitute that he didn't have the time that morning and he would have to figure out what to play on his own. After the sermon was over and it was time for the announcements, the pastor told the congregation that the roof repairs were going to cost an additional \$4000 and then asked the congregation that if there was anyone willing to donate \$100 to please stand. As the congregation was mentally processing this request, the substitute organist (who apparently had a good sense of humor) opened up the pipes and began playing "The Star Spangled Banner." I ran across this story last week and it made me laugh (since everyone stands for the National Anthem).

When I speak to Christians of various backgrounds the one thing that is always a common denominator are the weird coincidences, unexpected moments, and opportunities that happen constantly. At the time of this writing the annual meeting is still a couple of weeks away and we are having a week of beautiful weather. My neighbors are all out getting their yards ready for winter and I've been reflecting on last January when I was planning my garden, listening to "Gardening with Ciscoe" podcasts, and where my garden is now and potential changes for next year. I've also begun to think of writing a book called "Gardening with Squirrels" and have named the dog teasing culprit Ciscoe. At the end of this gardening season, I've looked at the results of my planning and have realized most of my successes have been unexpected surprises. Where a tomato crop has failed, the strawberries have run rampant, sunflowers are everywhere, and part of my front yard is an unexpected pumpkin patch. For a while I even had a beautiful little walnut tree in my flower bed.

Writing a budget for a church is somewhat similar to gardening with squirrels, because you also need to plan for the unexpected. God is going to do what He is going to do, and we need to be able to respond accordingly with our time, energy, and finances — and not wait for the next budget cycle. I've been impressed with the people on our Council and the balance they've been able to achieve with it. I'm looking forward to seeing where this church will be at this time next year, and hope that we will be able to reflect back on the new ministries and opportunities that God will provide in the coming year.

Presidents' Perspectives - Doing Our Part

Theologian Karl Barth is alleged to have said, "We have to read the Bible in one hand, and the newspaper in the other." With the coming of Jesus into the world, the Kingdom of Heaven has begun, but as Jesus told us Satan is still the ruler or prince of this world. God will triumph, cast Satan out, renew his creation, and the whole world will at last recognize Him as Lord. Until then our mission is to work to advance His Kingdom in the world.

Every morning before reading my Bible and praying, I read the Wall Street Journal (WSJ). Most of my reading in the WSJ is the front section that has in-depth articles on what is happening all over the world. I want to talk about a couple of recent articles through which I think God has been speaking to my heart.

Christian Persecution in the Middle East — Sometimes we forget that Christianity began in the Middle East. In the six centuries after Christ's death and resurrection, Christianity spread from Palestine to Syria, Turkey, Iraq, Egypt, Iran and on to India. Then in the seventh century Muslims from Arabia conquered the Middle East. While they treated Christians and Jews with toleration many Christians converted to Islam because of the advantages of full citizenship.

But even as recently as the 1920's there remained significant populations of Christians. At that time a third of Syrians were Christian while today that number is less than 10%. In 1900 the majority of Istanbul's population was Christian while today it is less than 1 percent. Even under Saddam Hussein there were 1.5 million Christians in Iraq; today there remain only 175,000. Currently in Syria and Iraq much of the persecution of Christians is from radical Islamists such as ISIS. Those who are not being killed are fleeing, leaving behind their homes and all their assets.

The war in Syria alone has created over 4 million refugees. So far in 2015, it is estimated that over 700,000 refugees, both Christian and Muslim, have fled the fighting in the Middle East for Europe. Germany has been a leader in responding to the crisis. What has been the U.S. response? We have announced we will take an additional 25,000 refugees next year and promised \$4 billion in aid.

What can we in Richland, Washington do to help those fleeing for their lives? Certainly we need to pray consistently for them. But if all we do is pray we are leaving it to others to provide God's help. If a refugee family could get to the U.S. would you be willing to take them in? Or would you provide material assistance to refugees fleeing to other countries? Ask God what He wants you to do.

Mass Shootings – I grew up in Oregon and it seemed like a very peaceful state so it was shocking when recently a mentally troubled man killed ten people at a college. These mass shootings have become all too "normal." A common theme in most of them is mentally disturbed people using guns.

Do we fully understand how unusual these killings are when considered world-wide? The WSJ looked at mass shootings in the world over the fifteen year period of 2000-2014, where mass shooting was defined as killing at least four victims. Over the study period, there were 133 mass shootings in the U.S. The next highest reported number was 6 in Germany.

As a disciple of Jesus is there anything you could do to reduce mass shootings?


