From the Council

WORDS THAT MATTER, ACTIONS WHICH TRANSFORM

On a recent motorhome trip we saw graffiti painted on a rural mobile home in large letters, "I DO WHAT I WANT TO DO." As I drove down the highway I wondered, was this a cry for attention or help, or just a defiant proclamation by the author refusing to be held accountable. It would be interesting to find out what motivates this (to me) dramatic and maybe angry pronouncement.

We are told lately "words matter" but free speech is our Constitutional right. However, shouldn't we aspire to words that advance the kingdom and make Jesus known to the world? One wonders what "acts" the writer's words implied or that he or she felt free to do. Maybe the "doing" in the statement is more spiritual than it sounded. We hope so.

So as Christians, when we hear "words" at the store, at work or in the coffee shop or see them on Facebook what do we think? Especially if the words may be hurtful, unfair or not true. "Why do you say that?" "Tell me why you feel that way." "Do you think there is another way to look at the issue?"

Christians try to use "words" and to "do things" which are right things, fair things, compassionate things all with humility, **striving to be more Christ-like**. Problem is, like the "words" and "doing" the apostle Paul tells us, "I don't understand myself, for I want to do what is right, but I don't do it. Instead, I do what I hate. . . So I am not the one doing wrong; . . . it is sin living in me that does it. . .I want to do what is right, but I can't" (*Romans 7:15-18*). Maybe our graffiti artist struggles with the same tension we feel between the good nature God gave us to do right and our sinful nature to do otherwise?

Jesus gave us the solution to this dichotomy in John 8 saying, "if you hold to my teaching....then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." The "doing" we worry about (big or small sins) promoted by the evil one's lies is defeated by Christ's truth.

So why are we talking about "words" and "doing"? Because when we pray the Lord's Prayer and confess the Apostles Creed, in those "words", we are theoretically "holding to His teaching" and we are set free. But is our "doing" really proclaiming the actual Good News of the Gospel in the new covenant in Jesus Christ? Yes, we try, but the danger is we can "slim-down the gospel news" tending to make punching our ticket to heaven the goal.

"The main aim of Jesus coming and dying in the first place, is the restoration and transformation of all creation." N.T. Wright, Simply Good News (Harper Collins 1989) p. 72

Why do you think we pray "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven?" **Because God restored and transformed all creation, not just Lutherans, not just Christians but all creation.** We need to pray for our "words" and our "actions" and especially that we reach out to advance God's kingdom come (which I believe is here already) or is being done (already) here on earth as it is in heaven. We pray also for all the writers and graffiti artists who may not know the Gospel's Good News that they also are restored and transformed.

President's Perspectives - Keeping the Gospel Whole

The Hole In Our Gospel - I just finished reading the book *The Hole in Our Gospel* by Richard Stearns. Stearns was the president and CEO of Lenox Fine China when he got a call asking him to come to World Vision as President. After much agonizing he left his job to become the president of the U.S. branch of World Vision.

Stearn's book makes a strong case that if our gospel is limited to personal forgiveness of sins then our gospel has a hole in it. Living like Jesus encompasses tangible compassion for the sick, the poor, as well as for biblical justice to right the wrongs so prevalent in our world. God is concerned about the spiritual, physical, and social dimensions of his creation. He says there are almost 2,000 verses dealing with poverty and justice in the Bible. This is the whole gospel.

Poverty - About two-thirds of the world's population lives on less than \$2 per day. This poverty has many effects on peoples' lives. Among them are;

- Starvation 15% of the people in the world do not have enough food.
- Illiteracy Many children do not have the time or money for education. To get clean water for their homes, children invest over 200-million hours a day fetching water often not leaving enough time to go to school. Or they are the sole care for parents with HIV/AIDS or blindness from tropical diseases. Lack of education limits them permanently.
- Illness The poor die needlessly of illness that could be prevented with vaccines or treated if money was available.

Much progress has been made in fighting poverty and injustice in the past few decades but much is left to do. Another \$65 billion each year would move a billion people out of extreme poverty.

What Can We Do? - One of the current topics that is getting attention in the current campaigns by presidential candidates is the issue of financial inequality. I think all of us realize that the richer are getting richer and the poor, poorer. But I would guess most of us at RLC don't fully realize how wealthy we are on a global scale. We are even better off than most Americans. The median earnings of a worker in America is \$26,695 per year; that is more than 98% of world's workers earn. If you earn over \$88,000 per year you are in the top 10% in America but are in the top 0.1% of the richest people on earth today. It seems apparent to me that all of us could give more of our wealth to help those in need.

But writing checks isn't the whole answer. God has also given us time, talents, and spiritual gifts that we can use to love our neighbors whether they live on our block or in Bangladesh. As Paul said in Ephesians 2:10 – "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." If not money, can you give value through your time to a charity? Can you pray for those in need? Can you write, call or email congressmen to request more assistance to the poor or for justice for those oppressed.







Each week, the children will gather in their classrooms to explore the Bible, sing songs, and build their relationship with Jesus.

This year, the preschool and elementary children will be using the Spark "Classroom" series curriculum. The 5th graders will be following a preconfirmation curriculum developed specifically for our needs. The middle school students will be using a curriculum called "What's Up?" which focuses on discovering the Gospel, Jesus and who the student is as a follower of Christ. The high school class will be using The Gospel Project - "The Story Begins" which is a Christ-centered, chronological study that will takes the students on a journey through the storyline of Scripture, from Genesis to Revelation. Along the way, students discover the big picture of what God has been doing throughout redemptive history, and what it means for them.


